Pursuant to the Trademark Rules of Practice 37 C.F.R. 2.102 your Petitioner, Okefenokee Glee and Perloo, Inc., located at c/o Peter Kelly, P.O. Box 1584, Manassas, Virginia, through their appointed counsel, respectfully requests an extension of time of thirty (30) days in which to file a Notice of Opposition against the above application.
