Request for Additional Extension of Time

Dear Persons:

I am happy to report that I was finally able to journey to Virginia, and bring dozens of boxes back to Colorado from my storage area there.

But when I arrived back in Colorado on March 23, 2007, it was pouring rain. Unexpectedly, during the unloading of the rental truck, some furniture slipped and fell heavily on both of my feet. As a result, both feet were badly sprained and toes were broken. When I awoke the next morning, I was unable to stand on my feet.

At the present time, my left foot is in a soft cast, my right foot is wrapped in ace bandages, and both feet are in surgical slippers, as I have been unable to get my injured feet into regular shoes. I cannot yet do much to lift or move any of the heavy boxes because of the additional weight this would place on my injured feet. I now have rows of heavy boxes in my apartment, stacked to the ceiling!

This unexpected accident happened on Friday, March 23, 2007. I waited to see if the condition of my feet would improve enough to enable me to go through the boxes to find the needed trademark samples, but my recovery has been slow. I have had to recline with both of my injured feet elevated on pillows for much of this time.

I never thought this would happen, but I have to ask for another extension of time to get my samples in to the PTO for the trademarks review.

This accident was completely unexpected. On the rainy day of my arrival back in Colorado, I was injured, and have been thereafter unable to stand up on my feet, even on crutches, without a lot of pain. As a result, I have been unable to unpack the walls of unlabeled boxes which are now crammed into my apartment. Most of them look alike, and each seems to weigh a ton!

Therefore, I find that I have to hereby request another extension of time from the TTAB until June 1, 2007. If I can locate the samples sooner, I would be eager to send them in to the TTAB sooner. I believe that the Rainforest samples are packed in different boxes from the Ballerinas samples, so I may be able to find one set of samples before the other. I will gladly send them in as soon as I can find them!

Thank you all so much for your kind patience, and for kindly reviewing this request.
