REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION

SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY

This is in response to the final Office Action of April 16, 2010.

For the reasons discussed below, Applicant respectfully requests that the Examining Attorney reconsider the final refusal to register Applicant's Mark in light of additional arguments submitted herewith. See T.M.E.P. § 715.03.

I. APPLICANT'S MARK IS NOT LIKELY TO BE CONFUSED WITH THE CITED MARKS

The Examining Attorney initially refused registration of the mark BILL'S BAR & BURGER ("Applicant's Mark") as applied to restaurant and bar services under Section 2(d) on the ground that it is likely to be confused with the mark BILL'S of Registration No. 3,651,118 as applied to restaurant and bar services and BILL'S GAMBLIN' HALL & SALOON & Design of Registration No. 3,316,023 as applied to casino and gaming services; entertainment services, namely, arranging for ticket reservations for shows and other entertainment events; entertainment services in the nature of musical, variety and comedy shows; conducting and providing facilities for special events featuring casino and gaming contest and tournaments; hotel services; bar and restaurant services; provision of conference, exhibition and meeting facilities (collectively, the "Cited Marks"). The Cited Marks are owned by the same Registrant.

After Applicant submitted its Response to the initial Office Action, the Examining Attorney withdraw the objection based on BILL'S GAMBLIN' HALL & SALOON & Design.

In the instant case, the Examining Attorney has admitted that the term BILL is weak. Accordingly, under established precedent, when the marks as a whole are considered in their entirety, the differences between the respective Marks - *i.e.*, BILL'S BAR & BURGER on the one hand, and BILL'S (without

any additional matter) on the other - should be sufficient to distinguish them. It is further noted that when the specimen of use for the Cited Mark BILL'S is reviewed, as the Examining Attorney is entitled to do as part of the record, it is clear that BILL'S is used only in close association with the descriptive wording: "GAMBLIN' HALL & SALOON & Design," which is the relevant wording of the second originally Cited Mark. This shows that the public sees the mark in a distinguishable manner from Applicant's BILL'S BAR AND BURGER. A copy of the specimen of use submitted in support of the Cited Mark BILL'S is attached as Exhibit A.

II. THERE IS NO LIKELIHOOD OF CONFUSION

1. THE FACT THAT THE CITED MARK IS WEAK IS VERY SIGNIFICANT IN DETERMINING WHETHER CONFUSION IS LIKELY

Whether a mark is classified as "strong" or "weak" is a very important element in deciding likelihood of confusion. 4 J. Thomas McCarthy, *McCarthy on Trademarks and Unfair Competition* § 23:48 (4th Ed. 2009).

The Examining Attorney has admitted that the term BILL is weak (Office Action at p. 3).

This position is supported by several factors:

A. BILL is a personal name, and personal names are considered weak (*See In re Rath*, 402 F.3d 1207, 1221 (Fed. Cir. 2005) ("Both surnames and first names are regarded as descriptive terms."); *Russell Harrington Cutlery Inc. v. Zivi Hercules Inc.*, 25 U.S.P.Q.2d 1965, 1968 n.10 (Ma. 1992) (descriptive terms are considered weak).

B. There are numerous third party registrations for BILL formative marks as applied to identical and closely related goods and services, including:

- (1) Reg. No. 2,622,593 for the mark BILL'S FAMOUS FOODS and design for goods which include restaurant and deli services;
- (2) Reg. No. 1,170,668 for the mark BILL'S BARBECUE for restaurant services;
- (3) Reg. No. 1,677,182 for the mark BILL'S PIZZA & PUB ONLY THE BEST SINCE 1957 and design for restaurant services;
- (4) Reg. No. 2,281,824 for the mark BILLY'S for restaurant services featuring stone crabs and seafood; and
- (5) Reg. No. 2,336,100 for the mark BILLY'S STONE CRAB for restaurant services featuring stone crabs and seafood.

The weakness of the term BILL is also underscored by the fact that the name William, of which "Bill"

is the most common nickname, is the 5th most popular baby name in 2009. See Print-out from Social Security Administration website, attached as Exhibit B. We think judicial notice can be taken that William's popularity over the last half century has always been on par with the 2009 statistic. Based on the ubiquitous use of BILL, it is not surprising that there are numerous co-existing registrations for restaurants named after individuals named BILL, underscoring the fact that the public recognizes that not all "BILL" restaurants are related to each other, and that they must further analyze the use and marks, in their entirety, to distinguish among them.

2. WHEN MARKS SHARE ONLY A WEAK ELEMENT, CONFUSION IS NOT LIKELY

When conflicting marks share only a weak element in common, confusion is not likely. For example, in *Tana v. Dantanna's*, 611 F.3d 767 (11th Cir. 2010), a case with striking similarities to the instant case, the Court held that there was no likelihood of confusion between DAN TANA, which consists of a name and is therefore weak, and DANTANNA, both for restaurants. See also *In re Box Solutions Corp.*, 79 U.S.P.Q.2d 1953 (T.T.A.B. 2006) (no likelihood of confusion between BOX and BOX SOLUTIONS, both for computers; "the differences outweigh the similarities given the weakness of the common element"); *Stouffer Corp. v. Health Valley Natural Foods, Inc.*, 1 U.S.P.Q.2d 1900, 1904 (T.T.A.B. 1986) (no likelihood of confusion between LEAN CUISINE and LEAN LIVING, both as applied to food products, because common portion "lean" is at least highly suggestive of low fat food).

Based on the foregoing, the difference between BILL'S BAR & GRILL on the one hand and BILL'S alone on the other, are sufficiently different to avoid any confusion.

3. The Cases and T.M.E.P. Section Relied On By The Examining Attorney Do Not Alter The Conclusion That Confusion is Unlikely

The Examining Attorney's reference to Section 1207.01(b)(ix) of the Trademark Manual does not alter the conclusion that confusion is unlikely between Applicant's Mark and the Cited Marks. Indeed, the first sentence of this Section supports Applicant's position that the Cited Marks are only entitled to a narrow scope of protection:

The Trademark Trial and Appeal Board and the courts have recognized that merely descriptive and weak designations may be entitled to a narrower scope of protection than an entirely arbitrary or coined word.

Although this Section also states "even a weak mark is entitled to protection against the registration of a similar mark for closely related goods or services," the case cited for this proposition, *King Candy Co. v. Eunice King's Kitchen, Inc.*, 496 F.2d 1400, (C.C.P.A. 1974), in fact supports Applicant's argument that there is no likelihood of confusion since the Court found that confusion was not likely between KING'S for candy and MISS KING'S for cakes.

Indeed, the Court in *King Candy* stated:

The expressions "weak" and "entitled to limited protection" are but other ways of saying . . . that confusion is unlikely because the

marks are of such non-arbitrary nature or so widely used that the public easily distinguishes slight differences in the marks under consideration . . .

Id. at 1401.

In re Colonial Stores, Inc., 216 U.S.P.Q. (BNA) 793 (T.T.A.B. 1982), also cited by the Examining Attorney, is easily distinguishable because in that case, the marks were identical - COUNTRY PRIDE for meats on the one hand and COUNTRY PRIDE for bread on the other.

III. CONCLUSION

Based on the foregoing, Applicant respectfully submits that its Mark is not confusingly similar to the Cited Marks, and respectfully requests that the Examining Attorney reconsider its refusal to register.

I. APPLICANT'S MARK IS NOT LIKELY TO BE CONFUSED WITH THE CITED MARKS

The Examining Attorney initially refused registration of the mark **BILL'S BAR & BURGER** ("Applicant's Mark") as applied to restaurant and bar services under Section 2(d) on the ground that it is

likely to be confused with the mark BILL'S of Registration No. 3,651,118 as applied to restaurant and bar services and BILL'S GAMBLIN' HALL & SALOON & Design of Registration No. 3,316,023 as applied to casino and gaming services; entertainment services, namely, arranging for ticket reservations for shows and other entertainment events; entertainment services in the nature of musical, variety and comedy shows; conducting and providing facilities for special events featuring casino and gaming contest and tournaments; hotel services; bar and restaurant services; provision of conference, exhibition and meeting facilities (collectively, the "Cited Marks"). The Cited Marks are owned by the same Registrant.

After Applicant submitted its Response to the initial Office Action, the Examining Attorney withdraw the objection based on BILL'S GAMBLIN' HALL & SALOON & Design.

In the instant case, the Examining Attorney has admitted that the term BILL is weak. 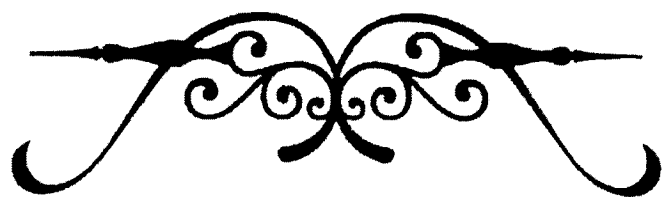

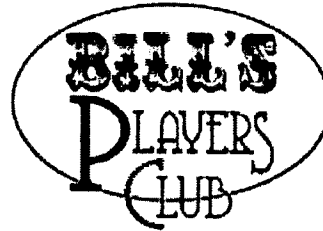

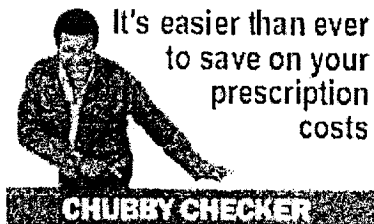
