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## MISCELLANEOUS

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Applicant's Notice of Appeal was filed on October 5, 2007, in response to a final refusal to register dated April 10, 2007. Applicant hereby appeals from the refusal to register its mark based on a geographically misdescriptive objection.

**STATEMENT OF FACTS**

Applicant the owner of a restaurant located in New York City, which offers a variety of Chinese-fusion style foods, such as shrimp and snow pea leaf dumplings, poached lobster with ginger and scallion and shimp and Chinese chive dumplings. Applicant's CHINATOWN BRASSERIE restaurant is located at 380 Layfayette Street, in an area of New York City known as "NoHo." Applicant's restaurant is north of Delancey Street (at least nine streets north of Delancey, see Ex. A) and clearly north of the famous Houston Street dividing line that indicates the "NoHo" and "SoHo" areas of New York. It is not in the area known as "Chinatown," nor does it offer delivery services outside of its restaurant.

On February 14, 2006, the Examining Attorney issued an Office Action, which argued, among other things, that Applicant should disclaim the term CHINATOWN, since it was geographically descriptive. The Examining Attorney argued that “[CHINATOWN] would be descriptive of an area in any city mainly inhabited by Chinese people.” The Examining Attorney also submitted materials which defined the borders of Chinatown and argued that Applicant’s restaurant was in Chinatown.

In its Response to Office Action dated July 26, 2006, Applicant argued that a disclaimer of CHINATOWN was not appropriate in this case because CHINATOWN was meant to evoke Chinese-style cuisine that was offered in Applicant’s restaurant. Further, Applicant offered third-party evidence which established that New York’s Chinatown did not overlap with the area known as “NoHo,” and that Applicant’s restaurant was in NoHo.

In response to these arguments, the Examining Attorney issued another Office Action, dated August 17, 2006. In it, the Examining Attorney argued, among other things, that a) Applicant’s mark was likely to be confused with other CHINATOWN-formative marks which were currently co-existing on the Register, and b) registration should be refused because Applicant’s mark was geographically deceptively misdescriptive, since “potential customers located in Chinatown within just a few blocks of applicant’s location would expect to be able to have delivery services in the area” and that tourists would be surprised upon arriving at Applicant’s restaurant that it was not in Chinatown. The Examining Attorney also, at the same time, maintained the requirement that CHINATOWN be disclaimed.

In its Response to Office Action dated February 7, 2007, Applicant argued that the likelihood of confusion objection was not applicable due to the number of other CHINATOWN-formative marks already co-existing on the Register, specifically, a registration for

CHINATOWN EXPRESS (no disclaimer of CHINATOWN), Reg. No. 1,053,107, for a restaurant located on Seventh Avenue in New York City, not in Chinatown. Applicant also argued that the geographically deceptive misdescriptive refusal was not applicable because CHINATOWN was, in this context, suggestive of the type of cuisine, much as LITTLE ITALY Italian restaurants are not always located in "Little Italy." Further, the evidence of the required services-place association was not established.

On April 10, 2007, the Examining Attorney issued a Final Office Action. The Examining Attorney dropped his objections based on the likelihood of confusion with other marks, and dropped the requirement that CHINATOWN be disclaimed. He maintained and made final the refusal to register based on the ground of the mark being geographically deceptively misdescriptive. The Examining Attorney noted that Chinatown was noted for its Chinese cuisine. He argued that tourists visiting New York City would expect a Chinese restaurant having Chinese food to automatically and only be in Chinatown "based upon the fact that the Chinatown area is noted for its Chinese food" and that a "tourist taking a cab to Applicant's restaurant... would be... surprised to find that Applicant's restaurant was not a Chinatown restaurant at all."

On October 5, 2007, Applicant filed a Request for Reconsideration, arguing among other things, that Chinese restaurants were located all over New York and not solely confined to Chinatown; that there are a number of registrations on the Register which evoked "geographically" sounding terms, but which were not actually located in those areas (e.g., SOHO CUPCAKE for bakeries not located in SoHo, Reg. No. 3,028,947); that there are a number of CHINATOWN-formative marks used on restaurants in New York which are located outside of Chinatown, so the term does not have any geographic significance; and that in the context of

restaurants, CHINATOWN is evocative of Chinese-style cuisine and not a geographic area. This evidence refutes the Examiner's contention, in that both tourists and locals regularly encounter CHINATOWN-formative marks for restaurants not located in the Chinatown area of New York City, thus there is no support of the services/place association necessary to support the refusal to register.

On October 25, 2007, the Request for Reconsideration was denied.

This timely appeal followed.

### ARGUMENT

The sole issue in this appeal is whether the mark CHINATOWN BRASSERIE is geographically deceptively misdescriptive. The Examining Attorney contends that Chinatown is a well-known geographic location known for its restaurants and Chinese cuisine; therefore, a visitor to New York may be confused to discover that Applicant's restaurant is not in Chinatown. In particular, the Examining Attorney, in his denial of Applicant's Request for Reconsideration, argues that there are prior cases, notably In re Consolidated Specialty Restaurants, Inc., 71 U.S.P.Q. 2d 1921 (TTAB 2004), where a geographic indicator within a mark was found to be primarily geographically deceptively misdescriptive. In that case, COLORADO STEAKHOUSE and Design was held to be geographically deceptively misdescriptive of restaurant services due to the association between Colorado and steaks.

The Examining Attorney is mistaken. As set forth in greater detail below, the primary meaning and significance of the term CHINATOWN is not geographic. Much as the term LITTLE ITALY in connection with restaurant services is no longer *primarily* a geographic indicator, the term "Chinatown" is has been so widely used for restaurants outside of Chinatown that it now only suggests a style of Chinese cuisine, not a neighborhood.

## **1. The mark is not primarily geographic**

If the most prominent meaning or significance of the mark is not geographic, or if the mark creates a separate readily understood meaning that is not geographic, then a refusal is not appropriate. See Hyde Park Clothes, Inc. v. Hyde Park Fashions, Inc., 93 U.S.P.Q. 250 (S.D.N.Y. 1951), *aff'd*, 97 U.S.P.Q. 246 (2d Cir. 1953), *cert. denied*, 346 U.S. 827, 99 U.S.P.Q. 491 (1953) (primary significance of HYDE PARK for men's suits is to suggest that the product is stylish or of high quality rather than to provide information about geographic origin); In re International Taste Inc., 53 U.S.P.Q. 2d 1604, 1605-06 (TTAB 2000) (because of other prominent, significant meaning of HOLLYWOOD as referring to the entertainment industry in general, doubt about the primary significance of HOLLYWOOD was resolved in favor of the applicant); In re Urbano, 51 U.S.P.Q. 2d 1776, 1780 (TTAB 1999) (primary significance of SYDNEY 2000, used for advertising and business services and communication services, is as a reference to the Olympic Games, not to the name of a place); In re Municipal Capital Markets Corp., 51 U.S.P.Q. 2d 1369, 1371 (TTAB 1999) (primary significance of COOPERSTOWN is that of "an institution, namely, the Baseball Hall of Fame" rather than a geographic location); In re Jim Crockett Promotions Inc., 5 U.S.P.Q. 2d 1455 (TTAB 1987) (primary significance of THE GREAT AMERICAN BASH for promoting, producing and presenting professional wrestling matches, is to suggest something of desirable quality or excellence rather than to describe the geographic origin of the services); In re Dixie Insurance Co., 223 U.S.P.Q. 514, 516 (TTAB 1984) (DIXIE held not primarily geographically descriptive of property and casualty underwriting services, where the examining attorney provided no evidence to show that the geographical significance of DIXIE was its primary significance).

**a. “CHINATOWN” connotes a style of food, not a location**

Here, CHINATOWN is evocative of Chinese food, and not just the area of Chinatown in New York. Applicant’s mark was derived from the fact that its menu is based on Chinese-style food. There is no geographical connotation intended, and none would be assumed from the context. This is readily supported by the fact that there are a large number of CHINATOWN-formative restaurants that are located outside of Chinatown, as established by the attachment to Applicant’s Request for Reconsideration (see Ex. B), including CHINATOWN in Brooklyn, CHENG’S CHINATOWN RESTAURANT in the East 20s (E. 23<sup>rd</sup> St), NEW CHINATOWN in Sunnyside, NY, CHINATOWN PALACE CHINESE INCORPORATED near Herald Square (592 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue, between 38<sup>th</sup> and 39<sup>th</sup> Streets), CHINATOWN RESTAURANT in the Bronx, CHINATOWN EXPRESS near Herald Square (427 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue, at W. 33<sup>rd</sup> St.), and CHINATOWN RESTAURANT in the East Village (238 E. 14<sup>th</sup> Street, at 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave.). The use of “CHINATOWN” is so widespread and ubiquitous that no reasonable person would associate the term CHINATOWN *primarily* with the geographical area designated as “Chinatown.” The Examining Attorney has submitted no evidence of record – he relies merely on his own speculation or intuition – that visitors to New York would somehow believe that Applicant’s CHINATOWN BRASSERIE restaurant was located in Chinatown, or should be located in Chinatown.

Similarly, there are countless other Chinese restaurants outside of the Chinatown area in New York. ZagatSurvey lists 93 restaurants in Manhattan alone, and Menupages.com lists 624; these restaurants are not all located in Chinatown (see Ex. C). The fact that Applicant’s restaurant serves Chinese food would not be a signifier to a tourist that Applicant’s restaurant is in Chinatown, either, based on the multiplicity of marks containing the term CHINATOWN that

are not based in the area designated as Chinatown. Applicant's mark is particularly distinguishable due to its distinctive design elements, which separate it from other Chinatown restaurants throughout the city (a large number of which are located outside of Chinatown, including CHINATOWN EXPRESS).

**b. The New York restaurant-going public is accustomed to encountering geographical terms unrelated to any specific location**

The public is conditioned to seeing what might be geographical indicators used to denote the theme of the menu or the style of the food. Attached as Ex. D are printouts from AOL City Guide and the 2007 New York ZAGAT guide of the following restaurant information located in New York City, all of which comprise geographical terms but are not located in the place named in the mark:

- S SOHO CUPCAKE COMPANY, a bakery located in Chelsea, Harlem and the Upper East and Upper West Sides, but no locations in SoHo
- CUBA for a Cuban-style restaurant
- LAS RAMBLAS (a well-known street in Barcelona) for a tapas bar
- CAFÉ ESPANOL for Spanish food
- CAFÉ HABANA, a Cuban-style restaurant
- SAIGON GRILL, a Vietnamese restaurant
- UNO CHICAGO GRILL, an Italian-style restaurant located nationally
- JACKSON HOLE, an American eatery
- DELHI PALACE, an Indian buffet
- DALLAS BBQ, a barbecue-style restaurant
- DANUBE, an Austrian eatery, located in TriBeCa
- SALAAM BOMBAY, an Indian-style food restaurant

Restaurant-goers in New York would no sooner believe that CHINATOWN BRASSERIE was located in Chinatown than that the SAIGON GRILL was located in Saigon. Everyone understands that the name of the restaurant likely suggests the menu theme and not a physical location. The Examining Attorney has submitted no evidence to the contrary that in a major metropolitan location such as New York City, tourists and locals take cues as to the food styles from the names, and not the location of the restaurant itself. He makes the totally unsupported contention that, "A tourist taking a cab to Chinatown in Manhattan would search the streets of this area in vain to find applicant's Chinese restaurant, which is located elsewhere, many blocks away." This contention is belied by the fact that (a) as shown in the restaurant information supplied in the same Office Action, the restaurant guide clearly states that the restaurant is located in NoHo, and (b) tourists would not go by cab to Chinatown to visit Applicant's restaurant and simply be dropped off in the middle of a huge neighborhood, expecting to find the restaurant there.

## **2. There is no services/place association established**

The Examining Attorney's basis for his position is his evidence that Chinatown contains a number of Chinese restaurants. More to the point, Chinatown contains every type of business, including dry cleaners, barbers, groceries, herbal medicine stores, drug stores, factories, etc. The evidence submitted by the Examining Attorney with the August 17, 2006 Office Action has the sub-caption: "Chinatown: A World of Dining, Shopping, and History." Under the history section, it states, "Today [Chinatown] is the home to hundreds of garment factories that have an annual payroll of more than \$200 million, a jewelry district with approximately \$100 million in gold and diamond sales per year, more than 200 restaurants that attract thousands of visitors, and 27 banks, by far the highest bank-per-capita ratio in the city." On the basis of this evidence,

restaurants are but one aspect of an area known for its clothing manufacturing, jewelry and banks.

Of course, every neighborhood in New York has dozens of restaurants, as New York City has the largest population in the country, and all of these people need to eat. To say, however, that Chinatown is synonymous with restaurants is belied by the evidence. The 2007 ZAGAT Guide shows 31 restaurants in Chinatown, 58 restaurants in TriBeCa, 107 restaurants in Greenwich Village, and 116 restaurants in the East Village (see Ex. E) – all of which is to say that New York City is known to have a huge number of restaurants everywhere. There is no specific services/place connotation with Chinatown since Chinese restaurants abound everywhere, and conversely, Chinatown is packed with clothing and jewelry stores, vegetable and fish markets, and herbal medicine shops, not to mention banks. Tourists look at guide books or the Internet to find restaurants by name or type of cuisine, and understand that a restaurant with a name such as DALLAS BBQ, located at seven locations in New York City but nowhere in Dallas, suggests Western-style food, and not the location of the restaurant. So, too, the mark CHINATOWN BRASSERIE suggests Chinese fusion food, and not a location. One must look at the New York restaurant scene as it exists in context, complete with dozens of non-relevant geographical names to which the restaurant-going public is accustomed, and not through the speculative conjecture of the Examining Attorney.

### **3. Precisely analogous marks have been registered**

Moreover, the Examining Attorney's argument completely ignores another important and dispositive argument raised in Applicant's prior papers: there are numerous other marks containing geographical terms which are currently on the Register, which were not found to be geographically misdescriptive, for example, S SOHO CUPCAKE COMPANY, located outside

of SoHo in New York (see attached specimen) (U.S. Reg. No. 3,028,947 – no disclaimer of SOHO); MAGGIANO’S LITTLE ITALY (U.S. Reg. No. 1,754,637), located around the country; CAFÉ LUXEMBOURG (U.S. Reg. No. 2,260,760), which is located in New York and not Luxembourg; UNO CHICAGO GRILL (U.S. Reg. No. 2,900,824), which is located throughout the country (see Ex. F). Directly on point to the case here, there is another CHINATOWN-formative mark that is on the Principal Register – CHINATOWN EXPRESS for a restaurant located outside of Chinatown (on 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue between 33<sup>rd</sup> and 34<sup>th</sup> Street in New York City) (see Ex. G, no disclaimer of the term “CHINATOWN”). As with CHINATOWN EXPRESS, Applicant’s mark CHINATOWN BRASSERIE should be allowed on the Register.

**4. The overall mark is incongruous and therefore registrable**

Finally, Applicant’s mark is CHINATOWN BRASSERIE. The BRASSERIE portion of the mark evokes European cuisine, and is inherently incongruous with a location in Chinatown. A consumer seeking Applicant’s restaurant would, upon encountering the mark as a whole, understand that the CHINATOWN portion of the mark, when used in conjunction with BRASSERIE, is one of the many Asian fusion restaurants located throughout New York City.

## CONCLUSION

Applicant's mark is not geographically misdescriptive, as there are countless other marks currently on the Register, including CHINATOWN EXPRESS and S SOHO CUPCAKE COMPANY, which contain arguably "geographic terms," but which are not misdescriptive. The term CHINATOWN is so ubiquitously used that it no longer functions *primarily* as a geographic signifier. Applicant's mark CHINATOWN BRASSERIE & Design functions solely to designate the source of Applicant's restaurant services and to connote Chinese-style cuisine, and not to designate a part of town where the restaurant is located. Applicant therefore respectfully requests that the refusal to register be reversed.






