Definitions



princess

[prɪnˈsɪs, -sɛs; Brit prɪnˈsɛz, prɪnˈsɛz]

Princess is defined as a woman who is the daughter of a king or queen, or the wife or daughter of a king or queen's son, or someone who acts or lives like they have the status of a royal person. *noun*



An example of a princess is Princess Diana.

The definition of princess is something created to stay close-fitting and hang in smooth lines from the top to the hem. *adjective*

An example of princess used as an adjective is the phrase "princess gown" which means a gown cut in smooth lines from the top to the hem.
