**APPLICANT’S APPEAL BRIEF**

Applicant The Kitchen Cafe, LLC (“Applicant”) requests reversal of the Trademark Office’s final refusal under Section 2(d) of the Lanham Act to register the mark THE KITCHEN for *restaurant services* in International Class 43 (“Applicant’s Mark”).

**I. FACTS**

On June 25, 2013, Applicant filed a use-based application to register the mark THE KITCHEN for *restaurant services* in International Class 43. On October 3, 2013, the USPTO issued an office action refusing registration of Applicant’s Mark under Sections 2(d), (e) and (f) of the Lanham Act (“Non-Final Office Action”). On April 7, 2014, pursuant to Applicant’s request, the application was suspended pending disposition of cited prior pending applications.

The USPTO issued a final refusal on October 21, 2014, refusing registration of Applicant’s Mark under Sections 2(d), (e), and (f) of the Lanham Act (“Final Office Action”).<sup>1</sup> The 2(d) refusal relied on two U.S. Registrations, including Registration No. 3792358 covering DA KITCHEN for *clothing, namely, shirts, t-shirts, tank tops, and hats* in International Class 25 and *restaurant services; carry out restaurant services; catering services* in International Class 43 (“Cited Mark”), owned by Restaurant Destinations, Inc. (“Registrant”).

On April 21, 2015, Applicant filed a Request for Reconsideration after Final Action (“Request for Reconsideration”). With respect to the Cited Mark, Applicant argued that there was no likelihood of confusion between the respective marks because, among other things: (1) the Cited Mark’s scope of protection is narrow because it already co-exists with other marks incorporating the term “kitchen” in the context of restaurant services; (2) the Cited Mark is a Hawaiian slang/pidgin phrase that creates a different commercial impression than the English phrase “The Kitchen”; and (3) the Registrant itself believes the Cited Mark is distinguishable from Applicant’s Mark.

On April 24, 2015, the USPTO withdrew or deemed obviated its refusals based on Sections 2(e) and (f), and withdrew one of the citations for its Section 2(d) refusal. However, the USPTO denied Applicant’s Request for Reconsideration with respect to the Cited Mark. Applicant filed its Notice of Appeal to the Board on April 21, 2015. The appeal proceedings were suspended pending disposition of Applicant’s Request for Reconsideration and resumed April 30, 2015. Applicant respectfully submits this appeal brief for the Board’s consideration.

## **II. ISSUE**

The only issue before the Board is whether Applicant’s Mark is confusingly similar to the Cited Mark.

## **III. ARGUMENT**

Likelihood of confusion is determined by weighing the well-known factors set forth in *E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co.*, 177 U.S.P.Q. 563, 567 (C.C.P.A. 1973). In this case, the most relevant factors are strength of the Cited Mark and similarity between the Cited Mark and Applicant’s Mark. Applicant respectfully argues that consumer confusion is unlikely because: (1) the Cited Mark is weak and entitled to minimal protection due to a crowded field of

KITCHEN-formative marks used in connection with restaurant services; and (2) while the marks share the term “kitchen,” the inclusion of “da” in the Cited Mark gives it a different overall commercial impression from Applicant’s Mark, and consumers – who are already accustomed to encountering and distinguishing between many KITCHEN-formative marks – will likewise be able to distinguish between THE KITCHEN and DA KITCHEN.

**A. The Cited Mark Co-Exists With A Plethora Of KITCHEN-Formative Marks In The Context Of Restaurant Services, And Is Therefore Weak And Deserving Of Very Narrow Protection.**

The strength or weakness of a mark is “a vital factor” in the likelihood of confusion inquiry. *Sun Banks of Florida, Inc. v. Sun Fed. Sav. & Loan Assoc.*, 651 F.2d 311, 315 (5th Cir. 1981). “Evidence of widespread third-party use, in a particular field, of marks containing a certain shared term is competent to suggest that purchasers have been conditioned to look to the other elements of the marks as a means of distinguishing the source of goods or services in the field.” *In re Broadway Chicken Inc.*, 38 U.S.P.Q.2d 1559, 1566 (T.T.A.B. 1996) (evidence of widespread third-party use of marks containing BROADWAY for restaurant services sufficient to find no likelihood of confusion between BROADWAY CHICKEN and BROADWAY PIZZA); *see also Homeowners Grp., Inc. v. Home Mktg. Specialists, Inc.*, 931 F.2d 1100, 1108, 18 U.S.P.Q.2d 1587, 1593 (6th Cir. 1991) (“[C]ourts have found extensive third-party uses of a trademark to substantially weaken the strength of a mark.”); *Fortunoff Silver Sales, Inc. v. Norman Press, Inc.*, 225 U.S.P.Q. 863, 867 (T.T.A.B. 1985) (confusion unlikely in face of thirty-one similar marks).

The Office Actions and Request for Reconsideration include references to a plethora of third party marks incorporating the term “kitchen” in the context of restaurant services. These references include various common law marks as well as the below applications and registrations:

The Examining Attorney argues that evidence of third party marks is entitled to weight only if the marks identified are actually in use. However, the common law marks set forth in the Office Actions have already been substantiated by the Examining Attorney with evidence of actual use in the form of website printouts. Further, third-party registrations are relevant to show that a mark or a portion of a mark is descriptive, suggestive, or *so commonly used* that the public will look to other elements to distinguish the source of the goods or services. *See, e.g., In re Hartz Hotel Servs., Inc.*, 102 U.S.P.Q.2d 1150, 1153-54 (T.T.A.B. 2012); *In re Melville Corp.*, 18 U.S.P.Q.2d 1386, 1388 (T.T.A.B. 1991); *In re Dayco Prods.-Eagle Motive Inc.*, 9 U.S.P.Q.2d 1910, 1911-12 (T.T.A.B. 1988); *Plus Prods. v. Star-Kist Foods, Inc.*, 220 U.S.P.Q. 541, 544 (T.T.A.B. 1983). When used in this limited manner, third party registrations are similar to dictionaries; they show how language is generally used. *See, e.g., Tektronix, Inc. v. Daktronics, Inc.*, 534 F.2d 915, 917, 189 U.S.P.Q. 693, 694-95 (C.C.P.A. 1976); *In re J.M. Originals Inc.*, 6 U.S.P.Q.2d 1393, 1394 (T.T.A.B. 1987); *United Foods Inc. v. J.R. Simplot Co.*, 4 U.S.P.Q.2d 1172, 1174 (T.T.A.B. 1987).

The evidence shows that the word “kitchen” is commonly used in connection with the offering of restaurant services. Registrant agrees, noting that “the word ‘KITCHEN’ is frequently found in registered marks . . . [and] . . . [t]here are 545 marks containing the word ‘KITCHEN.’” (*See Registrant’s Response to Office Action, attached to Request for Reconsideration*). The Examining Attorney notes that Registrant should be protected “from adverse commercial impact due to use of a similar mark by a newcomer.” Here, Registrant is

expressly not concerned with any such adverse commercial impact. (*Id.*) Indeed, Registrant *availed itself* of the crowded field of KITCHEN-formative marks in order to obtain registration for the Cited Mark.

Applicant's Mark merely represents an additional entry into a marketplace already replete with KITCHEN-formative marks. There is no reason to believe consumers will be any less able to distinguish between the Cited Mark and Applicant's Mark, than they are able to distinguish between the many KITCHEN-formative marks they are already accustomed to encountering. *See In re Broadway Chicken*, 38 U.S.P.Q.2d at 1566; *In re Bed & Breakfast Registry*, 791 F.2d 157, 159, 229 U.S.P.Q. 818, 819 (Fed. Cir. 1986) (consumers "acquainted with the term 'bed and breakfast' are more likely to rely on the non-common portion of each mark . . . to distinguish among similar services"); *ABC Consol. Corp. v. Chandler*, 170 U.S.P.Q. 417, 421 (T.T.A.B. 1971) (similar "waiter or chef" marks create "distinctly different commercial impression[s]" when coupled with nuanced differences).

**B. The Term "Da Kitchen" Creates A Different Commercial Impression Than The English Phrase "The Kitchen," Especially Because "The" Has No Effect On Mark Meaning/Connotation, While "Da" Serves As A Source Indicator.**

Where, as here, a mark is entitled to only a narrow scope of protection due to a crowded field, "the addition of other matter to a highly suggestive or descriptive designation, whether such matter be equally suggestive or even descriptive, or possibly nothing more than a variant of the term, may be sufficient to distinguish them so as to avoid confusion[.]" *In re Hunke & Jochheim*, 185 U.S.P.Q. 188, 189 (T.T.A.B. 1975) (DURABLE for stationary articles, including folders, binders and paper, not confusingly similar to DURABUL for record books). By this well recognized rule, the use of "da" with "kitchen" in the Cited Mark is sufficient to distinguish it from Applicant's Mark. *See Coach/Braunsdorf Affinity, Inc. v. 12 Interactive, L.L.C.*, 110 U.S.P.Q.2d 1458, 1477 (T.T.A.B. 2014) ("slight differences" sufficient to distinguish between

marks where common element is descriptive, frequently used and/or frequently registered); *In re Woodstream Corp.*, 2013 WL 236994, at \*5 (T.T.A.B 2013) (“[W]here the common element is very weak, even small differences in the marks . . . may suffice to dispel likely confusion.”).

The Examining Attorney argues that “da” is English slang meaning “the” and, therefore, the Cited Mark and Applicant’s Mark have the same meaning and connotation. In other words, the Examining Attorney argues that the use of “da” in the Cited Mark cannot serve to distinguish the Cited Mark from Applicant’s Mark.

Applicant strongly disagrees for the following reasons: (1) “da” has many well recognized meanings other than “the”; (2) the doctrine of foreign equivalents does not apply to Hawaiian slang/pidgin; (3) even if understood to mean “the,” “da” changes the overall commercial impression of the Cited Mark; (4) there is no evidence that consumers are likely to pronounce THE KITCHEN and DA KITCHEN identically; therefore (5) the correct analysis is to compare KITCHEN (removing “the”) to DA KITCHEN; and (6) Registrant has acknowledged that the Cited Mark is entitled to very narrow protection and would not be confused with THE KITCHEN. In an already crowded field where consumers are accustomed to distinguishing between source, the use of “da in the Cited Mark is sufficient to avoid a likelihood of confusion.

**i. “Da” has many well recognized meanings other than “the.”**

“Da” has several meanings, as evidenced by attachments to the Office Actions, Request for Reconsideration, and Response to Request for Reconsideration. According to InternetSlang.com and UrbanDictionary.com, “da” can mean several things in the English language, including “the,” “District Attorney,” or “dad.” (See printouts attached to Non Final Office Action). According to Wikipedia and UrbanDictionary.com, “da” can also mean “dad” in

Irish, “yes” in Russian, or can be a prefix for “deca.”<sup>2</sup> (See attachments to Non Final Office Action and Response to Request for Reconsideration; see also Attachment A, collection of sources indicating “da” is understood to mean “dad” in Irish or “yes” in Russian).

And, according to Registrant, “da,” as used in the Cited Mark, is Hawaiian slang/pidgin. (See excerpt from the Registrant’s website located at [www.da-kitchen.com](http://www.da-kitchen.com), attached to Request for Reconsideration). Consumers are accustomed to the Hawaiian slang/pidgin term “da,” thanks to the famous surf and sports equipment company, DaKine, originally founded in Maui, whose name derives from Hawaiian slang/pidgin. (See Attachment B, excerpt from Wikipedia regarding company). In addition to the well-known DaKine surf brand, consumers encounter the Hawaiian slang/pidgin term “da” in at least the following examples: Da Poke Shack (restaurant), Da Kine Hawaiian Rub Seasoning, Da Hui (infamous surfer gang), Da Hui (surf clothing company), Da Ukulele Boyz (musical group), Da Local Banana (banana stand), Pidgin to DA Max (book series), Da Kine Bail Bonds, Da Third House Bed & Breakfast, Da Pink House on Da Beach (hotel), and Da Hawaiian Kitchen (located in California). (See Attachment C, excerpts from relevant websites).

In light of the fact that “da” has several well recognized meanings and derivations, it cannot be assumed that the Cited Mark and Applicant’s Mark will have the same connotation and meaning to consumers.

**ii. The doctrine of foreign equivalents does not apply to Hawaiian slang/pidgin.**

The evidence is that “da” has many meanings, at least three of which derive from foreign language: “the” in Hawaiian slang/pidgin, “dad” in Irish, and “yes” in Russian. While the doctrine of foreign equivalents may apply to the Russian and Irish languages, there can be no

question that it does not apply to Hawaiian slang/pidgin. *In re Christopher A. Fahey, DBA Gravity Guitar Picks*, ex parte appeal involving Serial No. 86250337 (T.T.A.B. 2015). (Copy of decision attached to Request for Reconsideration). Nor has there been any argument or evidence that it does. *See In re Dunville Peat & Herbal Prods. Ltd.*, 2014 WL 1390503, at \*3-5 (T.T.A.B. 2014) (examining attorney must introduce evidence that ordinary American purchasers are knowledgeable in Hawaiian slang/pidgin to apply doctrine of foreign equivalents). It is therefore improper for the Examining Attorney to conclude that the marks will have the same connotation and meaning to consumers.

**iii. Even if understood to mean “the,” “da” is capable of acting as a source identifier.**

More importantly, even if consumers interpret “da” to mean “the,” it does not follow that “da” cannot be a distinctive and source-identifying element of the Cited Mark. Rather, it has been long recognized that adding a foreign article, such as “la,” “le,” or “da,” to an English term “changes the commercial impression of the mark as a whole.” *See, e.g., In re Johanna Farms, Inc.*, 8 U.S.P.Q.2d 1408, 1413, 1988 WL 252411, at \*5 (T.T.A.B. 1988) (combining the French article “la” with a generic English term “changes the commercial impression of the mark as a whole”); *In re Universal Package Corp.*, 222 U.S.P.Q. 344, 347 (T.T.A.B. 1984) (holding “le’ . . . imparts to the mark a French flavor, a continental connotation,” which changes the “commercial impression” of the mark and rejecting conclusion that the commercial impression between LE JAR and THE JAR is the same); *see also* J. Thomas McCarthy, *McCarthy on Trademarks and Unfair Competition*, § 12.42 (4th ed.).

The fact that “da” can in fact change the commercial impression of a mark is evidenced by multiple attachments to the Response to Request for Reconsideration regarding “da bears.” There are several other sporting teams in the United States whose names include the term

“bears,” including, to name a few, Newark Bears, Baylor University Bears, Brown University Bears, Maine Black Bears, Ohio Northern University Polar Bears, Southwest Missouri State Bears, SUNY Potsdam Bears, University of California Golden Bears, Washington University Bears, and Western New England College Golden Bears. (*See* Attachment D, excerpts from relevant websites). Yet, consumers recognize “da bears” as referring exclusively to the Chicago NFL team. (*See* printout from beargoggleson.com, attached to Response to Request for Reconsideration) (“most Chicago Bears fans, NFL fans or non-fans alike all use the term [DA BEARS] as if it’s part of the 1920 Decatur Staleys charter”). Even if understood to mean “the,” the term “da” in “da bears” serves as a strong indicator of source.

Thus, the rule that inclusion of the term “the” at the beginning of a mark “generally” has no trademark significance is improperly applied to the slang term “da,” even if that term may be understood to mean “the.”<sup>3</sup> The term “da” conveys some notion of “foreign flavor or exoticness” and, therefore, changes the overall commercial impression of a mark in a way the term “the” does not. The commercial significance of “da” cannot be overlooked when analyzing similarity of the marks.

**iv. There is no evidence that consumers are likely to pronounce THE KITCHEN and DA KITCHEN identically.**

There is no evidence to support the argument that consumers “are likely to pronounce THE KITCHEN and DA KITCHEN identically or nearly identically.” (*See* Office Actions). The letters “th” and “d” are pronounced decidedly differently. The former requires placing the tongue against the lower part of the back of the upper teeth to effect a soft, rolling sound. The latter requires placing the tongue against the roof of the mouth to effect a hard, singular sound.

As such, they are less relevant to analysis of similarity between THE KITCHEN and DA KITCHEN than the cases Applicant cites above.

The “th” sound cannot be created using the technique to create the “d” sound, and vice versa. (See printouts from [www.wikihow.com](http://www.wikihow.com), attached to Response to Request for Reconsideration) (explaining that “th” and “d” are not pronounced alike; rather, “th” must be *replaced* with “d,” thereby changing the sound of the resulting word entirely). It is therefore unlikely that consumers will pronounce THE KITCHEN and DA KITCHEN identically or nearly identically.

**v. The correct analysis is to compare KITCHEN to DA KITCHEN.**

The correct analysis is to compare KITCHEN – dropping the “the,” which has no trademark significance – to DA KITCHEN – including the “da,” which does have trademark significance.<sup>4</sup> See, e.g., *In re Johanna Farms, Inc.*, 8 U.S.P.Q.2d at 1412-13; *In re Universal Package Corp.*, 222 U.S.P.Q. at 347. When analyzed in this manner, it is clear that the marks are not “identical” or “functionally identical,” as asserted by the Examining Attorney, and they do not have the same meaning or connotation.

**vi. Registrant has acknowledged that the Cited Mark is entitled to very narrow protection and would not be confused with THE KITCHEN.**

Registrant has acknowledged that the Cited Mark already co-exists with many others using “kitchen” in connection with restaurant services. (Registrant’s Response to Office Action, attached to Request for Reconsideration) (pointing out 545 co-existing marks). In the file history for the Cited Mark, Registrant admitted that the Cited Mark and the mark shown in Application

Serial No. 77485693 () “are dissimilar in their appearance, *sound*, *connotation*, and commercial impression.” (See copy of the Office Action dated September 17, 2009 attached

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<sup>4</sup> The fact that Registrant disclaimed the term “kitchen” in the Cited Mark is further reason that when comparing the two marks, the Cited Mark must be compared inclusive of the term “da.” If “da” were incapable of trademark significance, then disclaimer of “kitchen” in the Cited Mark – which does not include any other design or other elements – would render the entire mark unregistrable on the Principal Register, absent a showing of acquired distinctiveness.

to Request for Reconsideration). Applicant's Mark is equally as dissimilar with respect to sound and connotation, even without a design element.

Due to the crowded field of KITCHEN-formative marks used in connection with restaurant services, the inclusion of the term "da" in the Cited Mark is sufficient to distinguish the Cited Mark from Applicant's Mark. *See, e.g., Coach/Braunsdorf*, 110 U.S.P.Q.2d at 1477; *Fortunoff*, 225 U.S.P.Q. at 869; *ABC Consol.*, 170 U.S.P.Q. at 421. Consumers, who are already accustomed to distinguishing between KITCHEN-formative marks using minor variants, will be able to distinguish between the marks at issue.

#### IV. CONCLUSION

There is no likelihood of confusion between Applicant's Mark and the Cited Mark because: (1) the crowded field of KITCHEN-formative marks used in connection with restaurant services permits each registrant only very narrow rights, leaving room for Applicant's Mark on the Principal Register; and (2) the "da" in the Cited Mark gives it a different overall commercial impression, which consumers – who are already accustomed to encountering many KITCHEN-formative marks – will be able to use to distinguish between the Cited Mark and Applicant's Mark.

Therefore, Applicant respectfully requests reversal of the Trademark Office's final refusal under Section 2(d) of the Lanham Act to register Applicant's Mark.

- Your Dad might like to treat you from time to time, but it turns out he prefers **quality time** with you above all else – 28% of dads opted for a play in the park with kids or playing games with them (24%), over going to the cinema with their children (11%), swimming (12%), going to a sports event (13%) or going to a show (12%).
- **Irish fathers worry** about you too – 61% stay awake worrying about their children's health, 44% worry about being a good role model and 41% worry about financial commitments.

The survey also puts US President Barack Obama top of the 'inspirational Dads' list, followed by our own President Michael D Higgins, followed by David Beckham and the rather more dubious fictional character of Walter White from TV's Breaking Bad. 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## Basic Russian Phrases

### Russian Language Lesson 3

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**New Russian Audio:** To help you learn Russian this lesson now has sound. Click the green icon to listen. ([Help](#))

Now that you understand the Russian letters and numbers, we will begin to learn some basic Russian phrases that you will commonly use as part of everyday communication. We will not attempt to introduce any grammar in this lesson. It is more important to learn some basic communication skills in Russian. Once you have a 'feel' for the language, you will find it easier to understand how the grammar works. When you were young, you learnt to speak before you learnt the grammar. We feel it is easier to learn Russian the same way, however don't worry, we will cover grammar in later lessons. In this lesson you will learn the Russian language basics.

When you are in Russia it is important to realise that Russians have two manners of speaking, formal or friendly. It would be considered slightly rude to use the wrong form in the wrong situation. Use the friendly (or familiar) form when you are speaking to someone you consider a friend. In situations where you have never met the person before you would use the formal form, for example in shops or with taxi drivers. You would also use the formal form as a sign of respect to teachers, or in places like business meetings. Keep this in mind as you work through these Russian lessons. This is much easier than it sounds, as there are only a couple of words that change. (Mainly the Russian word for "you".)

**Please and Thank-You.**

The two most important words you will learn in Russian are please and thank-you. You can just add these to any sentence to make it more polite.

- Спасибо** ("spa-see-ba") - Thank-You
- Пожалуйста** ("pa-zhai-sta") - Please (and You're Welcome)

The word Пожалуйста is also used to mean "You're Welcome", after somebody says thank-you. You should always say this after someone thanks you. Пожалуйста is pronounced a little different than it is written, you can basically forget the "ый".

**Yes and No.**

Two other very important Russian words are "Yes" and "No".

- Да** ("da") - Yes
- Нет** ("nyet") - No

**Saying Hello.**

When you are in Russia and you meet somebody, the first thing you will want to do is to say "hello". There are two forms of this word.

- Здравствуйте** ("zdra-stvooy-tye") - Hello (Formal)
- Привет** ("pree-vyet") - Hi (Informal)

Здравствуйте may be a little difficult for you to pronounce at first, but it is the most common Russian greeting so you should try to practice it. Привет is also commonly used with friends. However, keep in mind that Привет is informal (much like "hi" in English), and should only be used with friends. If somebody says Привет to you, then it is normally safe to proceed in the friendly tone.

**Introducing Yourself.**

In order to introduce yourself, you may need the following phrases.

- Меня зовут ...** ("men-ya za-voot") - My name is ...
- Как вас зовут?** ("kak vas za-voot") - What is your name?
- Очень приятно** ("och-en pree-yat-na") - Pleased to meet you.

Note: The above 3 phrases are grammatically unusual. You should just learn the whole phrase, not the individual words.

**How are you?**

The most natural way to ask someone how they are in Russian is to ask: "how are things?"

- Как дела?** - How are things?
- Хорошо спасибо** - Good/Well thank-you
- Плохо** - Bad

**Saying Good-Bye.**

There are also two words for saying good-bye.

- До свидания** ("da-svyee-da-nee-ye") - Good-bye. (The do is pronounced as if it is part of the next word)
- Пока** ("pa-ka") - Bye. (Informal, slang)

You should generally use до свидания, which is appropriate in formal or informal situations. You may also hear people say Пока, but we suggest you only use it with friends.

**Asking about languages**

When you are asking a yes/no question in Russian, there is no difference between the question and the statement, except for the question mark. When you are speaking Russian you should ask questions in a different tone. The tone of your voice should rise if you are asking a question. If you are making a statement your tone will naturally fall. You may find that you actually do this in English without meaning to. If all else fails, put a real questioning expression on your face.

-  **Вы говорите по-английски?** - Do you (formal) speak English?
-  **Вы говорите по-русски?** - Do you (formal) speak Russian?
-  **Я говорю по-английски** - I speak English
-  **Я говорю по-русски** - I speak Russian
  
-  **Я понимаю** - I understand
-  **Я не понимаю** - I don't understand

You may have noticed that the ending of the verb *говорю* (speak) changes depending on who the subject is. Don't worry too much about this yet. It will be covered in another lesson very soon. (lesson 5).

### Conclusion

You have now reached the end of your first lesson that involves useful Russian phrases. After some practice you should be comfortable introducing yourself.

In this lesson we will learn two simple words:

 And NO! will be **[N'ET]** - НЕТ!

Try to pronounce it [N'ET] with soft [N']. As you can see there is no [Y] between [N] and [E] sounds in transcription. It should not sound like [N'YET].  
 Consonants in Russian are softer than in English. In the same word [N'ET] you can hear that [T] at the end of the word is quiet, it is not a plosive sound like in English.



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

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

### Da Hui

With outsiders and the professional contest circuit shunting surfers on the north shore of Hawaii's Oahu from their favourite surf breaks, some locals banded together in 1976 to form the Hui O He'e Nalu, or Club of Wave Sliders.

Known as Da Hui or the Black Shorts, for their uniform surf trunks, they paddled into waves during competitions to protest that the water had been closed to them.

Feeling disrespected at home in a sport their ancestors invented, Da Hui threatened and thrashed a bunch of predominately South African and Aussie surfers.

Da Hui's 400-plus members have mellowed with age and these days, they're more interested in community events and their surf and MMA clothing label.

Known as the defenders of Oahu's north shore, the Wolfpak reputedly use fear and their fists to police an 11km stretch of some of the world's best and biggest waves. At the Banzai Pipeline, Wolfpak determine which waves go to whom, and punish those who breach their code of respect.


Wolfpak represents tribalism and localism, often in a gang-like manner, and have picked up where Da Hui left off in the 1970s and 1980s.

The most well-known Wolfpak members are the late Andy Irons and his brother Bruce, Sunny Garcia and muscle-bound pro surfer, Kala Alexander, who has "Wolfpak" tattooed across his knuckles. Alexander, who also appeared in *Blue Crush* and *Forgetting Sarah Marshall* has served time in prison for assault, and his reputation as a brawler is more legendary than his profile as a surfer.

The Wolfpak formed a decade ago when Alexander moved to the north shore from Kauai and joined his childhood friend Kai Garcia — a former professional surfer and jujitsu champion known as Kaiborg for his fearsome superhuman reputation.

Californian surfer Chris Ward cut off a local surfer while riding a wave at Banzai Pipeline. He was banished to the beach, where a Wolfpak member reportedly smashed him in the head.

During the 2007 Billabong Pipeline Masters, a fight in the water spilled onto the beach as Sunny Garcia chased his opening-round opponent, Neco Padaratz of Brazil. Padaratz browned his wettie and fled, followed by Garcia and some locals. The cops eventually escorted Padaratz from the contest.



**Bra Boys**

This surf tribe from Sydney's Maroubra Beach was founded in the 1990s, as members from housing commissions and broken families gained notoriety through violent clashes with outsiders and the police.

The brotherhood took the "bra" in their name in part from Maroubra, the tough beach suburb they call home, and from the street slang for brother.

The 200-plus members, which include former pro surfers Sunny and Koby Abberton and rugby league players Reni Maitua and John Sutton, are often inked with "My Brother's Keeper", 2035 (Maroubra's postcode) and a special handshake illustration that grips the inner arm.

In 2002, around 160 members were involved in a mass brawl with off-duty police officers at Coogee-Randwick RSL Club. News reports at the time claimed 30 coppers were left injured.

In 2005, Jai Abberton was acquitted of a 2003 murder of standover man and former Bra Boy Tony Hines. His brother Koby was handed a suspended nine-month jail sentence after being found guilty of perverting the course of justice.



**Palos Verdes surfers**

In 2002, a surfer named Tim Banas and his 18-year-old son, Tommy, tried to get a wave at Palos Verdes Estate, California and was told by local surfers, "If you don't live here, don't surf here."



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A fight broke out and Tommy allegedly cracked open the skull of one of the local surfers with a rock, the UK's *Guardian* reported.

The Banases claim that they were attacked and were filthy that only Tommy was charged. The fight led to police setting up Surf Watch, for those who wish to surf and don't want to be intimidated.

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## Roots



The Hui O He'e Nalu (aka: Da Hui, Black Shorts) was created in 1975 by a group of Hawaiian surfers with the mission to preserve the rights of fellow Hawaiian surfers to surf in our ocean without any disrespect from foreigners.

### 1975

The Hui O He'e Nalu, which literally means "Club of Wave Riders", was officially established in 1976 by a core group of North Shore waveriders to protect the rights of hawaiian and local non-hawaiian surfers. Over the years, the club's atmosphere has become more family (or "Ohana") oriented with positive community related goals. Generally known as DA HUI (Da is Pidgin English for "the", and Hui in this instance meaning "club" or "clan"), the present members, who value Da Hui's traditions, are also great ocean sportsmen & women who demand respect for the protection of the island's environment (focused on the land and the ocean) and for the Hawaiian culture and its traditions.

Da Hui's clothing formation began with Eddie Rothman, Bryan Amona, Kawika Stant Sr. and Clyde Aikau. Initially made by Quiksilver in the 70's, Da Hui bucked the encroaching corporate system with their own home grown signature **Black Shorts**, effectively regulating the North Shore breaks.



***Pidgin to Da Max*** (full title: *Peppo's Pidgin to Da Max*) is a humorous illustrated dictionary of Hawaiian Pidgin words and phrases by Douglas Simonson, Pat Sasaki, and Ken Sakata. With the definitions of most of the words and phrases also given in Pidgin, the book is not clearly intended to be used as a Pidgin-English dictionary, although a reader unfamiliar with the dialect would likely understand most of the entries from context and the illustrations. Rather, the book is intended to be a humorous introspective for Hawaiians about the language they speak on a day-to-day basis. As such, it is a relatively popular book in Hawaii, and sold 25,000 copies in its first month in print.

There is an additional volume, titled *Pidgin to Da Max: Hana Hou*, which follows the first book.

As an example of an entry for which the dictionary may be of little help to outsiders, consider the definition of the word da kine:

**DA KINE** (*da KINE*) Da kine is the keystone of pidgin. You can use it anywhere, anytime, anyhow. Very convenient. What would we do without DA KINE? "Ey, I no can da kine if you no like da kine, too!"

The dictionary then turns around and uses "da kine" (often a notoriously difficult word for non-Hawaiians to understand) in some of the definitions of other words.

The authors of *Pidgin to Da Max* are not originally from Hawaii, and Simonson admits to not speaking Pidgin all that well.


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# Newark Bears

The **Newark Bears** were an American professional baseball team based in Newark, New Jersey. They were a member of the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball and, later, the Canadian American Association of Professional Baseball. The Bears played their home games at Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium.

The Can-Am League announced on November 28, 2013 that the Newark Bears would not operate in 2014.<sup>[1]</sup> The team folded in 2014.<sup>[2]</sup>

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## History of Newark baseball [edit]

*Further information: Newark Bears (1926–1949)*

Newark was the home of several former minor league baseball teams, from the formation of the Newark Indians in 1902, and the addition of the Newark Eagles of the Negro National League in 1936. A Federal League team, the Newark Peppers also played in 1915.

The original Newark Bears were a team in the International League from 1926 to 1949. They played their home games at the former Ruppert Stadium in what is now known as the Ironbound section of Newark.

### The Bears of the Atlantic League [edit]

The Newark Bears are named for the former Newark Bears team of the International League. The team was formed in 1998 by former New York Yankees catcher Rick Cerone, a Newark native. However, the Bears played their "home" schedule at The Ballpark at Harbor Yard in Bridgeport, Connecticut that season while awaiting the completion of their new home field. In addition, the Bears played several home games during the first half of the 1999 season at Skylands Park in Augusta, New Jersey. The Bears inaugurated their new park, Bears & Eagles Riverfront Stadium, in Newark on July 16, 1999.

Over the years, the Bears attracted star talent to their club. Ozzie Canseco played for the Bears in 2000 and 2001, and his brother José Canseco was with the team for part of 2001 as well. Rickey Henderson played the first half of the 2003 season with the Bears and was named Most Valuable Player in the Atlantic League All-Star Game. He was subsequently signed by the Los Angeles Dodgers, but was released at season's end, and he returned to the Bears for 2004. Also in 2003, José Lima pitched for the Bears at the beginning of the season; after the Kansas City Royals signed him away from Newark, Lima won his first seven decisions for the Royals.<sup>[3]</sup>

Other notable alumni include Scott Spiezio, Edgardo Alfonzo, Armando Benitez, Carl Everett, Ramiro Mendoza, Scott Williamson, Keith Foulke, Jay Gibbons, Jim Leyritz, Daryle Ward and Lance Johnson.

### Rescue from bankruptcy and possible demise [edit]

The Newark Bears, under former owner Marc Berson, filed Chapter 11 bankruptcy on October 24, 2008.<sup>[4]</sup> The team's existence was almost compromised until the Bases Loaded Group, LLC purchased the team, guaranteeing a \$1 million line of credit to the Atlantic League. The Bases Loaded Group consisted of executives from Philadelphia and New Jersey, some hailing from Newark. The primary leader of the group was Tom Cetnar, former General Manager of the Bears in 2001. He served as president and was a member of the ownership group.

### Move to the Can-Am League [edit]

The Newark Bears joined the Canadian American Association of Professional Baseball on October 6, 2010.<sup>[5]</sup> The Bears were one of three teams to join the league for the 2011 season, with the traveling New York Federals and the expansion Rockland Boulders. Newark was originally to be one of three cities to represent New Jersey in the Can-Am League along with Little Falls, home of the New Jersey Jackals, and Augusta, home of the Sussex Skyhawks. The Skyhawks, however, elected to stop operating after the 2010 season.

In 2012, the Newark Bears were purchased by New Jersey chiropractor Dr. Douglas Spiel and his wife, Danielle Dronet.

The Can-Am League announced on November 28, 2013 that the Newark Bears would not operate in 2014, with the remaining 4 teams now a division in the American Association.<sup>[6]</sup> An auction for the team's assets was held on April 26, 2014.<sup>[7]</sup>

## Logos and uniforms [edit]

The Newark Bears went through three phases of logos and uniform colors. When the franchise began, it had a purple, black and white color scheme. In the mid-2000s, the team went to red, black, and white. When the club ceased operations, its colors were navy blue and white. The primary logo consisted of a stylized bear holding a baseball bat superimposed over a depiction of the Newark skyline over a baseball diamond. The "Newark Bears" wordmark was centered at the base of the logo, and included white accents and black outline.

The Bears' uniforms were traditional in design. The home cap was navy blue throughout with a white block "N" centered on the front. The home jerseys were white with traditional navy blue pinstripes. A navy blue, block "N" was prominently

## Rivalries [[edit](#)]

Shortly after the Newark Bears joined the Can-Am League, they announced a formal rivalry with the New Jersey Jackals. Since both teams play in Essex County, New Jersey, they established the County Executives' Cup to formalize this geographical contest. Off the field, the Bears and the Jackals will collaborate in order to strengthen each teams' respective recognition in Essex County, support fund-raising projects for local charities, and coordinate educational programs to benefit area students.<sup>[9]</sup>

## Radio [[edit](#)]

Bears games were aired on WSOU-FM 89.5 from 1999–2003, and again from 2007–2008. Previous announcers for the team include Seton Hall color commentator Dave Popkin, former WNEW-FM disc jockey Jim Monaghan, MLB Network host Víctor Rojas, Somerset Patriots announcer Brian Bender, former New York Islanders broadcaster Jim Cerny, Jason Page, Ray Alexander, and Erie Otters broadcaster Paul Roper. In 2009, longtime New York sportscaster Spencer Ross served as both radio broadcaster and team on-field MC.

## Mascots [[edit](#)]

The Newark Bears' official mascots were anthropomorphic bears named Ruppert and Effa. They wore the team's home jersey and cap. Ruppert was named after Jacob Ruppert, who owned the former Newark Bears team in the 1930s. Effa alludes to Effa Manley, the first woman to own and operate a professional baseball team (the Newark Eagles) and the only female member of the National Baseball Hall of Fame.<sup>[10]</sup>

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

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


