On February 18, 2004, the parties filed applicant's proposed amendment to its application Serial No.75341906, with opposer's consent, and opposer's withdrawal without prejudice of the opposition, contingent upon entry of the amendment.

By the proposed amendment applicant seeks to change the identification of goods in Class 16 **from** " books, booklets, magazines, newspapers, catalogues, pamphlets, brochures, newsletters and news sheets, all relating to or featuring radio and television entertainment and education, featuring sports, leisure, science and technology, motoring, religion, music, news, comedy, documentaries, law, crime, cartoons, animation, games, quizzes, cookery, drama, nature, gardening, politics, arts, culture, and preschool, primary, secondary, trade, college, university and post graduate education for children, students and adults; stationery; book-bindings; artists' materials, namely paint brushes and painting sets;

printed instructional, educational and teaching materials relating to or featuring radio and television programmes, in the fields of language teaching, mathematics, history, geography, technology, science, music and the arts; writing instruments; pens, pencils, crayons; erasers; drafting and drawing rulers; pencil sharpeners; pencil boxes and cases; pencil holders; posters; mounted and unmounted photographs; photograph albums; notebooks; ring binders; folders; notepads; diaries; calendars; postcards; greeting cards; mounted and unmounted graphic drawings; stickers; iron-on and plastic transfers; stencils; ordinary playing cards; blank paper tapes and cards for the recording of computer programs; and parts for all the aforesaid goods " to " books, booklets, magazines, newspapers, catalogues, pamphlets, brochures, newsletters and news sheets, all relating to or featuring radio and television entertainment and education, featuring sports, leisure, science and technology, motoring, religion, music, news, comedy, documentaries, law, crime, cartoons, animation, games, quizzes, cookery, drama, nature, gardening, politics, arts, culture, and preschool, primary, secondary, trade, college, university and post graduate education for children, students and adults; stationery; book-bindings; artists' materials, namely paint brushes and painting sets; printed instructional, educational and teaching materials relating to or featuring radio and television programmes, in the fields of language teaching, mathematics, history, geography, technology, science, music and the arts; writing instruments; pens,

pencils, crayons; erasers; drafting and drawing rulers; pencil sharpeners; pencil boxes and cases; pencil holders; posters; mounted and unmounted photographs; photograph albums; notebooks; ring binders; folders; notepads; diaries; calendars; postcards; greeting cards; mounted and unmounted graphic drawings; stickers; iron-on and plastic transfers; stencils; blank paper tapes and cards for the recording of computer programs; and parts for all the aforesaid goods" and the identification of goods in Class 28 **from** "games, namely, board games, card games, ring games, parlor games, chess games, role- playing games; toys and playthings, namely, chess boards, marbles for games, toy mobiles, toy pistols, dice for games, play balloons, balls for games, toy building blocks, soft sculpture plush toys, dolls, dolls houses, dominoes, bubble making wand and solution sets, puppets, marionettes, spinning top toys, toy costume masks, toy vehicles, model vehicles, infant toys, inflatable toys, ride-on toys, water squirting toys, kites; gymnastic and sporting articles, namely, baseball gloves, handball gloves, golf gloves, golf bags, cricket bags, golf clubs, skateboards, roller skates, machines for physical exercise, namely, powered tread mills for running, exercise machines and weight lifting benches; baseball bats, cricket bats, tennis and squash rackets; christmas tree ornaments and decorations except confectionery and illumination articles; practical jokes and novelties, namely, hand buzzers and whoopee cushions; coin-operated video games, arcade games, and hand held units for playing games "

to " games, namely, board games, ring games, parlor games, chess games, role- playing games; toys and playthings, namely, chess boards, marbles for games, toy mobiles, toy pistols, dice for games, play balloons, balls for games, toy building blocks, soft sculpture plush toys, dolls, dolls houses, dominoes, bubble making wand and solution sets, puppets, marionettes, spinning top toys, toy costume masks, toy vehicles, model vehicles, infant toys, inflatable toys, ride-on toys, water squirting toys, kites; gymnastic and sporting articles, namely, baseball gloves, handball gloves, golf gloves, golf bags, cricket bags, golf clubs, skateboards, roller skates, machines for physical exercise, namely, powered tread mills for running, exercise machines and weight lifting benches; baseball bats, cricket bats, tennis and squash rackets; christmas tree ornaments and decorations except confectionery and illumination articles; practical jokes and novelties, namely, hand buzzers and whoopee cushions; coin-operated video games, arcade games, and hand held units for playing games."

Inasmuch as the amendment is clearly limiting in nature as required by Trademark Rule 2.71(b), and because opposer consents thereto, it is approved and entered. See Trademark Rule 2.133(a).

The contingency in opposer's withdrawal having now been met, the opposition is dismissed without prejudice.
