Applicant's consented motion (filed May 2, 2016) to further suspend this proceeding for an additional 60-days to accommodate the parties' continued settlement discussions is granted for good cause shown.

Accordingly, proceedings are suspended up to, and including July 1, 2016, subject to the right of either party to request resumption at any time. *See* Trademark Rules 2.117(c), and 2.127(a); and TBMP § 605.02.

In the event that there is no word from either party concerning the progress of their negotiations, upon conclusion of the suspension period, proceedings shall resume July 2, 2016 without further notice or order from the Board, upon the schedule set forth below.

Applicant is allowed until July 31, 2016 in which to answer the notice of opposition.<sup>1</sup> Conferencing, disclosure, discovery and trial dates are reset as follows:

In each instance, a copy of the transcript of testimony together with copies of documentary exhibits, must be served on the adverse party within thirty days after completion of the taking of testimony. Trademark Rule 2.125.

Briefs shall be filed in accordance with Trademark Rules 2.128(a) and (b). An oral hearing will be set only upon request filed as provided by Trademark Rule 2.129.

If, during the suspension period, either of the parties or their attorneys should have a change of address, the Board should be so informed.

As a final matter, the parties are reminded of their continuing obligation to provide a detailed progress report with all future extension and suspension requests filed with the Board. Absent such a report, any future motion to extend or suspend may be denied, even if agreed to by the parties.<sup>2</sup>
