#### **NOTICE OF OPPOSITION**

Energizer Brands, LLC, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Delaware, with an office at 533 Maryville University Drive, St. Louis, Missouri 63141 ("Opposer"), believes it will be damaged by registration of the marks BATTERISER and BATTERISE as shown in Application Serial Nos. 86/571,275 and 86/571,464 respectively, and hereby opposes its registration pursuant to 15 U.S.C. §§ 1051 *et seq.*, including specifically 15 U.S.C. § 1063.

This Notice of Opposition has been timely filed following an extension of time to oppose granted by the Trademark Trial & Appeal Board (the "TTAB") on September 11, 2015. As grounds for its opposition, Opposer alleges as follows:

Serial Nos. 86/571,275, 86/571,464 Marks: BATTERISER, BATTERISE

- 1. Upon information and belief, applicant Batteroo, Inc., is a corporation organized under the laws of Delaware, and with a mailing address of 310 De Guigne Drive, Sunnyvale, California 94085 ("Applicant").
- 2. As evidenced in Application Serial Nos. 86/571,275 and 86/571,464, Applicant seeks to register the marks BATTERISER and BATTERISE, both in connection with "[a] sleeve to be used with disposable batteries to extract stored energy and extend battery life" in International Class 009 (the "Applied-For Marks").

#### **Opposer's Prior Rights**

3. Opposer, through its predecessors in interest and affiliates, has used in commerce its family of famous and distinctive ENERGIZER marks since at least 1955. Over the years, the marks have been used on and in connection with a wide range of goods, primarily relating to batteries. Opposer owns numerous federal trademark registrations for its ENERGIZER marks as reflected in the following representative registrations ("Opposer's Marks"):

4. True and correct copies of the electronic records for these registrations printed from the United States Patent and Trademark Office's ("USPTO") Trademark Applications and Registrations Retrieval ("TARR") online database are attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>. Each of the

registrations noted above were issued on the Principal Register and are presently in full force and effect. Notably, many of these registrations are incontestable.

- 5. Opposer's Marks are valid and distinctive.
- 6. Opposer has expended and continues to expend substantial time, money and effort in advertising and promoting Opposer's Marks to identify itself as the source of its goods and services, such as in newspapers, magazines, sponsorships, and through nationally broadcast television commercials. As a result, consumers have come to recognize "ENERGIZER" as symbolizing the goodwill inherent in Opposer's Marks, and further, associate ENERGIZER solely with Opposer and its line of high quality batteries, battery chargers, and other goods.
- 7. No issue of priority exists with respect to first use of Opposer's Marks and the Applied-For Marks. Opposer has used, promoted and advertised its goods and services under Opposer's Marks in commerce for 60 years, since at least as early as 1955, while Applicant alleges only an intent to use the BATTERISER and BATTERISE marks in commerce. Thus, Opposer has priority over Applicant with respect to the Applied-For Marks.

# <u>Likelihood Of Confusion Between Opposer's Senior Family Of Marks</u> <u>And Applicant's Applied-For Marks</u>

8. The Applied-For Marks are confusingly similar to Opposer's family of marks because they are similar in appearance, sound and commercial impression, pursuant to 15 U.S.C. § 1052(d). The similarities between the marks create a likelihood of consumer confusion. Specifically, consumers are likely to believe, incorrectly, that the Applied-For Marks are an extension of Opposer's family of marks. The likelihood of confusion between the Applied-For Marks and Opposer's family of marks is further exacerbated by the close relation or overlap of the goods identified in the application for the Applied-For Mark, namely "[a] sleeve to be used with disposable batteries to extract stored energy and extend battery life," and the products sold

under Opposer's family of marks.

- 9. Given the goodwill and public recognition arising from the association of Opposer's Mark with Opposer, consumers are likely to believe that Opposer has licensed, approved or otherwise authorized Applicant's use of the Applied-For Marks when it has not.
- 10. Registration of the Applied-For Marks will cause a likelihood of confusion, mistake or deception with respect to the source or origin of Applicant's goods. Consumers will erroneously believe that Applicant's goods are produced by or otherwise associated with Opposer.

# <u>Applicant's Applied-For Marks Create A Likelihood Of Dilution Of Opposer's Senior Family Of Marks</u>

11. Opposer's ENERGIZER mark is widely recognized by the general consuming public of the United States as a designation of source of the goods or services of the Opposer, and therefore, is famous under 15 U.S.C. § 1125(c). Indeed, the fame of ENERGIZER is well established, and Applicant's use and registration of the Applied-For Marks will cause dilution by tarnishment and/or dilution by blurring. Therefore, any future use of the Applied-For Mark by Applicant is prohibited by 15 U.S.C. § 1125(c).

#### The Applied-For Marks Are Deceptive Or Alternatively Deceptively Mis-Descriptive.

- 12. The Applied-For Mark are deceptive because they bestow upon the product identified by Applied-For Marks an appearance of greater quality or salability than it has in fact.
- 13. It is undisputed that BATTERISER and BATTERISE are merely composite marks created from the words "battery" and "riser." *See* Letter from Pardees Parvin, in house counsel, Bateroo, Inc., to John Gary Maynard, Partner, Hunton & Williams LLC (Oct. 23, 2015) ("We chose Batteriser name because the combination of the words 'battery' and 'riser' . . . .")

(Attached as Exhibit B); *see also* BATTERISER, Prosecution History, Notice of Pseudo Mark (April 1, 2015) (creating the pseudo mark "BATTERY RISER").

- 14. Upon information and belief, the product identified by Applied-For Marks, however, does not actually raise or increase the stored energy of the battery. Instead, as indicated in Applicant's recitation of goods, the identified product merely provides access to existing stored energy found within the battery, i.e., "sleeve to be used with disposable batteries to *extract stored energy* and extend battery life." (Emphasis added).
- 15. This deception is material because it relates to a character, quality or function of the identified product and because prospective purchasers are likely to believe that the deception actually describes the product.
- 16. Accordingly, Applicant's Applied-For Marks are deceptive, and as a result, unregistrable under 15 U.S.C. §1052(a).
- 17. Alternatively, the Applied-For Marks are deceptively mis-descriptive because they misrepresent a quality, character or function of the identified product and consumers are likely to believe the mis-description. Thus, Applicant's Applied-For Marks are deceptively mis-descriptive, and as a result, unregistrable under 10 U.S.C. § 1052(e) as Applicant has not and cannot demonstrate any acquired distinctiveness that would overcome the deceptively mis-descriptive nature of the Applied for Marks.

#### The Applied-For Marks Are Merely Descriptive

- 18. Regardless of whether the Applied-for Marks are deceptive or deceptively misdescriptive, they are merely descriptive. Under 15 U.S.C. § 1052(e), such marks are unregistrable.
  - 19. Applicant's own counsel acknowledges that the Applied-For Marks, are "accurate

and memorable shorthand to *describe* our technology." Exhibit B at 2 (emphasis added). More

specifically, according to Batteroo, the battery sleeves to be sold under the Applied-for Marks,

allegedly "...cause[] the voltage of a *battery* to *rise* to around 1.5 volts." *Id.* (emphasis added).

As a result, BATTERISE and BATTERISER merely describe the identified goods.

20. Applicant has not and cannot demonstrate any acquired distinctiveness that would

overcome the descriptive nature of the Applied for Marks.

21. For the reasons set forth above, registration of the Applied-For Marks would be

improper and unauthorized in view of the requirements of the Trademark Act of 1946, as

amended, including specifically but not limited to, the provisions of 15 U.S.C. §§ 1051, et seq.

WHEREFORE, Opposer prays that this Opposition be sustained, and that registration to

Applicant for the marks BATTERISER and BATTERISE as shown in Application Serial Nos.

86/571,275 and 86/571,464 respectively, for the goods identified in International Class 009 be

denied.

Opposer submits this Notice of Opposition via the e-filing procedure of the Trademark

Trial and Appeal Board ("the Board"), and hereby advises the Board that it may debit the

Deposit Account No. 083436 of Hunton & Williams LLP for the appropriate filing fee.



Dear Mr. Maynard,

I am the in house counsel for Batteroo and am representing Batteroo in its trademark matters. Batteroo is a new startup with an innovative product called Batteriser. Batteriser is a thin metal sleeve that taps into the existing energy remaining in a battery to extend its life. Batteriser is the only battery life extender of its kind, with no competitors producing anything similar. Precisely because this is such a novel and unprecedented product, we do not believe our mark would cause consumers to confuse us with Energizer.

On June 1, 2015, we had our first major press release, with a debut in PC World, followed by a flood of press coverage in many other publications, including CNN and yahoo. In all this coverage, it was made clear that we are a company that stands apart from battery companies. We were described as a disruptive new technology with the potential to improve the way consumers use batteries, thereby changing the course of the battery industry entirely. Unlike Energizer, we are not in the business of selling batteries.

Our feedback from consumers since our June 1 press release indicates to us that there is no actual confusion in the marketplace about our status as a new an independent company. No one believes we are affiliated with any battery companies. Of the thousands of e-mails we've received about our product since then, no one has inquired about Batteriser's relationship with Energizer. In August, we also began our first pre-sale on Indiegogo, with over 7,000 customers in 2 months. We had many questions about our product from customers, but again, none of these consumers indicated that they believed Batteriser was affiliated with Energizer. This tell us that Energizer's concern over our mark is ill-advised, and doesn't into consideration actual consumer reactions and responses to the Batteriser name.

There is no potential for confusion between the Energizer and Batteriser because the two marks are very distinct. The Batteriser mark is completely different in its spelling



and sound. The only commonality in the Batteriser and Energizer names is that both have an "er" suffix. It would be absurd for Energizer to make a claim of infringement on this basis. The er suffix is a very common one in the English language, and Energizer has no exclusive right to it. It is also perfectly clear to everyone that the Batteriser mark does not include the word "Energize" in any form.

We chose Batteriser name because the combination of the words "battery" and "riser" provided us with an accurate and memorable shorthand to describe our technology. Essentially, Batteriser causes the voltage of a battery to rise to around 1.5 volts, for optimum performance. This was the basis for our choice of the Batteriser mark, and it has become essential to our marketing. We have already spent substantial funds and effort in publicizing our product under the Batteriser name. Many consumers are anticipating the arrival of our product this holiday season and they all know our product name as Batteriser.

We understand that Energizer needs to protect its mark, and that Energizer has worked hard to build their brand and reputation. However, we see absolutely no potential for confusion between our trademarks. We are not infringing upon the Energizer mark in any way. We respectfully will not comply with Energizer's demands to withdraw our trademark application. We thank Energizer reaching out to us personally to resolve this matter, and we welcome future communication for any additional clarifications.
