On April 26, 2007, respondent filed a proposed amendment to its Registration No. 2516176, with petitioner's consent.

By the proposed amendment respondent seeks to change the identification of goods in International Class 7 from "power operated abrasive wheels and abrasive disks" to "power operated bonded abrasive inserted nut disc and cylinder wheels for face grinding" in International Class 7.

Inasmuch as the amendment complies with all of the procedural requirements of Trademark Rule 2.173, it is clearly limiting in nature, and petitioner consents thereto, it is approved. See Trademark Rule 2.133(a).

The amendment will be forwarded to the Post Registration Branch of this Office for appropriate action in accordance with Section 7(e) of the Trademark Act.

If this resolves the dispute herein, petitioner is allowed until thirty days from the mailing date of this order to file a withdrawal of the petition to cancel, failing which the petition to cancel will go forward on the registration as amended. See Trademark Rule 2.114(c).

NEWS FROM THE TTAB:

The USPTO published a notice of final rulemaking in the Federal Register on August 1, 2007, at 72 F.R. 42242. By this notice, various rules governing Trademark Trial and Appeal Board inter partes proceedings are amended. Certain amendments have an effective date of August 31, 2007, while most have an effective date of November 1, 2007. By one rule change effective August 31, 2007, the Board's standard protective order is made applicable to all TTAB inter partes cases, whether already pending or commenced on or after that date. However, as explained in the final rule and chart, this change will not affect any case in which any protective order has already been approved or imposed by the Board. Further, as explained in the final rule, parties are free to agree to a substitute protective order or to supplement or amend the standard order even after August 31, 2007, subject to Board approval.
