Dear Mr. Margulies,

As we discussed, I have reviewed the possibility of settlement of this issue with my client, United States identification card, Inc. ("USID"). USID is interested in amicably playing this matter to rest. To that end, we are making the following proposal to Conair.

The first option is assignment of the trademark "USA ID" to Conair for \$50,000.

Second option is assignment of the trademark "USA ID," and software related to the product for \$75,000. We believe that the software has features that do not currently exist in your current software, and which would make your product more attractive. The software uses ID cards which are equipped with a smart chip which contains a high-resolution color photo of the cardholder. When swiped, or cardholder's color photo is displayed on monitor screen. The software displays the cardholder's personal and identity information a monitor screen along with the color photo. The cardholder's information is password accessed from a global database. We believe this option provides greater value for Conair than the trademark by itself.

Either of these options will allow Conair to achieve their goals with certainty, and without further delay. After you have had time to review this proposal, please contact me at your earliest convenience to discuss this matter, and to answer any questions you may have.
