Petitioner, MISSIONTREK LTD. CO., a Texas limited liability company of 813 Palm Desert Drive, Garland, TX 75044, believes that it will be damaged by Registration No. 290498, and hereby petitions to cancel the same.

Description of Respondent's Registration: Filed on September 5, 2003. Registered on November 23, 2004. Mark: ONFOLIO in class 9 for computer software for capturing, organizing and sharing online content; claiming first use and first use in commerce on December 4, 2003.

As grounds of cancellation, it is alleged that:

I

Petitioner is the owner of U.S. Trademark Registration No. 2,756,245, for the mark CARTAGIO on computer software, namely internet navigation software, that is, internet browsers; computer hardware in the nature of database and computer management equipment;

internet research and cost accounting software; software for hosting computer servers, and user manual sold as a unit, in class 9 (U.S. CLS. 21, 23, 26, 36 and 38) which was registered on the Principal Register on August 26, 2003. Said registration was based on an application filed in the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office on September 12, 2002, which is a date prior to the date of filing of Respondent's application (and prior to the date of Respondent's claimed date of first use). Said registered mark of Petitioner, a copy of the certification of which is attached as Exhibit A) is valid and subsisting and is prima facie evidence of Petitioner's exclusive right to use said mark in commerce on the goods and services specified in said registration. ONFOLIO, the mark Respondent has registered, is similar to CARTAGIO, the mark owned by Petitioner in several respects. First of all, the visual aspect of those two words is the same. They have a similar appearance in that they both begin with round letters (C and O), and end in "IO" and have the same number of letters. Furthermore, regarding the sound of ONFOLIO and CARTAGIO when spoken, the number of syllables is identical, as well as the accent. In addition, not only do the goods both fall into class 9, but the functionality of the products is, in essence, identical. Respondent attaches a listing of common features as Exhibit B, showing an uncanny overlap of functionality of the products. In other words, the Petitioner and Respondent are head-to-head competitors selling near identical products. As further evidence of this fact, Petitioner attaches hereto as Exhibit C a screen print from a page of the site dedide.dr2.net, entitled "Dedide does KM Tools", listing "ONFOLIO" on top, with the notation "*Newcomer? to the scene*" followed by a listing of "CARTAGIO", with the notation "*Browser research tool. Well established product*". (from the site: "[dedide does reviews of km tools for teachers](http://dedide.dr2.net), ...desktop applications and webservices which help teachers and trainers to manage the information they need in their jobs and maybe even turn it into knowledge. [They] provide reviews or commentary on what ever has come [their] way recently"). In view of the similarity of the respective marks and the related nature of the goods and services of the respective parties, it is alleged that Respondent's mark so resembles Petitioner's registered mark, as to be likely to cause confusion, or to cause mistake, or to deceive.

II

Petitioner, since at least September 15, 2001, has been and is now, using the mark CARTAGIO in connection with the sale of computer software, namely internet navigation software, that is, internet browsers; computer hardware in the nature of database and computer

management equipment; internet research and cost accounting software; software for hosting computer servers, and user manual sold as a unit. Said use has been valid and continuous since said date of first use and has not been abandoned. Said mark CARTAGIO of Petitioner is symbolic of extensive good will and consumer recognition built up by advertising and promotion. In view of the similarity of the respective marks and the related nature of goods and services of the respective parties, it is alleged that Respondent's mark so resembles Petitioner's mark CARTAGIO previously used in the United States, and not abandoned, as to be likely to cause confusion, or to cause mistake, or to deceive.

III

Petitioner will be damaged by the mark, in particular, considering the wide distribution of Respondent's product, now being carried by Microsoft Corporation, as part of their "Partner Pack" (see Exhibit D). Further, due to the direct competition and feature overlap, Petitioner is not likely to sustain its product sales price which are of a range starting from \$75 to \$375 (more for server application) compared to the current pricing of Respondent which is in the range of \$29.95 to \$99.95.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays that said Registration No. 2904982 be cancelled, that no such registration be registered to Respondent, and that this petition for Cancellation be sustained in favor of Petitioner.







"When we were designing Onfolio in the summer of 2002, we knew we wanted to create an Internet research tool integrated into Microsoft

Internet Explorer," says Fraque. "The traditional way of developing this would have been to use unmanaged code. If we had decided on unmanaged code, we would have had to hire rather expensive experienced C/C++ developers, and we would have had to plan for long hours eliminating memory leaks and fixing other low-level defects.

"By doing our development in C# and the [Microsoft] .NET Framework, we avoided most of the bugs that come with unmanaged code, and freed our developers to focus on how the product features work and how the user interface looks and feels. At the same time, we allowed ourselves to draw from a larger pool of developers. We were able to hire user interface engineers with Java experience as well as C++ developers. The developers with Java and C++ backgrounds were all able to pick up C# quickly."

The Onfolio application was conceived by the company founder. A small team of engineers with the assistance of a user interface designer created the software.






The detailed design is a detailed document with a large number of the product capabilities. The design is refined through the development and testing process.

Onfolio integrated its UI application with Internet Explorer using a combination of Component Object Model (COM) Interop to encapsulate the exposed object model of Internet Explorer and .NET runtime interfaces implemented by Microsoft for the Win32 model. Onfolio built its own managed extension even to talk to Internet Explorer, and then it put that front its user interface. Once they wanted the interface to Internet Explorer in one place, and moved that only one developer had to worry about Internet Explorer's idiosyncrasies.

Benefits

Performance is obvious with managed code, according to Truque, but not necessarily where you'd expect. "Keep your eye on performance from the beginning," Truque advises. "A lot of situations about what will perform well in a managed environment may turn out to be an anti."



For example, the runtime performance of the .NET Framework is, like, according to Truque, but startup times have been an issue. Internet Explorer has to start up the .NET Framework, the runtime has to JIT-compile the application code, and only then can the application itself even initialize. In Version 2.0 of Onfolio, currently in beta test, the developers have used the Native Image Generator (NGEN) utility provided by Microsoft to pre-compile the code at install time, to reduce the startup overhead and increase performance.

Native developers mentioned the .NET Framework was another case. Double-check performance time looking common language runtime (CLR) prerequisite detection and installation problems, and supporting multiple versions of the framework.

According to Truque, the combination of the larger download, larger memory footprint, and slower start performance may be the use of the .NET Framework installed by the perception that that's not a home desktop.

Onfolio completed Version 1.0 of its flagship product in 12 months with 5 developers working in C# using the .NET Framework. "I can't even estimate how much longer it would have taken in unmanaged code," says Truque. "Not only would we have sped some things up, things like memory management, and more time dealing with legal things, but would have had fewer developers, with less skill of designing user interfaces."

"We're a lot of fun coming from the framework class domain. We're very happy with how things turned out in a cooperative effort."
