

Sophomore David Pendleton is "Mission Control" when it comes to working all the ways he can build his career while a student at CSU. *ENGAGE.* caught up with him as he dashed off to class, searched for a third internship and clocked in at his on-campus job.



WE HEAR YOU LANDED A PRETTY COOL INTERNSHIP.

I interned at NASA, where I worked with electrical and mechanical engineers. My major is now electrical engineering; the internship really opened my eyes to the opportunities available.

WHAT WAS IT LIKE?

Just knowing I'm in a place where they put a man on the moon was awesome. My mentors prepared me for two presentations I had to give about NASA's Synchronous Reluctance Bearingless Motor – to the people who worked on it! It's an electric battery. Spin it one way and it charges, spin the other way and it emits energy. Pretty amazing.

Through CSU's LINK Program, I also interned for a week at Karpinski Engineering, which was building Euclid Commons.

HOW DOES YOUR ON-CAMPUS JOB HELP YOU?

I work at the Career Services Center, and we've been very busy. I assist the career coordinators who help students with job and internship applications, resumes, and answers to interview questions. My career advisor urged me to apply for the NASA internship.

FAVORITE THING ABOUT CSU?

It's a personal feeling – my teachers know me and I do not feel like a percentage or statistic. CSU really promotes internships, tutoring and the SI's (Supplemental Instruction Sessions through the Tutoring Center).

SINCE BOTH PARENTS ARE CSU GRADS, DID YOU HAVE A CHOICE?

I was told since I was a baby that I was coming here (laughs). I also applied to Ohio State, Eastern Michigan and Kent State, but chose CSU. My mom just earned her master's in education here. We went to school together! My dad is Hersey Strong, power forward on CSU's legendary 1986 NCAA Championship Tournament Sweet 16 basketball team. I have his ring!



WHAT ELSE KEEPS YOU BUSY?

SCHOOL OF NURSING



The School of Nursing at Cleveland State University (CSU) offers undergraduate and graduate programs in professional nursing leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) and a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree. The undergraduate program is approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing, and all programs are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education.

Graduates of the BSN programs are eligible to apply to take the NCLEX-RN® licensing examination. The Ohio Board of Nursing has set a benchmark pass rate standard of 95% of the national average. CSU graduate pass rates continually exceed Ohio's benchmark.

The purpose of the undergraduate program is to prepare professional nurses

committed to the health and well-being of all people. CSU BSN graduates deliver nursing care to people of all ages in hospitals and healthcare agencies throughout northeastern Ohio. Many continue their education in graduate programs.

The School of Nursing is fortunate to have a state-of-the-art nursing resource laboratory (NRL), which is housed in seven individual rooms. The NRL is an integral part of our curriculum. In the lab, students are able to safely learn and practice complex skills in preparation for performing them with real patients. Full time staff members guide students, verify learned competencies, and are available six days a week for questions, practice, and guidance with learning skills.

An array of unique engaged learning opportunities are available within the School of Nursing. Students have access to first class resources including academic advising, nursing scholarships, small class sizes and our award winning faculty. Students are also able to gain real world

experience through internships with world-class health care organizations like the Cleveland Clinic, University Hospitals, MetroHealth and more!

BASIC BSN TRACK - This program is six semesters in length and requires three years to complete, not including summer sessions. Students are admitted as sophomores. A cohort of 80 students is admitted each fall. Students in this program are primarily recent high school graduates or those without significant college course work. Students take both nursing courses and their general education university requirements.
