STIPULATED MOTION FOR EXTENSION

Petitioner Luxco, Inc. (“Luxco”) and Registrant Opici IP Holdings, LLC (“Registrant” or “Opici”), by and through their undersigned counsel, hereby respond to the Board’s Order of March 7, 2016 [Dkt. 36], stipulate and request that the Board suspend all remaining periods in this matter by sixty (60) days in order to effectuate agreement and execution of final settlement papers. In support of this Motion, the parties state as follows:

1. Pursuant to the Board’s Order previously entered on March 7, 2016, the Board previously suspended this matter up to, and including May 16, 2016, pursuant to the parties prior request to suspend for settlement negotiations. (*See* Order [Dkt. 36], p. 1.)
2. In its Order, the Board stated that in the event that further extensions or suspensions are requested, that the parties will be expected to provide a report on the progress of their settlement talks. *See* Order [Dkt. 36], p. 2.
3. In making diligent efforts to move this case toward resolution, the parties have in the months that followed the Board’s prior Order undertaken significant discussions regarding

settlement of this matter and are, as a result of said discussions, settled in principal. The parties are presently in the process of exchanging final drafts of settlement documents.

4. As further evidence of good cause, Luxco has communicated with Registrant's counsel and is informed that Registrant does not object to this request to suspend all remaining deadlines by sixty (60) days.

5. The parties further state that the present stipulated request is not intended to create unreasonable delay in moving this matter forward, but rather to ensure that neither party is prejudiced in the unlikely event that final agreement on language in the settlement documents being presently review cannot be reached. The parties do not anticipate any further need to suspend or extend this matter further following the present request.

WHEREFORE, for good cause shown, the parties request that the Board grant this stipulated request and suspend this matter for sixty (60) days to allow the parties to effectuate execution of settlement documents.
