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

S-Biners are much lighter than conventional carabiners and have two attachment points, which really comes in handy when you need to quickly attach and detach things. When I stumbled on these at Fry's recently, I picked them up right away. I'm a product design engineer so whenever I see a simple elegant design, I just have to get it. I now use a #2 for my backpack and a #1 for my keychain. I like to clip just my motorcycle key to my jacket, so I don't have to root through my pockets, and I also like to separate my car key when I take it in for service. The two attachment points really makes this easier. On a recent bike camping trip, we also used them in a pinch to hold my friends' panniers in place. In addition to various sizes, S-Biners even come in a variety of colors. Just don't use 'em for climbing.

I've tried these, and failed to see how they are any big advantage over a plain vanilla carabiner. The "2 clipping points" feature was worthless for me.

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

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



KING CAGE


A former racer and bike-factory employee, Ron Andrews filled a request for a titanium water-bottle holder and made one by hand. "Seventeen years later, I'm still doing it," Andrews said.

He relocated from Boston to Durango in 1992 to work for Yeti Cycles, his "night job" making his King Cages in his garage.

"Aluminum cages end up bending open," Andrews said. "And they mark up your bottles." Neither scenario happens with his titanium — and more affordable stainless steel — King Cages.

"I've got customers who have gone through three or four bikes and the only thing they keep is the cage," Andrews said.



KIDZ TANDEMS

In 2004, Chris Brown, owner of Grand Junction bicycle retailer Brown Cycles, built a special tandem for riding with his own three children.

"I wanted to go on a real ride, not a fake ride," he said. "If you put them in a trailer, they just fall asleep."

Stemming from his love of building replicas of antique bicycles — he has a museum at the shop — Brown's personal bike became the prototype for the 24-speed Kidz Tandem, featuring a kid-sized front bike with real pedals and an interchangeable seat for kids aged zero to 8. Since the Kidz Tandem made its trade-show debut in 2005, Brown has sold hundreds of the bikes and continues to ride his own with his kids on the front.
