Petitioner's stipulated motion¹ (filed² February 10, 2015) to suspend proceedings pending consideration of a consent agreement between the parties by the Examining Attorney of petitioner's pleaded application Serial No. 86289480 is granted. Accordingly, proceedings are suspended.

Within fifteen days after the final determination of the agreement by the Examining Attorney of application Serial No. 86289480, petitioner must

notify the Board so that this case may be called up for appropriate action (including resetting respondent's time to answer, if appropriate).

It does not appear that petitioner has filed the consent agreement with the Examining Attorney. If petitioner has not already done so, petitioner must immediately make an appropriate submission in the application file for its pleaded application, submitting the consent agreement therewith to the Examining Attorney.
