Internationale Vereniging Trappist (also known as the "International Trappist Association") ("Petitioner"), an international association established in accordance with the laws of Belgium, by its attorneys, Scot A. Duvall and the law firm of Middleton Reutlinger, 2500 Brown & Williamson Tower, Louisville, Kentucky 40202, (502) 584-1135, hereby petitions for an extension of time for the Petitioner to file a Notice of

Opposition to the above-identified mark for a period of thirty (30) days from December 25, 2002, to January 24, 2003.

Counsel for Applicant consented to this extension by electronic mail on December 20, 2002. Petitioner believes that it is likely to be damaged by registration of the mark and needs additional time to review the situation. Petitioner states that it has been engaging in efforts to address this situation and that there is good cause for the extension.

This request is not interposed for delay. During the previous extension of time, Petitioner's counsel and Applicant's counsel have corresponded so that the parties might have an opportunity to resolve the matter without opposition proceedings. Petitioner remains hopeful that this matter can be resolved within the next thirty (30) days. Petitioner will continue to evaluate the situation to determine whether an opposition may be necessary.
