REQUEST BY STIPULATION FOR A THIRTY (30) DAY


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The notice dated June 19, 2003, granted Preferred Parking Service's extension request until July 15, 2003, but indicated that no further extensions will be granted in the absence of a detailed explanation reciting what progress the parties have made toward resolving this matter. In this regard, Preferred Parking Service offered to Colonial Parking two settlement options on or about June 5, 2003. Colonial Parking responded to Preferred Parking Service's settlement proposal on June 11, 2003, indicating its interest in pursuing one of the settlement options proposed by Preferred Parking Service. In connection with the subject settlement option, Preferred Parking Service proposed certain material terms to Colonial Parking on July 15, 2003, and further consideration of the settlement terms are actively under discussion among the parties and their attorneys. The parties are seeking to resolve this matter amicably, and the additional extension of time is necessary for the parties to finalize their negotiations and memorialize a mutually acceptable agreement.

The extension of time to oppose was consented to by William D. Breneman, attorney for Applicant, during a telephone conference on July 15, 2003.

This Request for Extension of Time to File a Notice of Opposition is being submitted in triplicate, pursuant to 37 C.F.R. § 2.102(d). Favorable action on this request is respectfully urged.


