Chapter 31 of the <u>Book of Proverbs</u> in the <u>Hebrew Bible</u> is presented as advice which <u>Lemuel's</u> mother gave to him, about how a virtuous king should reign, and also detailing the attributes of a virtuous wife or ideal woman. The second section of text of this chapter directs women to be industrious and to fear the Lord.

The 8th and 9th verses<sup>[1]</sup> are an appeal against inequality and injustice:<sup>[2]</sup>

8 Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute.9 Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy.

The 10th to 31st verses of the chapter are called **Eshet Hayil** (אשת היל, woman of valor). It is a praise of the good wife, a definition of a perfect wife or "ideal woman" in the nation of Israel. This "Woman of Valor" has been described as

the personification of wisdom, or in some sense as a description of a particular class of Women in Israel, Persia, or in Hellenistic society.<sup>[3]</sup> It is one of the thirteen alphabetical acrostic poems in the Bible. Traditionally, the Eisheth Hayil was viewed as written by <u>King Solomon</u> and many prominent theologians continue to hold this belief. However there is a more recent branch of critical scholarship which suggests it was added to Proverbs later.

This chapter is recited on Friday night before <u>Shabbat</u> dinner in some Jewish homes. Some see this as a praise directed from the husband to his wife.

The word  $\forall i$  (*Hayil*) appears in verses 10 and 29 of the passage, thought as the summary of the good woman's character. Traditionally it has been translated "virtuous" or "noble". Some scholars have suggested that it rather means "forceful", "mighty", or "valiant", because this word is almost exclusively used in the <u>Tanakh</u> with reference to <u>warfare</u>.<sup>[4]</sup>

The chapter has been emphasised within the <u>biblical womanhood</u> movement, and a number of books have been published on the "Proverbs 31 woman".<sup>[5][6][7][8][9]</sup> This emphasis has been subject to criticism in Christian articles.<sup>[10][11]</sup>

# The Lost Chapter of the Acts of the Apostles

The *Lost Chapter of the Acts of the Apostles*, also known as the *Sonnini Manuscript*, is a short text purporting to be the translation of a manuscript containing the 29th chapter of the <u>Acts of the Apostles</u>, detailing <u>Paul the Apostle</u>'s journey to <u>Britannia</u>, where he preached to a <u>tribe of Israelites</u> on <u>Ludgate Hill</u>, the site of <u>St Paul's Cathedral</u>.

The canonical book of *Acts* ends rather abruptly with Paul kept under house arrest in chapter 28, which has led to various theories about the history of the text.<sup>[1]</sup>

## History

The text made its first appearance in London in 1871.<sup>[1]</sup> According to the editor, it was translated in the late 18th century by the French <u>naturalist</u> Sonnini de Manoncourt from a "Greek manuscript discovered in the archives at <u>Constantinople</u> and presented to him by the <u>Sultan Abdoul Achmet</u>". It was found hidden in an English translation of Sonnini's *Voyage en Grèce et en Turquie* in the library of Sir John Newport, MP (1756-1843) after the MP's death. However, no trace of any such manuscript has been found, and from internal evidence, mainstream philology considers it to most likely be a fraud, thus it is classed among the modern pseudepigrapha.<sup>[1]</sup>

It is available in a 1982 edition by E. Raymond Capt (<u>ISBN 0-934666-09-1</u>) from Artisan Publishers, Muskogee, which is a publisher specializing in <u>evangelical</u> fringe subjects.

## **Purpose and influence**

The purpose of the book was likely to support <u>Anglo-Israelism</u>. The book has not found attention in recent mainstream publications and is not mentioned on the website of the <u>British-Israel-World Federation</u>. The influence of that movement has declined.

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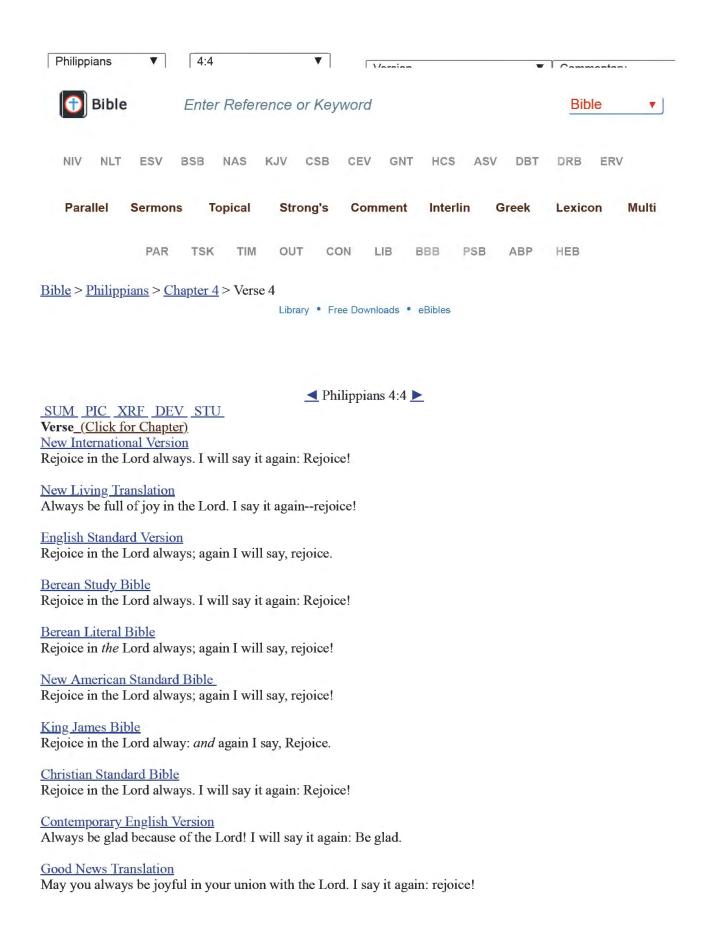

#### Ellicott's Commentary for English Readers

(4-7) St. Paul returns once more to the exhortation to joy so characteristic of this Epistle. But it is a joy in the sense of the Lord's being at hand. Hence it turns at once to thanksgiving and prayer, and finally is calmed and deepened into peace.

(4) Rejoice in the Lord . . . and again I say, Rejoice.--The original word is the word always used in classical Greek (see the corresponding word in Latin) for "farewell" (i.e., "Joy be with you!"), and this verse is obviously a resumption of <u>Philippians 3:1</u>, after the digression of warning. But the emphasis laid on it here, coupled with the constant references to joy in the Epistle, show that St. Paul designed to call attention to its strict meaning, and to enforce, again and again, the Christian duty of joy. It is, of course, a "joy in the Lord:" for only in the Lord is joy possible to any thoughtful mind or feeling heart in such a world as this.

#### Pulpit Commentary

Verse 4. - Rejoice in the Lord alway; and again I say, Rejoice; rather, as R.V., again I will say. St. Paul returns to the key-note of the Epistle, Christian joy. He writes again the same things (see <u>Philippians 2:1</u>); he will say it again, he. never wearies of repeating that holy joy is a chief Christian duty. Rejoice in the Lord; in his presence, in communion with him, and that always; for he who rejoices in the Lord, as Chrysostom says, always rejoices, even in affliction: "Sorrowful, yet always rejoicing" (<u>2 Corinthians 6:10</u>).

#### Matthew Henry Commentary

4:2-9 Let believers be of one mind, and ready to help each other. As the apostle had found the benefit of their assistance, he knew how comfortable it would be to his fellow-labourers to have the help of others. Let us seek to give assurance that our names are written in the book of life. Joy in God is of great consequence in the Christian life; and Christians need to be again and again called to it. It more than outweighs all causes for sorrow. Let their enemies perceive how moderate they were as to outward things, and how composedly they suffered loss and hardships. The day of judgment will soon arrive, with full redemption to believers, and destruction to ungodly men. There is a care of diligence which is our duty, and agrees with a wise forecast and due concern; but there is a care of fear and distrust, which is sin and folly, and only perplexes and distracts the mind. As a remedy against perplexing care, constant praver is recommended. Not only stated times for praver, but in every thing by praver. We must join thanksgivings with prayers and supplications; not only seek supplies of good, but own the mercies we have received. God needs not to be told our wants or desires; he knows them better than we do; but he will have us show that we value the mercy, and feel our dependence on him. The peace of God, the comfortable sense of being reconciled to God, and having a part in his favour, and the hope of the heavenly blessedness, are a greater good than can be fully expressed. This peace will keep our hearts and minds through Christ Jesus; it will keep us from sinning under troubles, and from sinking under them; keep us calm and with inward satisfaction. Believers are to get and to keep a good name; a name for good things with God and good men. We should walk in all the ways of virtue, and abide therein; then, whether our praise is of men or not, it will be of God. The apostle is for an example. His doctrine and life agreed together. The way to have the God of peace with us, is to keep close to our duty. All our privileges and salvation arise in the free mercy of God; yet the enjoyment of them depends on our sincere and holy conduct. These are works of God, pertaining to God, and to him only are they to be ascribed, and to no other, neither men, words, nor deeds.

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## Isaiah

Isaiah<sup>[a]</sup> was the 8th-century BC Jewish prophet for whom the Book of Isaiah is named.<sup>[6][7]</sup>

Within the text of the Book of Isaiah, Isaiah himself is referred to as "the prophet",<sup>[8]</sup> but the exact relationship between the Book of Isaiah and any such historical Isaiah is complicated. The traditional view is that all 66 chapters of the book of Isaiah were written by one man, Isaiah, possibly in two periods between 740 BCE and c. 686 BCE, separated by approximately 15 years, and includes dramatic prophetic declarations of Cyrus the Great in the Bible, acting to restore the nation of Israel from <u>Babylonian captivity</u>. Another widely-held view is that parts of the first half of the book (chapters 1–39) originated with the historical prophet, interspersed with prose commentaries written in the time of King Josiah a hundred years later, and that the remainder of the book dates from immediately before and immediately after the end of the <u>exile in</u> Babylon, almost two centuries after the time of the historic prophet.<sup>[b]</sup>

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### Biography

The first verse of the Book of Isaiah states that Isaiah prophesied during the reigns of <u>Uzziah</u> (or Azariah), <u>Jotham</u>, <u>Ahaz</u>, and <u>Hezekiah</u>, the kings of <u>Judah</u> (<u>Isaiah 1:1 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt1001.htm#1)</u>). Uzziah's reign was 52 years in the middle of the 8th century BCE, and Isaiah must have begun his ministry a few years before Uzziah's death, probably in the <u>740s BCE</u>. Isaiah lived until the fourteenth year of Hezekiah's reign (who died <u>698 BCE</u>). He may have been contemporary for some years with <u>Manasseh</u>. Thus Isaiah may have prophesied for as long as 64 years.<sup>[9]</sup>

According to some modern interpretations, Isaiah's wife was called "the prophetess" (Isaiah 8:3 (http://www.mechon-ma mre.org/p/pt/pt1008.htm#3)), either because she was endowed with the prophetic gift, like Deborah (Judges 4:4 (http:// www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt0704.htm#4)) and Huldah (2 Kings 22:14–20 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/p t09b22.htm#14)), or simply because she was the "wife of the prophet".<sup>[9][10]</sup> They had two sons, naming one Shear-jashub,

meaning "A remnant shall return" (Isaiah 7:3 (http://www.mechon-m amre.org/p/pt/pt1007.htm#3)), and the younger, <u>Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz</u>, meaning, "Spoil quickly, plunder speedily" (Isaiah 8:3 (htt p://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/p t/pt1008.htm#3)).

Soon after this, <u>Shalmaneser V</u> determined to subdue the kingdom of Israel, taking over and destroying <u>Samaria</u> (722 BCE). So long as Ahaz reigned, the kingdom of Judah was untouched by the Assyrian power. But when Hezekiah gained the throne, he was encouraged to rebel "against the king of Assyria" (2 Kings 18:7 (htt

p://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pto9b18.htm#7)), and entered into an alliance with the king of Egypt (Isaiah 30:2-4 (http://www.mechon-mamre.or g/p/pt/pt1030.htm#2)). The king of Assyria threatened the king of Judah, and at length invaded the land. <u>Sennacherib (701 BC)</u> led a powerful army into Judah. Hezekiah was reduced to despair, and submitted to the Assyrians (2 Kings 18:14–16 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pto9b18.htm#14)). But after a brief interval, war broke out again. Again Sennacherib led an army into Judah, one detachment of which threatened Jerusalem (Isaiah 36:2-22 (htt p://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt1036.htm#2); 37:8 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt1037.htm#8)). Isaiah on that occasion encouraged Hezekiah to resist the Assyrians (37:1-7 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt1037.htm#1)), whereupon Sennacherib sent a threatening letter to Hezekiah, which he "spread before the LORD" (37:14 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt1037.htm#14)).<sup>[9]</sup>

Then Isaiah the son of Amoz sent unto Hezekiah, saying: "Thus saith the LORD, the God of Israel: Whereas thou hast prayed to Me against Sennacherib king of Assyria,

this is the word which the LORD hath spoken concerning him: The virgin daughter of Zion hath despised thee and laughed thee to scorn; the daughter of Jerusalem hath shaken her head at thee.

Whom hast thou taunted and blasphemed? And against whom hast thou exalted thy voice? Yea, thou hast lifted up thine eyes on high, even against the Holy One of Israel!" (<u>37:21-23 (http://ww</u> w.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt1037.htm#21))

According to the account in 2 Kings 19 (and its derivative account in 2 Chronicles 32) an angel of God fell on the Assyrian army and 185,000 of its men were killed in one night. "Like Xerxes in Greece, Sennacherib never recovered from the shock of the disaster in Judah. He made no more expeditions against either the Southern Levant or Egypt."<sup>[9][11]</sup>

The remaining years of Hezekiah's reign were peaceful (<u>2 Chr 32:23–29 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt25b32.h</u> <u>tm#23</u>)). Isaiah probably lived to its close, and possibly into the reign of <u>Manasseh</u>. The time and manner of his death are not specified in either the <u>Bible</u> or other primary sources.<sup>[9]</sup> The Talmud [Yevamot 49b] says that he suffered martyrdom by being <u>sawn in two</u> under the orders of Manasseh.<sup>[12]</sup> According to rabbinic literature, Isaiah was the maternal grandfather of Manasseh.<sup>[13]</sup>

Some writers assert that Isaiah was a vegetarian, on the basis of passages in the Book of Isaiah that extol nonviolence and reverence for life, such as Isaiah 1:11, 11:6-9, 65:25, and 66:3. Some of these writers refer to "the vegetarian Isaiah",<sup>[14]</sup> "the notorious vegetarian Isaiah",<sup>[15]</sup> and "Isaiah, the vegetarian prophet".<sup>[16]</sup>

The book of Isaiah, along with the book of Jeremiah, is distinctive in the Hebrew bible for its direct portrayal of the "wrath of the Lord" as presented, for example, in Isaiah 9:19 stating, "Through the wrath of the Lord of hosts is the land darkened, and the people shall be as the fuel of the fire."<sup>[17]</sup>

### In Christianity

The <u>Ascension of Isaiah</u>, a <u>pseudegraphical</u> Christian text dated to sometime between the end of the 1st century to the beginning of the 3rd, gives a detailed story of Isaiah confronting an evil false prophet and ending with Isaiah being <u>martyred</u> – none of which is attested in the original Biblical account.

<u>Gregory of Nyssa</u> (c. 335–395), believed that the Prophet Isaiah "knew more perfectly than all others the mystery of the religion of the Gospel". Jerome (c. 342–420) also lauds the Prophet Isaiah, saying, "He was more of an Evangelist than a Prophet, because he described all of the Mysteries of the Church of Christ so vividly that you would assume he was not prophesying about the future, but rather was composing a history of past events."<sup>[18]</sup> Of specific note are the <u>songs of the Suffering Servant</u>, which Christians say are a direct prophetic revelation of the nature, purpose, and detail of the death of Jesus Christ.

The Book of Isaiah is quoted many times by New Testament writers.<sup>[19]</sup> Ten of those references are about the Suffering Servant, how he will suffer and die to save many from their sins, be buried in a rich man's tomb, and be a light to the Gentiles. The <u>Gospel of John</u> says that Isaiah "saw Jesus' glory and spoke about him."<sup>[20]</sup>

The Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates Saint Isaiah the Prophet on May 9.<sup>[21]</sup>

#### Latter Day Saints

The Book of Mormon quotes Jesus Christ as stating that "great are the words of Isaiah", and that all things prophesied by Isaiah have been and will be fulfilled.<sup>[22]</sup> The Book of Mormon and <u>Doctrine and Covenants</u> also quote Isaiah more than any other prophet from the Old Testament.<sup>[23]</sup> Additionally, members of <u>The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints</u> consider the founding of the church by <u>Joseph Smith</u> in the 19th century to be a fulfillment of Isaiah 11, the translation of the Book of Mormon to be a fulfillment of Isaiah 29,<sup>[24]</sup> and the building of Latter-day Saint temples as a fulfillment of Isaiah 2:2.<sup>[25]</sup>

### In Islam

Although Isaiah, or his Arabic name  $i_{\text{max}}$  (transliterated:  $Ashi'y\bar{a}'$ ), are not mentioned by name in the Qur'an or the Hadith, Muslim sources have accepted him as a prophet.<sup>[26]</sup> Some Muslim scholars, such as Ibn Kathir and Kisa'i, reproduced Jewish traditions regarding Isaiah, which were transmitted through early Jewish converts to Islam. Isaiah is mentioned as a prophet in Ibn Kathir's *Story of Prophet Isaiah*,<sup>[27]</sup> and the modern writers <u>Muhammad Asad</u> and Abdullah Yusuf Ali <sup>[28]</sup> accepted Isaiah as a true Hebrew prophet, who preached to the Israelites following the death of King David. Isaiah is well known in <u>Muslim exegesis</u> and <u>literature</u>, notably for his predictions of the coming of Jesus and <u>Muhammad</u>.<sup>[29]</sup> Isaiah's narrative in <u>Muslim literature</u> can be divided into three sections. The first establishes Isaiah as a prophet of Israel during the reign of <u>Hezekiah</u>; the second relates Isaiah's actions during the siege of <u>Jerusalem</u> by Sennacherib; and the third warns the nation of coming doom.<sup>[30]</sup>

<u>Muslim exegesis</u> preserves a tradition parallel to the <u>Hebrew Bible</u>,<sup>[31]</sup> which states that <u>Hezekiah</u> was king in <u>Jerusalem</u> during Isaiah's time. Hezekiah heard and obeyed Isaiah's advice, but could not quell the turbulence in <u>Israel</u>.<sup>[32]</sup> This tradition maintains that Hezekiah was a righteous man and that the turbulence worsened after him. After the death of the king, Isaiah told the people not to forsake <u>God</u>, and he warned <u>Israel</u> to cease from its persistent sin and disobedience. Muslim tradition maintains that the unrighteous of Israel in their anger sought to kill Isaiah.<sup>[32]</sup> In a death that resembles that attributed to Isaiah in <u>Lives of the Prophets</u>, Muslim exegesis recounts that Isaiah was <u>martyred</u> by Israelites by being sawn in two.<sup>[32]</sup>

In the courts of <u>Al-Ma'mun</u>, the seventh <u>Abbasid</u> caliph, <u>Ali al-Ridha</u>, the great grandson of Muhammad and prominent scholar (<u>Imam</u>) of his era, was questioned by the High Jewish <u>Rabbi</u> to prove the prophethood of both <u>Jesus</u> and <u>Muhammad</u> through the <u>Torah</u>. Among his several proofs, the Imam references the <u>Book of Isaiah</u>, stating "Sha'ya (Isaiah), the Prophet, said in the Torah concerning what you and your companions say: 'I have seen two riders to whom (He) illuminated earth. One of them was on a donkey and the other was on a camel.' Who is the rider of the donkey, and who is the rider of the camel?" to which the Rabbi was unable to answer with certainty. Al-Ridha clarifies that "As for the rider of the donkey, he is 'Isa (Jesus); and as for the rider of the camel, he is Muhammad, may Allah bless him and his family. Do you deny that this (statement) is in the Torah?" to which the Rabbi responds "No, I do not deny it." <sup>[33]</sup>

### In Judaism

According to the <u>rabbinic literature</u>, Isaiah was a descendant of the royal house of <u>Judah</u> and <u>Tamar</u> (<u>Sotah</u> 10b). He was the son of <u>Amoz</u> (not to be confused with Prophet <u>Amos</u>), who was the brother of <u>King Amaziah</u> of Judah. (<u>Talmud</u> tractate <u>Megillah</u> 15a).<sup>[34]</sup>

Various Lists of Parables

You may have noticed that not all lists of parables are the same. Of course they will all include the Good Samaritan, the Sower of Seed, and other passages that are quite clearly parables. However there will be certain parables included on one list that are omitted from another.

Each list maker has slightly different criteria as to what shall be deemed a parable. For example, the tower builder who does not count the cost (Luke 14:28-29) could well be regarded as a parable, but not every list includes it. The same may be said for many brief word pictures which Jesus uttered, and their inclusion or omission from a list of parables is somewhat arbitrary.

It would be arrogant to claim that we will study every parable uttered by Jesus and recorded in scripture, for that would mean having to be dogmatic about whether or not certain sayings of Jesus are parables. So I will claim no more than that our study of the parables will be comprehensive.

The **Parables of Jesus** can be found in the synoptic <u>gospels</u>, in some of the non-canonical gospels, but not in the Gospel of John. They are located mainly within the three <u>Synoptic Gospels</u>. They represent a main part of the <u>teachings of Jesus</u>, forming approximately one third of his recorded teachings. <u>Christians</u> place high emphasis on these <u>parables</u>; since they are the purported words of Jesus, they are believed to be what <u>the Father</u> has taught, indicated by <u>LifeV (http://tools.wmflabs.org/biblever</u> <u>sefinder2/index.php?book=Lifev&verse=-&src=nrsv)</u> and <u>14:10</u> (<u>https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=John%2014:1</u> o-14:10&version=tniv).<sup>[1][2]</sup>

Jesus's parables are seemingly simple and memorable stories, often with imagery, and all convey messages. Scholars have commented that although these parables seem simple, the messages they convey are deep, and central to the teachings of Jesus. Christian authors view them not as mere similitudes which serve the purpose of illustration, but as internal <u>analogies</u> in which nature becomes a witness for the <u>spiritual</u> world.<sup>[3][4]</sup>

Many of Jesus's parables refer to simple everyday things, such as a woman baking bread (parable of the Leaven), a man knocking

on his neighbor's door at night (<u>parable of the Friend at Night</u>), or the aftermath of a roadside <u>mugging</u> (<u>parable of the</u> <u>Good Samaritan</u>); yet they deal with major religious themes, such as the growth of the <u>Kingdom of God</u>, the importance of prayer, and the meaning of love.

In Western civilization, these parables formed the <u>prototype</u> for the term *parable* and in the modern age, even among those who know little of the <u>Bible</u>, the parables of Jesus remain some of the best-known stories in the world.<sup>[5]</sup>

## **Roots and sources**

As a translation of the Hebrew word כָּשֶׁל *mashal*, the word "parable" can also refer to a riddle. In all times in their history the Jews were familiar with teaching by means of <u>parables</u> and a number of parables also exist in the <u>Old Testament</u>.<sup>[6]</sup> The use of parables by Jesus was hence a natural teaching method that fit into the tradition of his time.<sup>[7]</sup> The parables of Jesus have been quoted, taught, and discussed since the very beginnings of Christianity.

## Nature of parables of Christ

Parables are one of the many literary forms in the Bible, but are especially seen in the gospels of the New Testament. Parables are generally considered to be short stories such as the <u>Good Samaritan</u>, and which are differentiated from metaphorical statements such as, "You are the salt of the earth." A true parable may be regarded as an extended simile (Blomberg, C. L., Interpreting the Parables). Although some suggest parables are essentially extended allegories, others emphatically argue the opposite.<sup>[8]</sup> Dr. Kenneth Boa states that "Parables are extended figures of comparison that often use short stories to teach a truth or answer a question. While the story in a parable is not historical, it is true to life, not a fairy tale. As a form of oral literature, the parable exploits realistic situations but makes effective use of the imagination...Some of the parables [of Christ] were designed to reveal mysteries to those on the inside and to conceal the truth to those on the outside who would not hear."<sup>[9]</sup>

## **Canonical gospels**

The three <u>synoptic gospels</u> contain the parables of Jesus. There are a growing number of scholars who also find parables in the <u>Gospel of John</u>, such as the little stories of the <u>Good Shepherd</u> (John 10:1-5) or the childbearing woman (John 16:21).<sup>[10]</sup> Otherwise, John includes <u>allegories</u> but no parables. Several authors such as Barbara Reid, Arland Hultgren or Donald Griggs comment that "parables are noticeably absent from the Gospel of John".<sup>[11][12][13][a]</sup>

William Barry states in the <u>Catholic Encyclopedia</u> (1913) "There are no parables in St. John's Gospel. In the Synoptics ... we reckon thirty-three in all; but some have raised the number even to sixty, by including proverbial expressions".<sup>[14]</sup> The <u>Gospel of Luke</u> contains both the largest total number of parables (24) and eighteen unique parables; the <u>Gospel of Matthew</u> contains 23 parables of which eleven are unique; and the <u>Gospel of Mark</u> contains eight parables of which two are unique.

In *Harmony of the Gospels*, Cox and Easley provide a <u>Gospel harmony</u> for the parables based on the following counts: Only in Matthew: 11, only in Mark: 2, only in Luke: 18, Matthew and Luke: 4, Matthew, Mark and Luke: 6. They list no parables for the Gospel of John.<sup>[16]</sup>

## Other documents

Parables attributed to Jesus are also found in other documents apart from the Bible. Some of these overlap those in the canonical gospels and some are not part of the Bible. The non-canonical <u>Gospel of Thomas</u> contains up to fifteen parables, eleven of which have parallels in the four <u>canonical Gospels</u>. The unknown author of the Gospel of Thomas did not have a special word for "parable," making it difficult to know what he considered a parable.<sup>[17]</sup> Those unique to Thomas include the Parable of the Assassin and the Parable of the Empty Jar.

The noncanonical <u>Apocryphon of James</u> also contains three unique parables attributed to Jesus.<sup>[18]</sup> They are known as "The Parable of the Ear of Grain", "The Parable of the Grain of Wheat", and "The Parable of the Date-Palm Shoot".<sup>[19]</sup>

The hypothetical Q document is seen as a source for some of the parables in Matthew, Luke, and Thomas.<sup>[20]</sup>

## **Purpose and motive**

In the Gospel of Matthew (13:10-17) Jesus provides an answer when asked about his use of parables:<sup>[21]</sup>

The disciples came to him and asked, "Why do you speak to the people in parables?" He replied,

"The knowledge of the secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, but not to them. Whoever has will be given more, and he will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken from him. This is why I speak to them in parables:

Though seeing, they do not see; though hearing, they do not hear or understand."

While Mark 4:33-34 (https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Mark%204:33-4:34&version=tniv) and Matthew 13:34-35 (https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Matthew%2013:34-13:35&version=tniv) may suggest that Jesus would only speak to the "crowds" in parables, while in private explaining everything to his disciples, modern scholars do not support the private explanations argument and surmise that Jesus used parables as a teaching method.<sup>[22]</sup> Dwight Pentecost suggests that given that Jesus often preached to a mixed audience of believers and non-believers, he used parables to reveal the truth to some, but hide it from others.<sup>[1]</sup>

Christian author Ashton Axenden suggests that Jesus constructed his parables based on his divine knowledge of how man can be taught:<sup>[23]</sup>

This was a mode of teaching, which our blessed Lord seemed to take special delight in employing. And we may be quite sure, that as "He knew what was in man" better than we know, He would not have taught by Parables, if He had not felt that this was the kind of teaching best suited to our wants.

In the 19th century, Lisco and <u>Fairbairn</u> stated that in the parables of Jesus, "the image borrowed from the visible world is accompanied by a truth from the invisible (spiritual) world" and that the parables of Jesus are not "mere similitudes which serve the purpose of illustration, but are internal analogies where nature becomes a witness for the spiritual world".<sup>[3]</sup>

Similarly, in the 20th century, calling a parable "an earthly story with a heavenly meaning",<sup>[24]</sup> William Barclay states that the parables of Jesus use familiar examples to lead men's minds towards <u>heavenly</u> concepts. He suggests that Jesus did not form his parables merely as analogies but based on an "inward affinity between the natural and the spiritual order."<sup>[24]</sup>

## Themes

A number of parables which are adjacent in one or more gospels have similar themes. The <u>parable of the Leaven</u> follows the <u>parable of the Mustard Seed</u> in Matthew and Luke, and shares the theme of the <u>Kingdom of Heaven</u> growing from small beginnings.<sup>[25]</sup> The <u>parable of the Hidden Treasure</u> and <u>parable of the Pearl</u> form a pair illustrating the great value of the <u>Kingdom of Heaven</u>, and the need for action in attaining it.<sup>[26]</sup>

The parables of the Lost Sheep, Lost Coin, and Lost (Prodigal) Son form a trio in Luke dealing with loss and redemption.<sup>[27]</sup>

The parable of the Faithful Servant and parable of the Ten Virgins, adjacent in Matthew, involve waiting for a bridegroom, and have an eschatological theme: be prepared for the day of reckoning.<sup>[28]</sup> The parable of the Tares<sup>[29]</sup> the parable of the Barable of the budding fig tree,<sup>[31]</sup> and the parable of the barren fig tree<sup>[32]</sup> also have eschatological themes.

Other parables stand alone, such as the <u>parable of the unforgiving servant</u>, dealing with forgiveness;<sup>[33]</sup> the <u>parable of the</u> <u>Good Samaritan</u>, dealing with practical love;<sup>[34]</sup> and the <u>parable of the Friend at Night</u>, dealing with persistence in prayer.<sup>[35]</sup>

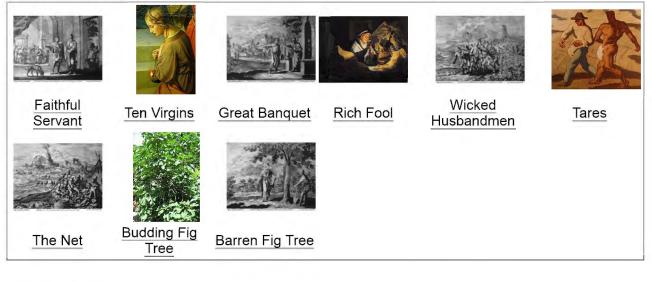

## Art

Of the thirty or so parables in the canonical Gospels, four were shown in medieval art almost to the exclusion of the others, but not mixed in with the narrative scenes of the *Life of Christ*. These were: the <u>Ten Virgins</u>, the <u>Rich man and Lazarus</u>, the <u>Prodigal Son</u> and the <u>Good Samaritan</u>.<sup>[36]</sup> Artists famous for depicting parables include Martin Schongauer, Pieter the Elder Bruegal and Albrecht Dürer. The <u>Workers in the Vineyard</u> also appears in <u>Early Medieval</u> works. From the Renaissance the numbers shown widened slightly, and the various scenes of the Prodigal Son became the clear favorite, with the Good Samaritan also popular. <u>Albrecht Dürer</u> made a famous <u>engraving</u> of the *Prodigal Son* amongst the pigs (1496), a popular subject in the <u>Northern Renaissance</u>, and <u>Rembrandt</u> depicted the story several times, although at least one of his works, <u>The Prodigal Son in the Tavern</u>, a portrait of himself as the Son, revelling with his wife, is like many artists' depictions, a way of dignifying a genre tavern scene. His late <u>The Return of the Prodigal Son</u> (Hermitage Museum, St Petersburg) is one of his most popular works.

## Poetry and hymns

As well as being depicted in art and discussed in prose, a number of parables form the inspiration for religious poetry and <u>hymns</u>. For example, the hymn "The Ninety and Nine" by <u>Elizabeth C.</u> Clephane (1868) is inspired by the parable of the Lost Sheep:

> There were ninety and nine that safely lay In the shelter of the fold. But one was out on the hills away, Far off from the gates of gold. Away on the mountains wild and bare. Away from the tender Shepherd's care.<sup>[37]</sup>

Similarly, "My Hope Is Built" (Edward Mote, c. 1834) is inspired

by the parable of the Wise and the Foolish Builders, and "How Kind the Good Samaritan" (John Newton, c. 1779) is inspired by the parable of the Good Samaritan.

## Harmony of parables

A sample <u>Gospel harmony</u> for the parables based on the <u>list of key episodes in the Canonical Gospels</u> is presented in the table below. For the sake of consistency, this table is automatically sub-selected from the main harmony table in the <u>Gospel harmony</u> article, based on the <u>list of key episodes in the Canonical Gospels</u>. Usually, no parables are associated with the Gospel of John, just allegories.<sup>[16]</sup>

Some parables in two different Gospels may seem very similar or nearly identical, but were given at different times of Jesus's ministry and the subtle differences actually contain very important messages that are sometimes overlooked because the readers assume they are the same parable. In cases like these, a reader should print out the scriptures and study them side-by-side and word-by-word to note the differences, and find the hidden meanings through those differences. One most noted example is the Parable of the Minas (Luke 19:12-27) and Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30). A book is devoted to the exploration of these differences which reveal to readers God's expectations of Christians regarding their time (the minas in Luke 19) and their talents (the large sums of money in Matthew 25).<sup>[38]</sup>

William Barry states in the <u>Catholic Encyclopedia</u> (1913) "There are no parables in St. John's Gospel",<sup>[14]</sup> and Friedrich von Hügel states in the <u>Encyclopædia Britannica Eleventh Edition</u> (1911) "Here Jesus' teaching contains no parables and but three allegories, the Synoptists present it as parabolic through and through".<sup>[15]</sup>

The moniker "7:14" comes from the well known passage in 2 Chronicles 7:14 where God promises Solomon:

if my people, who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. Hey, prayer is a good thing and I want to encourage more of it...

... but I see some warning signs when it comes to this "7:14" revival campaign.

Consider...

# 1) If you are using 2 Chronicles 7:14 as your prayer foundation...you're starting off on the wrong foot

I've really learned from my friend Paul Ellis (http://escapetoreality.org/posts/) to watch for the "if-then" promises of the Old Testament. "If" we do something, "then" God promises to do something. Back then God's blessing and favor was contingent on Israel's performance, which arguably was pretty shoddy at best.

#### Not unlike ourselves today.

The point of that period of time was to show how we can *never* perform well enough to be sufficient in our own rightousness. However now in Christ **we rest in his performance** not ours. We can point to Jesus and know we are *always* in his favor and blessing.

The 7:14 campaign website is called "If 7:14" with the "If" putting "the ball" of God's response in our court...a place I never, ever, want to be.

#### 2) The use of *fear* to heighten people's emotion and generate a response.

If you go to the "If 7:14" website (http://www.if714.org/) you'll see a video clip called *The Need for Revival*. The very first image you see (after the Earth) is that of Osama Bin Laden followed by the twisted carnage of the World Trade Center. After that there are some pictures from the more heinous gun massacres of the past few years followed by images of job loss and homelessness.

#### Fear

Snake oil salesmen have known this trick for years. Make people fearful and then offer them the antidote which (surprise) the salesman just happens to have. Now I'm not saying we shouldn't be praying for some of these issues affecting the world (we should) but we should primarily be Christ's Body addressing and bringing life to these problems affecting society using the Holy Spirit which he has already given us!

#### 3) America is not Israel

I hate to be the bearer of bad news but some Christians will be startled to learn that 2 Chronicles 2:7 was about Israel not America. In the Old Testament God dealt with the world in a different way...through Israel. And Israel was supposed to bring that light to other nations. In fact the rest of that passage is God promising that if Israel turned from His ways the temple they had just dedicated would be destroyed and made an object of ridicule by other nations.

Which was what happened...

God now deals with the world through his Son (Hebrews 1) It's a much better deal. Let's embrace this better covenant and quit trying to point to terms on an expired contract that never applied to us to begin with.

#### 4) The underlying root of Nationalism

Couched in the language of repentance and revival is the not so veiled theme of nationalism and American Exceptionalism. There is a message being promoted in many corners of American Evangelicalism that says something like, "America is Great but we are in danger of losing our greatness"

#### We need to repent so God will revive us and make us Great again!

The prayer goes beyond asking God to intercede for our neighborhoods and communities; Its a call as in the days of ancient Israel for God to make America's *name remain great among the nations*.

But we need to understand God is building only one Kingdom...

#### ...and its his.

He is now calling every man, woman, and child from every tribe and tongue to be a citizen of it.

God does want to bless America!

...and Canada...and China...and... India...and South Africa...and so on and so on

So if your agenda for prayer and revival is to see America stay #1...you may not be getting the big picture.

Malachi, Malachias, Malache or Mal'achi (/ˈmæləkai/ (@listen); Hebrew: ''¤'ö, Modern: Malakhi, Tiberian: Mal'āki, "Messenger", see malakh) was the writer of the Book of Malachi, the last book of the Neviim (prophets) section in the Hebrew Bible. No allusion is made to him by Ezra, however, and he does not directly mention the restoration of the temple. The editors of the 1906 Jewish Encyclopedia implied that he prophesied after Haggai and Zechariah (Malachi 1:10 (http://www.mechon-mamr e.org/p/pt/pt2401.htm#10); 3:1 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt2403.htm #1), 3:10 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt2403.htm#10)) and speculated that he delivered his prophecies about 420 BCE, after the second return of Nehemiah from Persia (Book of Nehemiah 13:6 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/pt/pt35b1 3.htm#6)), or possibly before his return, comparing Malachi 2:8 (http://www.mechon-mamr re.org/p/pt/pt35b13.htm#15) (Malachi 2:10-16 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/ pt/pt2402.htm#30) with Nehemiah 13:15 (http://www.mechon-mamre.org/p/ pt/pt2402.htm#30).

In the Septuagent or Greek Old Testament, the <u>Prophetic Books</u> are placed last, making <u>Book of Malachi</u> the last protocanonical book before the <u>Deuterocanonical</u> <u>books</u> or <u>The New Testament</u>. According to the 1897 <u>Easton's Bible Dictionary</u>, it is possible that Malachi is not a <u>proper name</u>, but simply means "messenger of <u>YHWH</u>".<sup>[1]</sup> The Greek Old Testament superscription is ἐν χειρι` ἀγγἑλου αὐτοῦ, (by the hand of his messenger).

## Name

Because Malachi's name does not occur elsewhere in the Bible, some scholars doubt whether "Malachi" is intended to be the personal name of the prophet. None of the other prophetic books of the Hebrew Bible or the Greek Old Testament are anonymous. The form *mal'akhi*, signifies "my messenger"; it occurs in <u>Malachi 3:1</u> (http://www.bibler.org/versions/americ can\_standard/asv\_malachio3\_sml.htm#malachi\_3:1) (compare to <u>Malachi 2:7</u> (http://www.bibler.org/versions/america n\_standard/asv\_malachio2\_sml.htm#malachi\_2:7)). But this form of itself would hardly be appropriate as a proper name without some additional syllable such as <u>Yah</u>, whence *mal'akhiah*, i.e. "messenger of Elohim." Haggai, in fact, is

expressly designated "messenger of Elohim" (<u>Haggai 1:13</u> (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_hagg aio1\_sml.htm#haggai\_1:13)). Besides, the superscriptions prefixed to the book, in both the Septuagint and the <u>Vulgate</u>, warrant the supposition that Malachi's full name ended with the syllable -yah. At the same time the Greek Old Testament translates the last clause of <u>Malachi 1:1</u> (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_malachio1\_sml.htm#m <u>alachi\_1:1</u>), "by the hand of his messenger," and the <u>Targum</u> reads, "by the hand of my angel, whose name is called Ezra the scribe." <sup>[2]</sup>

# Works

The Jews of his day ascribed the Book of Malachi, the last book of prophecy, to Ezra but if Ezra's name was originally associated with the book, it would hardly have been dropped by the collectors of the prophetic canon who lived only a century or two subsequent to Ezra's time. Certain traditions ascribe the book to <u>Zerubbabel</u> and Nehemiah; others, still, to Malachi, whom they designate as a <u>Levite</u> and a member of the "Great Synagogue." Certain modern scholars, however, on the basis of the similarity of the title (compare <u>Malachi 1:1</u> (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_malachio1\_sml.htm#malachi\_ 1:1) to Zechariah 9:1 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_zechariaho 9\_sml.htm#zechariah\_9:1) and Zechariah 12:1 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_zechariaho standard/asv\_zechariah\_12:1), declare it to be anonymous. Professor G.G. Cameron, suggests that the termination of the word "Malachi" is adjectival, and equivalent to the Latin angelicus, signifying "one charged with a message or mission" (a missionary). The term would thus be an official title; and the thought would not be unsuitable to one whose message closed the prophetical canon of the Old Testament.<sup>[2]</sup>



# Period

Opinions vary as to the prophet's exact date, but nearly all scholars agree that Malachi prophesied during the <u>Persian period</u>, and after the reconstruction and dedication of the second temple in 516 BCE (compare <u>Malachi 1:10 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/americ</u> an\_standard/asv\_malachio1\_sml.htm#malachi\_1:10) ; Malachi 3:1 (http://www.bibler.or

The prophet speaks of the "people's governor" (Hebrew "pechah", Malachi 1:8 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_malachio1\_sml.htm#malachi\_1:8)), as do Haggai and Nehemiah (Haggai 1:1 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_haggaio1\_sml.htm#hagg ai\_1:1); Nehemiah 5:14 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_nehemiaho5\_sml.htm#nehemiah\_5:1 4) Nehemiah 12:26 (http://www.bibler.org/versions/american\_standard/asv\_nehemiah12\_sml.htm#nehemiah\_12:26)). The social conditions portrayed appear to be those of the period of the Restoration. More specifically, Malachi probably lived and labored during the times of Ezra and Nehemiah. The abuses which Malachi mentions in his writings correspond so exactly with those which Nehemiah found on his 2nd visit to Jerusalem in 432 BCE (Nehemiah 13:7 (http://www.bibler.org/versi ons/american standard/asv nehemiah13 sml.htm#nehemiah 13:7)) that it seems reasonably certain that he prophesied concurrently with Nehemiah or shortly after.<sup>[2]</sup>

According to Rabbi W. Gunther Plaut, "Malachi describes a priesthood that is forgetful of its duties, a Temple that is underfunded because the people have lost interest in it, and a society in which Jewish men divorce their Jewish wives to marry out of the faith."<sup>[3]</sup>

However, the results of modern critical studies -- in particular those that stress Matthew's alleged dependence on Mark for a substantial part of his Gospel -- have caused some Biblical scholars to abandon Matthean authorship. Why, they ask, would Matthew, an eyewitness to the events of our Lord's life, depend so heavily on Mark's account? The best answer seems to be that he agreed with it and wanted to show that the apostolic testimony to Christ was not divided.

Matthew, whose name means "gift of the Lord," was a tax collector who left his work to follow Jesus (9:9-13). In Mark and Luke he is called by his other name, Levi.

#### **Date and Place of Writing**

Some have argued on the basis of its Jewish characteristics that Matthew's Gospel was written in the early church period, possibly the early part of a.d. 50, when the church was largely Jewish and the gospel was preached to Jews only (Ac 11:19). However, those who have concluded that both Matthew and Luke drew extensively from Mark's Gospel date it later – after the Gospel of Mark had been in circulation for a period of time. See essay and chart, p. 1943. Accordingly, some feel that Matthew would have been written in the late 50s or in the 60s. Others, who assume that Mark was written between 65 and 70, place Matthew in the 70s or even later. However, there is insufficient evidence to be dogmatic about either view.

The Jewish nature of Matthew's Gospel may suggest that it was written in the Holy Land, though many think it may have originated in Syrian Antioch.

#### Recipients

Since his Gospel was written in Greek, Matthew's readers were obviously Greek-speaking. They also seem to have been Jews. Many elements point to Jewish readership: Matthew's concern with fulfillment of the OT (he has more quotations from and allusions to the OT than any other NT author); his tracing of Jesus' descent from Abraham (1:1-17); his lack of explanation of Jewish customs (especially in contrast to Mark); his use of Jewish terminology (e.g., "kingdom of heaven," where "heaven" reveals the Jewish reverential reluctance to use the name of God; see note on 3:2); his emphasis on Jesus' role as "Son of David" (1:1; 9:27; 12:23; 15:22; 20:30-31; 21:9,15; 22:41-45). This does not mean, however, that Matthew restricts his Gospel to Jews. He records the coming of the Magi (non-Jews) to worship the infant Jesus (2:1-12), as well as Jesus' statement that the "field is the world" (13:38). He also gives a full statement of the Great Commission (28:18-20). These passages show that, although Matthew's Gospel is Jewish, it has a universal outlook.

#### Purpose

Matthew's main purpose is to prove to his Jewish readers that Jesus is their Messiah. He does this primarily by showing how Jesus in his life and ministry fulfilled the OT Scriptures. Although all the Gospel writers quote the OT, Matthew includes nine proof texts unique to his Gospel (1:22-23; 2:15; 2:17-18; 2:23; 4:14-16; 8:17; 12:17-21; 13:35; 27:9-10) to drive home his basic theme: Jesus is the fulfillment of the OT predictions of the Messiah. Matthew even finds the history of God's people in the OT recapitulated in some aspects of Jesus' life (see, e.g., his quotation of Hos 11:1 in 2:15). To accomplish his purpose Matthew also emphasizes Jesus' Davidic lineage (see Recipients, p. 1945).

#### Structure

The way the material is arranged reveals an artistic touch. The whole Gospel is woven around five great discourses: (1) chs. 5-7; (2) ch. 10; (3) ch. 13; (4) ch. 18; (5) chs.24-25. That this is deliberate is clear from the refrain that concludes each discourse: "When Jesus had finished saying these things," or similar words (7:28; 11:1; 13:53; 19:1; 26:1). The narrative sections, in each case, appropriately lead up to the discourses. The Gospel has a fitting prologue (chs. 1-2) and a challenging epilogue (28:16-20).

The fivefold division may suggest that Matthew has modeled his book on the structure of the Pentateuch (the first five books of the OT). He may also be presenting the gospel as a new Torah and Jesus as a new and greater Moses.

# WIKIPEDIA Epistle to the Hebrews

The **Epistle to the Hebrews**, or **Letter to the Hebrews**, or in the Greek manuscripts, simply **To the Hebrews** ( $\Pi \rho o \ \varsigma \ \Xi \beta \rho \sigma i o \upsilon \varsigma$ )<sup>[1]</sup> is one of the books of the New Testament.

The text is traditionally attributed to <u>Paul the Apostle</u>, but doubt on <u>Pauline authorship</u> is reported by <u>Eusebius</u>,<sup>[2]</sup> and modern biblical scholarship considers its authorship unknown,<sup>[3]</sup> perhaps written in deliberate imitation of the style of Paul.<sup>[4][5]</sup> Although the writer's style reflects some characteristics of Paul's writing, there are some differences.

Scholars of Greek consider its writing to be more polished and eloquent than any other book of the New Testament. The book has earned the reputation of being a masterpiece.<sup>[6]</sup> It has also been described as an intricate New Testament book.<sup>[7]</sup> Scholars believe it was written for <u>Jewish Christians</u> who lived in <u>Jerusalem</u>.<sup>[6]</sup> Its purpose was to exhort Christians to persevere in the face of persecution. At this time, certain believers were considering turning back to Judaism (the Jewish system of law) to escape being persecuted for accepting Christ as their saviour, now following this system of grace (saved by Jesus' sacrifice on the cross). The theme of the epistle is the doctrine of the person of Christ and his role as <u>mediator</u> between God and humanity.

The epistle opens with an exaltation of Jesus as "the radiance of God's glory, the express image of his being, and upholding all things by his powerful word". <sup>[1:1–3]</sup> The epistle presents Jesus with the titles "pioneer" or "forerunner", "Son" and "<u>Son</u> of God", "priest" and "high priest".<sup>[8]</sup>

The epistle casts Jesus as both exalted Son and high priest, a unique dual Christology.<sup>[9]</sup>

# Composition

Hebrews uses Old Testament quotations interpreted in light of first century rabbinical Judaism.<sup>[10]</sup> New Testament and <u>Second Temple Judaism</u> scholar Eric Mason argues that the conceptual background of the priestly Christology of the Epistle to the Hebrews closely parallels presentations of the messianic priest and <u>Melchizedek</u> in the <u>Qumran</u> scrolls.<sup>[8]</sup> In both Hebrews and Qumran a priestly figure is discussed in the context of a Davidic figure; in both cases a divine decree

appoints the priests to their eschatological duty; both priestly figures offer an eschatological sacrifice of atonement. Although the author of Hebrews was not directly influenced by Qumran's "Messiah of Aaron",<sup>[11]</sup> these and other conceptions did provide "a precedent... to conceive Jesus similarly as a priest making atonement and eternal intercession in the heavenly sanctuary".<sup>[8]:199</sup>

# Authorship

By the end of the first century there was no consensus on the author's identity. <u>Clement of Rome</u>, <u>Barnabas</u>, <u>Paul the</u> <u>Apostle</u>, and other names were proposed. Others later suggested <u>Luke the Evangelist</u>, <u>Apollos</u>, or his teacher <u>Priscilla</u> as possible authors.<sup>[12]</sup>

In the 3rd century, Origen wrote of the letter,

"In the epistle entitled *To The Hebrews* the diction does not exhibit the characteristic roughness of speech or phraseology admitted by the Apostle [Paul] himself, the construction of the sentences is closer to the Greek usage, as anyone capable of recognising differences of style would agree. On the other hand the matter of the epistle is wonderful, and quite equal to the Apostle's acknowledged writings: the truth of this would be admitted by anyone who has read the Apostle carefully... If I were asked my personal opinion, I would say that the matter is the Apostle's but the phraseology and construction are those of someone who remembered the Apostle's teaching and wrote his own interpretation of what his master had said. So if any church regards this epistle as Paul's, it should be commended for so doing, for the primitive Church had every justification for handing it down as his. Who wrote the epistle is known to God alone: the accounts that have reached us suggest that it was either Clement, who became Bishop of Rome, or Luke, who wrote the gospel and the Acts."<sup>[13]</sup>

Further, "Men of old have handed it down as Paul's, but who wrote the Epistle God only knows".<sup>[14]</sup>

In the 4th century, Jerome and Augustine of Hippo supported Paul's authorship: the Church largely agreed to include Hebrews as the fourteenth letter of Paul, and affirmed this authorship until the <u>Reformation</u>. Scholars argued that in the 13th chapter of Hebrews, <u>Timothy</u> is referred to as a companion. Timothy was Paul's missionary companion in the same way Jesus sent <u>disciples</u> out in pairs. Also, the writer states that he wrote the letter from "Italy", which also at the time fits Paul.<sup>[15]</sup> The difference in style is explained as simply an adjustment to a distinct audience, to the Jewish Christians who were being persecuted and pressured to go back to traditional <u>Judaism</u>.<sup>[16]</sup> Many scholars now believe that the author was one of Paul's pupils or associates, citing stylistic differences between Hebrews and the other <u>Pauline epistles</u>.<sup>[17]</sup> Recent scholarship has favored the idea that the author was probably a leader of a predominantly Jewish congregation to whom he or she was writing.<sup>[18]</sup>

Because of its anonymity, it had some trouble being accepted as <u>part of the Christian canon</u>, being classed with the <u>Antilegomena</u>. Eventually it was accepted as scripture because of its sound theology, eloquent presentation, and other intrinsic factors.<sup>[6]:431</sup> In antiquity, certain circles began to ascribe it to Paul in an attempt to provide the anonymous work an explicit apostolic pedigree.<sup>[19]</sup>

The original <u>King James Version of the Bible</u> titled the work "The Epistle of Paul the Apostle to the Hebrews". However, the KJV's attribution to Paul was only a guess, and is currently disputed by recent research.<sup>[6]</sup> Its vastly different style, different theological focus, different spiritual experience, different <u>Greek</u> vocabulary – all are believed to make Paul's authorship of Hebrews increasingly indefensible. At present, neither modern scholarship nor church teaching ascribes Hebrews to Paul.<sup>[20]</sup>

<u>A.J. Gordon</u> ascribes the authorship of Hebrews to <u>Priscilla</u>, writing that "It is evident that the Holy Spirit made this woman Priscilla a teacher of teachers". Originally proposed by <u>Adolf von Harnack</u> in 1900,<sup>[21]</sup> Harnack's reasoning won the support of prominent Bible scholars of the early twentieth century. Harnack believes the letter was written in Rome – not to the Church, but to the inner circle. In setting forth his evidence for Priscillan authorship, he finds it amazing that the name of the author was blotted out by the earliest tradition. Citing <u>Chapter 13</u>, he says it was written by a person of "high standing and apostolic teacher of equal rank with Timothy". If <u>Luke</u>, Clemens, Barnabas, or <u>Apollos</u> had written it, Harnack believes their names would not have been obliterated.<sup>[22]</sup>

Donald Guthrie's commentary The Letter to the Hebrews (1983) mentions Priscilla by name as a suggested author.<sup>[23]</sup>

Believing the author to have been <u>Priscilla</u>, Ruth Hoppin posits that the name was omitted either to suppress its female authorship, or to protect the letter itself from suppression.<sup>[24]</sup>

Also convinced that Priscilla was the author of Hebrews, <u>Gilbert Bilezikian</u>, professor of biblical studies at Wheaton College, remarks on "the conspiracy of anonymity in the ancient church," and reasons: "The lack of any firm data concerning the identity of the author in the extant writings of the church suggests a deliberate blackout more than a case of collective loss of memory." <sup>[25]</sup>

# Date

The use of tabernacle terminology in Hebrews has been used to date the epistle before the <u>destruction of the temple</u>, the idea being that knowing about the destruction of both Jerusalem and the temple would have influenced the development of the author's overall argument. Therefore, the most probable date for its composition is the second half of the year 63 or the beginning of 64, according to the *Catholic Encyclopedia*.<sup>[17]</sup>

However, there is no way to prove the actual dating of this writing, even from within the internal structure of the writing. Throughout the writing, all mentions of the priestly acts of worship are connected to the tabernacle in Sinai, as built by Moses, with no mention of the temple in Jerusalem. An argument for a later date of the Hebrew text can be assumed due to the absence of any mention of the temple in Jerusalem. If the Hebrew writer composed this message after the first century it would be entirely possible that the destruction of the Jerusalem temple and that of the city of Jerusalem would not be relevant to the writer. Thus, some academic scholars hold to a much later date of composition to the Hebrew writing.

# Audience

Scholars have suggested that Hebrews is part of an internal New Testament debate between the extreme <u>Judaizers</u> (who argued that non-Jews must <u>convert to Judaism</u> before they can receive the <u>Holy Spirit</u> of <u>Jesus' new covenant</u>) versus the extreme <u>antinomians</u> (who argued that Jews must reject <u>God's commandments</u> and that <u>Jewish law was no longer in</u> effect). James and Paul represent the moderates of each faction, respectively, and Peter served as moderator.<sup>[26]</sup>

It sets before the Jew the claims of Christianity – to bring the Jew to the full realization of the relation of Judaism to Christianity, to make clear that Christ has fulfilled those temporary and provisional institutions, and has thus abolished them.<sup>[27]</sup> This view is commonly referred to as <u>Supersessionism</u>.<sup>[28]</sup>

# **Purpose for writing**

Those to whom Hebrews is written seem to have begun to doubt whether Jesus could really be the Messiah for whom they were waiting, because they believed the Messiah prophesied in the <u>Hebrew Scriptures</u> was to come as a militant king and destroy the enemies of his people. Jesus, however, came as a mere man who was arrested by the Jewish leaders and who suffered and was <u>crucified</u> by the Romans. And although <u>he was seen resurrected</u>, he still <u>left the earth</u> and his people, who now face persecution rather than victory. The Book of Hebrews solves this problem by arguing that the Hebrew Scriptures also foretold that the Messiah would be a priest (although of a different sort than the traditional Levitical priests) and Jesus came to fulfill this role, as a sacrificial offering to God, to atone for sins. <u>His role of a king is yet to come</u>, and so those who follow him should be patient and not be surprised that they suffer for now.<sup>[13:12–14]</sup>

Some scholars today believe the document was written to prevent <u>apostasy</u>.<sup>[29]</sup> Some have interpreted apostasy to mean a number of different things, such as a group of Christians in one sect leaving for another more conservative sect, one of which the author disapproves. Some have seen apostasy as a move from the Christian assembly to pagan ritual. In light of a possibly Jewish-Christian audience, the apostasy in this sense may be in regard to Jewish-Christians leaving the Christian assembly to return to the Jewish <u>synagogue</u>. The author writes, "Let us hold fast to our confession".<sup>[4:14]</sup> The epistle has been viewed as a long, rhetorical argument for having confidence in the new way to God revealed in Jesus Christ.<sup>[30]</sup>

The book could be argued to affirm <u>special creation</u>. It affirms that God by His Son, Jesus Christ, made the worlds. "God... hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son... by whom also he made the worlds". <sup>[1:1–2]</sup> The epistle also emphasizes the importance of faith. "Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear".<sup>[11:3]</sup>

...the Epistle opens with the solemn announcement of the superiority of the New Testament Revelation by the Son over Old Testament Revelation by the prophets. <sup>[1:1–4]</sup> It then proves and explains from the Scriptures the superiority of this New Covenant over the Old by the comparison of the Son with the angels as mediators of the Old Covenant, <sup>[1:5–2:18]</sup> with Moses and Joshua as the founders of the Old Covenant, <sup>[3:1–4:16]</sup> and finally, by opposing the high-priesthood of Christ after the order of Melchisedech to the Levitical priesthood after the order of Aaron. <sup>[5:1–10:18]</sup> (Leopold Fonck, The Catholic Encyclopedia, 1910)<sup>[17]</sup>

# Style

Hebrews is a very consciously "literary" document. The purity of its Greek was noted by <u>Clement of Alexandria</u>, according to <u>Eusebius</u> (*Historia Eccl.*, VI, xiv), and <u>Origen of Alexandria</u> asserted that every competent judge must recognize a great difference between this epistle and those of Paul (Eusebius, VI, xxv).

This letter consists of two strands: an expositional or doctrinal strand,

[1:1-14] [2:5-18] [5:1-14] [6:13-9:28] [13:18-25] and a hortatory or strongly urging [32] strand which punctuates the exposition parenthetically at key points as warnings to the readers. [2:1-4] [3:1-4:16] [6:1-12] [10:1-13:17]

Christians believe that Jesus is the mediator of the New Covenant. <sup>[8:6]</sup> His famous sermon from a hill representing Mount Zion is considered by many Christian scholars to be the antitype<sup>[31]</sup> of the proclamation of the Old Covenant by Moses from Mount Sinai.

Hebrews does not fit the form of a traditional <u>Hellenistic</u> epistle, lacking a proper prescript. Modern scholars generally believe this book was originally a <u>sermon</u> or <u>homily</u>, although possibly modified after it was delivered to include the travel plans, greetings and closing. <sup>[13:20–25] [33]</sup>

Hebrews contains many references to the Old Testament - specifically to its Septuagint text.<sup>[34]</sup>

# Christology

The *Epistle to the Hebrews* is notable for the manner in which it expresses the divine nature of Christ. As A.C. Purdy summarized for *The Interpreter's Bible* (1955):

We may sum up our author's Christology negatively by saying that he has nothing to do with the older Hebrew messianic hopes of a coming Son of David, who would be a divinely empowered human leader to bring in the kingdom of God on earth; and that while he still employs the figure of a militant, apocalyptic king... who will come again..., this is not of the essence of his thought about Christ.

Positively, our author presents Christ as divine in nature, and solves any possible objection to a divine being who participates in human experience, especially in the experience of death, by the priestly analogy. He seems quite unconscious of the logical difficulties of his position proceeding from the that Christ is both divine and human, at least human in experience although hardly in nature.<sup>[35]</sup>

Mikeal Parsons has commented:

If the humanity of Jesus is an important theme for Hebrews, how much more is Jesus' deity. While this theme of exaltation is asserted 'in many and various ways' we shall content ourselves by considering how the writer addresses this theme by asserting Jesus' superiority to a) angels, and b) Moses. The first chapter of Hebrews stresses the superiority of the Son to the angels. The very name 'Son' indicates superiority. This exaltation theme, in which the Son is contrasted with the angels (1:4), is expanded in the following string of OT quotations (1:5-13). While some have understood the catena as referring primarily to Christ's pre-existence, it is more likely that the verses should be understood, 'as a Christological hymn which traces the entire Christ event, including the pre-existence, earthly life, and exaltation of Christ'. The overall structure of the catena seems to point to exaltation as the underlying motif... At least it may be concluded that the superiority of the Son is demonstrated by this comparison/contrast with angels.

Peter Rhea Jones has reminded us that 'Moses is not merely one of the figures compared unfavourably to Jesus'; but rather, 'Moses and Jesus are yoked throughout the entirety of the epistle'. Allowing that Moses is much more than a 'whipping boy' for the author, the fact remains that the figure Moses is utilized as a basis for Christology. While there are several references to Moses, only two will be needed to demonstrate Jesus' superiority. The first passage to be considered is Hebrews 3:1-6. D'Angelo and others regard the larger context of this passage (3:1-4:16) to be the superiority of Christ's message to the Law. While the comparison between Jesus and the angels is based on a number of OT citations, the comparison of Jesus and Moses turns on a single verse, Nu. 12:7. Like the angels (1:14), Moses was a servant who witnessed, as it were, to the Son. In other words, 'faithful Sonship is superior to faithful servantship'. The Son is once again exalted. The exaltation theme finds expression in a more opaque way at 11:26. Here in the famous chapter on faith Moses is said to count 'abuse suffered for the Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt'. The portrait of

Moses drawn here is that of a martyr, and a Christian martyr at that. In effect, Moses joins that great cloud of witnesses who looked to Jesus as pioneer and perfecter of faith. Once again, Christ's superiority is asserted, this time over Moses and the entire Mosaic epoch.

In summary, the writer [of Hebrews] stressed the Sonship of Jesus and expressed it in a three-stage Christology of pre-existence, humanity, and exaltation.<sup>[36]</sup>

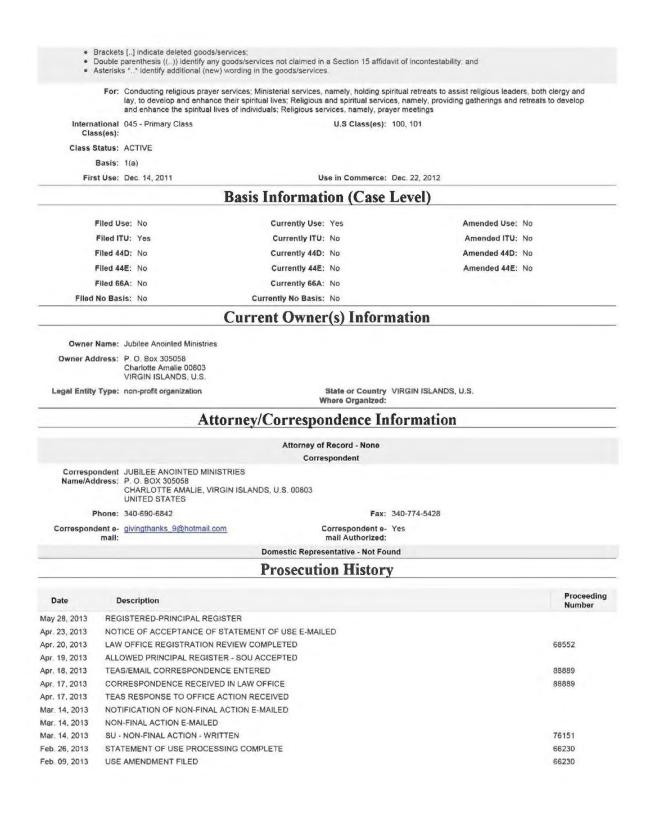

### Have We Misunderstood Genesis 1:1?

by Dr. Joshua D. Wilson on September 11, 2013

### Abstract

Arguing that the Hebrew does not support the traditional translation of Genesis 1:1, a growing number of scholars are proposing a retranslation of the verse that undercuts the idea of an absolute beginning of the universe and a creation out of nothing. Dr. Wilson shows that this retranslation is unwarranted and unworkable.

### Introduction

The traditional translation of Genesis 1:1 is well known, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." It is called the traditional translation because it has been *the* dominant rendering of Genesis 1:1 since the Greek Septuagint, the first major translation of the Hebrew Bible (into Greek), produced by Jewish scholars in the third century BC. Does the traditional translation describe the absolute beginning of the universe? Does it communicate the idea that the heavens and the earth were created out of nothing? Throughout history, Jews and Christians have overwhelmingly said, "Yes!"

However, a growing number of Hebrew scholars are now saying, "No!" For many of them, their reason for doing so is not based upon their interpretation of this verse, but their retranslation of it. Considering the historical weight of the traditional translation, what is the compelling evidence for this change? Did earlier translators misunderstand the Hebrew text? Have there been new developments in the understanding of Hebrew grammar that would cause modern scholars to reject what past scholars and translators affirmed?

### The Other Translation

In order to answer these questions, let us first lay out this retranslation of Genesis 1:1, the "dependent-clause" translation. It renders Genesis 1:1, along with 1:2 and 1:3a, in a manner similar to the Jewish Publication Society (JPS) version of 1985, "1 When God began to create heaven and earth-2 the earth being unformed and void, with darkness over the surface of the deep and a wind from God sweeping over the water-3a God said, 'Let there be light.'"<sup>1</sup> With this dependent-clause translation, it is not possible to interpret the idea of an absolute beginning of the universe or a creation out of nothing since the rendering treats the earth in Genesis 1:2 as being in existence before God's first act of creation, light. What then is the grammatical basis for this change in translation?

Proponents of the dependent-clause translation argue that according to the grammar of the Hebrew, Genesis 1:1 should be understood as a type of substantival clause.<sup>2</sup> In both English and Hebrew, a substantival clause is an entire clause that functions like a noun. For instance, in the sentence, "I know you are watching me," the clause "you are watching me" is functioning as a direct object of the main verb "know," a function usually reserved for nouns and pronouns. These proponents contend that the clause "God created the heavens and the earth" in Genesis 1:1 can function like an object of a preposition if we take the first part of the

verse to be "In the beginning of." This treatment of the passage could in a sense be rendered as "In the beginning of God creating the heavens and the earth ....," or "In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth ....." Employing this same grammatical principle, the JPS renders the verse with a dependent clause, "When God began to create heaven and earth ...." What makes the dependent-clause translation more preferable to the traditional translation with its historical preponderance? Is this type of substantival clause a grammatical construction that was unfamiliar to the ancient translators?

The most recent editions of the respected Hebrew grammars by Gesenius and Joüon together list over 200 examples of these types of substantival clauses in Biblical Hebrew,<sup>3</sup> which tells us that they are not a minor nuance of the language. Not surprisingly, the ancient translators of the Septuagint (Greek), the Vulgate (Latin), and the Targums (Aramaic), amongst others, recognized these types of grammatical constructions and frequently translated them as relative clauses. Yet, none of these translations recognized Genesis 1:1 as one of these constructions. Instead they rendered the verse in the traditional manner, as an independent clause.

### The False Dilemma

However, proponents of the dependent-clause translation also point out that in Genesis 1:1 the article *the* in the phrase "in the beginning" is not explicit in the Masoretic pointing of  $r\bar{e}$  is i, the Hebrew word for "beginning." (The original Hebrew text had only consonants, which was perfectly understandable to Jewish readers. The Masoretes were the Jewish scribes working roughly from AD 400–1000 who preserved the oral reading of the Hebrew text by adding vowels points, accents, and other markings to it.) Their argument then follows that given the absence of the article, *the*, the only other option for understanding Genesis 1:1 is that it is the type of substantival clause just described. Again, is this a grammatical clue that the ancient translators missed? Did they not know that the article *the* is not in the Hebrew?

According to the historical evidence, the answer to both questions is, "No." Consider the Septuagint, again the very first translation of the Hebrew Bible. It preserved the same reading as the Masoretic text by not including the article "the" in its translation of the verse. However, if the only other option for understanding Genesis 1:1 is that it is a type of substantival clause, why didn't the Septuagint translators render the verse accordingly? We have already mentioned that they were very familiar with these types of grammatical constructions and frequently rendered them as relative clauses. Perhaps there does not have to be an explicitly marked "the" in the pointing of *rē/šît* for us to understand Genesis 1:1 as an independent clause starting with "In *the* beginning." In fact, there are good reasons to conclude just that.

In both English and Hebrew, the word *beginning* is not a typical noun. It is a relator noun, which means it needs extra information to complete its meaning. Think about other English relator nouns like front, back, middle, left (side), right (side), and end. By themselves, these words don't communicate much. The front of what? The middle of what? The beginning of what? Usually these relator nouns are joined to other nouns to give them that needed, extra information: the end of the couch, the left (side) of the couch, the back of the couch, etc. However, there are instances in both English and Hebrew where relator nouns stand alone with clear meaning, that is without another noun like "couch" connected to it grammatically. In such cases, the relator nouns get their extra information from their contexts. For instance, at the conclusion of a movie, the phrase "the end" stands alone and is contextually related to the event of watching the movie. We don't need the words "of the movie" to be added to words "the end" to know what is being communicated on the screen. In Hebrew, the word *rē/šīt* ("beginning") stands alone in Genesis 1:1 and Isaiah 46:10 as does the similar word *rō/š* ("beginning") in Proverbs 8:23 and Isaiah 40:21, where it refers to the beginning of creation. The context of these passages gives us that extra information.<sup>4</sup>

In Hebrew, when relator nouns stand by themselves, they are frequently found with *or* without the article *the*. Consider the following prose verses from the NAS using the Hebrew relator nouns right (side),  $y\bar{a}m\hat{n}$ , and left (side),  $s\bar{e}m\bar{o}/l$ ,<sup>5</sup> where [the] indicates a missing "the" in the Hebrew.

2 Samuel 2:19 Asahel pursued Abner and did not turn to the right or to the left from following Abner.
Numbers 20:17b We will go along the king's highway, not turning to [the] right or [the] left, until we pass through your territory.
2 Chronicles 3:17a He erected the pillars in front of the temple, one on [the] right and the other on the left,

In 2 Samuel 2:19 the words "right" and "left," standing by themselves, are explicitly marked with the article "the" in the Hebrew. However, in Number 20:17b, the words "right" and "left," standing by themselves, are not marked with the article even though they are used in the same manner as "right" and "left" in 2 Samuel 2:19. The article "the" is implied from the context.

In 2 Chronicles 3:17a the word "right" is not marked with the article "the" in the Hebrew, but the word "left" is! Again, the first "the" is implied from the context. Interestingly, the Septuagint, following the literal Hebrew, does not render the first "the" even though it is implied from the context, but does render the second "the" because it is clearly marked in the Hebrew.<sup>6</sup> Often the Septuagint is very literal in its translations, as it is with 2 Chronicles 3:17a, so it is not surprising that its literal translation of Genesis 1:1 does not include an article with "beginning."

These verses help to demonstrate that when relator nouns stand alone, their contexts still communicate an implied "the" even though such nouns are not marked with an explicit article. Thus, just because the article "the" is not reflected in the vowel pointing of the Hebrew text, it does not mean that we cannot or should not translate the Hebrew relator noun  $r\bar{e}$ 's  $\hat{i}t$ , with its prefixed preposition, as "In the beginning," nor does it mean that we cannot translate Genesis 1:1 as an independent clause as the most popular English translations all do (e.g., KJV, NKJV, NAS, NIV, ESV, HCSB, Geneva, NLT, RSV).

### The Awkward Grammar

THE TRADITIONAL UNDERSTANDING OF GENESIS 1:1 IS GRAMMATICALLY EASY, AND THE MOST BASIC PRINCIPLE FOR UNDERSTANDING ANY LANGUAGE IS TO FOLLOW THE EASE OF THE GRAMMAR.

If, however, Genesis 1:1 is a specific type of substantival clause, as proponents of the dependent-clause translation argue, then it makes the reading of the Hebrew very difficult. As a substantival clause, Genesis 1:1 is not simply a dependent clause connected to Genesis 1:3, like the JPS translates it. It is actually a grammatical part of the main clause in Genesis 1:3. Such is the nature of substantival clauses in Biblical Hebrew; they are participating elements in their main clause. Genesis 1:1 would be a prepositional phrase modifying the main clause verb of Genesis 1:3. It would be like rendering the two verses as, "In the beginning of God creating the heavens and the earth, God said, 'Let there be light." The main problem with this grammatical reading is Genesis 1:2. Genesis 1:2 inserts three clauses between the supposed prepositional phrase of 1:1 and its supposed main clause in 1:3. In other words, an entire verse, marked as such by the Masoretes, separates a prepositional phrase from the main clause verb it modifies. Such a construction is grammatically awkward in Hebrew *and* in English!

### Conclusion

Here is the main take-away. The dependent-clause understanding of Genesis 1:1 is not grammatically easy; it is difficult and awkward. The traditional understanding of Genesis 1:1 is grammatically easy, and the most basic principle for understanding any language is to follow the ease of the grammar. The ancient translators were just as familiar with the grammatical issues as we are today, and they followed the ease of the grammar by rendering the passage in its most normal, traditional sense. So the main question should not be, "Is there something in the Hebrew that the ancient translators missed?" That answer is clearly, "No." The better, more humble question should be, "Is there something in the Hebrew we have missed?" The traditional understanding of Genesis 1:1 is trustworthy. In the absolute beginning God did indeed create the heavens and earth out of nothing, and as the rest of the chapter and Exodus 20:11 teach, He did it supernaturally by His word in six literal days.

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### Footnotes

- 1. This translation was a major shift from the JPS version of 1917, which rendered the verse as "IN THE beginning God created the heaven and the earth." The all-caps is theirs.
- 2. This type of substantival clause is more technically called a genitive substantival clause. In a genitive substantival clause an entire clause (the *rectum*) is in grammatical relation to a single noun (the *regens*). (See the most recent edition of the Hebrew grammar by Paul Joüon § 129p-q.) In the case of Genesis 1:1, the entire clause "God created the heavens and the earth" would be in grammatical relation to the single noun "beginning" if it were a genitive substantival clause. Some proponents of the dependent-clause translation understand this grammatical relation to be like a relative clause. Others understand the relation to be non-relative.

- 4. In his commentary on Genesis, the Medieval Jewish scholar Moses ben Naḥman (Ramban) makes a similar argument concerning the use of  $r\bar{e}$ /sit in Genesis 1:1 and Isaiah 46:10.
- 5. When the Hebrew words yāmîn and səmö<sup>1</sup> are used as relator nouns, they frequently refer to the right or left side of a person or thing. For a few examples see 2 Samuel 2:21; 2 Kings 23:8; and Zechariah 4:3 in the NAS and Nehemiah 8:4 in the NIV.
- 6. The Septuagint does not put the article in the same place as the Hebrew, but it is clear that the translators were rendering it in the Greek.

### John 3:16

John 3:16 (chapter 3, verse 16 of the Gospel of John of the New Testament) is one of the most widely quoted verses from the Bible and has been called the most famous Bible verse.<sup>[1]</sup> It has also been called the "Gospel in a nutshell", because it is considered a summary of the central theme of traditional Christianity:<sup>[1]</sup>

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him shall not perish, but have everlasting life. (KJV)

### **Biblical context**

In Exodus 4:22, the Israelites as a people are called "my firstborn son" by God using the singular form. In John, the focus shifts to the person of Jesus as representative of that title. The verse is part of the New Testament narrative in the third chapter of John in the discussion at Jerusalem between Jesus and Nicodemus, who is called a "ruler of the Jews". (v.1) After speaking of the necessity of a man being born again before he could "see the kingdom of God", (v.3) Jesus spoke also of "heavenly things" (v.11-13) and of salvation (v.14-17) and the condemnation (v.18,19) of those that do not believe in Jesus. "14 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: 15 That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:14-15) Note that verse 15 is nearly identical to the latter part of John 3:16.

### Translations

A representative sample of published Bible translations renders it as follows. (It is worth noting that since this is perhaps the best-known verse, many translations have tried to maintain a traditional rendering).<sup>[2]</sup>

### Sense and syntax

Recent translation scholarship has struggled most with the Greek adverb  $o \tilde{\sigma} \tau \omega \varsigma$  (houtos) which traditionally has been simply translated as "so" as in "so loved" in the KJV.

Theologians Gundry and Howell<sup>[3]</sup> believe that the sense and syntax of the Greek O $\ddot{\upsilon}\tau\omega\varsigma...\ddot{\omega}\sigma\tau\epsilon$  make it likely that the author of the Gospel of John is emphasizing both (a) the *degree* to which God loved the world as well as (b) the *manner* in which God chose to express that love—by sending his only son. Gundry and Howell write that the O $\ddot{\upsilon}\tau\omega\varsigma$  term more frequently refers to the *manner* in which something is done (see BDAG 741–42 s.v.  $\ddot{\upsilon}\tau\omega/o\ddot{\upsilon}\tau\omega\varsigma$ ). However, they add that the  $\ddot{\omega}\sigma\tau\epsilon$  clause that follows O $\ddot{\upsilon}\tau\omega\varsigma$  involves the indicative—meaning that it stresses an *actual* but usually unexpected result. They conclude that the sense and syntax of the Greek construction here focuses on the *nature* of God's love, addressing its mode, intensity, and extent. Accordingly, it emphasizes the *greatness of the gift God has given*.

There are other scholars agreeing with this assessment. "The 'so' (houtos) is an adverb of degree which points toward the clause which follows and here serves to express the idea of infinity, a love that is limitless, that is fully adequate."<sup>[4]</sup> "The Greek construction...emphasizes the intensity of the love."<sup>[5]</sup>

This understanding of the intent in the original Greek is reflected in various scholarly commentaries and translations such as these:

- "For God loved the world so much that he gave his only-begotten Son." (Schnackenburg)<sup>[6]</sup>
- "Yes, God loved the world so much that He gave the only Son." (Brown)<sup>[7]</sup>
- "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son." (NEB)
- "God loved the people of this world so much that he gave his only Son." (CEV)
- "For God loved the world so greatly that he gave the only Son." (Beasley-Murray)<sup>[8]</sup>

Based on their analysis of the original Greek parallelistic structure of John 3:14-17, Gundry and Howell provide the following English translation showing the grammatical structure of that passage:

#### PARALLELISTIC STRUCTURE OF JOHN 3:14–17 MAIN CLAUSES (UNINDENTED) SUBORDINATE CLAUSES (INDENTED)<sup>[3]</sup>

And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness,

in this way must the Son of man be lifted up

in order that everyone believing might have in him life eternal,

for in this way God loved the world;

and so God gave the only Son

in order that everyone believing in him might not perish; rather, might have life eternal,

for God did not send the Son into the world

in order that he might judge the world; rather, in order that the world might be saved through him.

### Interpretations

Various translations differ on whether this is a direct quote of Jesus or a comment of the narrator of the Gospel. For example, the Good News Bible ends the quotation marks after verse 13 after which there is a footnote 'The quotation may continue through verse 21.'<sup>[9]</sup>

Computer scientist <u>Donald Knuth</u> is the author of *3:16 Bible Texts Illuminated*, in which he examines the Bible by an analysis of chapter 3, verse 16 of each book. Each verse is accompanied by a rendering in <u>calligraphic</u> art, contributed by a group of calligraphers under the leadership of <u>Hermann Zapf</u>. 3:16 was chosen because of this key passage in John.<sup>[10]</sup>

David Pawson challenged the meaning and interpretation of the verse in his 2007 book *Is John 3:16 the Gospel?*<sup>[11]</sup>

### **Popular culture**

Some people (such as the <u>Rainbow Man</u>) display the reference in large letters at sporting events, seeking the attention of fellow fans, the staff controlling the venue's <u>giant video screens</u> and, if the game is televised, the television audience.<sup>[12]</sup> The <u>Heisman</u>-winning American football player <u>Tim Tebow</u> printed this reference (among other Bible verses) on his <u>eye black</u>, notably during the <u>2009 BCS championship</u>.<sup>[13]</sup> Exactly three years later on January 8, 2012, was the game that would become known as "The 3:16 game", where Tebow threw for 316 yards in a <u>playoff upset</u> against the <u>Pittsburgh Steelers</u>; a game in which measurements of 3, 16 and 31.6 were also noted, "John 3 16" became the top Google search in the US.<sup>[14]</sup>[15]

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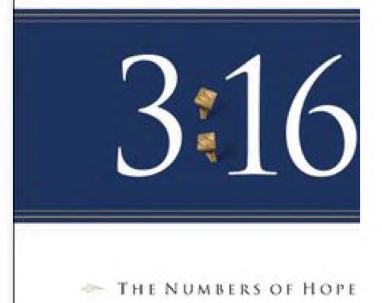
