On November 6, 2025, Appellant filed a request to remand the above-captioned applications to the Trademark Examining Attorney. Appellant seeks remand to respond to the final Office actions issued on September 5, 2025.

It has come to the Board's attention that the Office actions dated September 5, 2025 erroneously included a response clause stating that Appellant's response is due within three months of the issue date. However, the response clause is not applicable under the circumstances of this case. As further explained in TBMP § 1204, if a new final refusal to register or action maintaining the finality of a prior Office action is issued after suspension and remand, "the response clause should be omitted; the application should be returned to the Board; proceedings with respect to the appeal will be resumed; and the applicant will be allowed time in which to file its appeal brief." *See* TBMP § 1205.01(a). Accordingly, the response clause in the Office actions dated September 5, 2025 is not applicable.

Requests for remand are generally filed by appellants because they wish to make

additional evidence of record, because they wish to amend the application, or in light of a recently decided case or amended Trademark Rule. No matter what the purpose, the request for remand must include a showing of good cause. TBMP § 1209.04.

Appellant has not included anything for the Examining Attorney to consider with its request for remand. Accordingly, Appellant has not shown good cause for remand, and the request for remand is denied.

Appellant is allowed until twenty (20) days from the date of this order to submit an amended request for remand with a showing of good cause or in which to file its brief.
