THE PERIOD FOR DISCOVERY TO CLOSE:	October 2, 2002
Testimony period for party in position of plaintiff to close: (opening thirty days prior thereto)	December 31, 2002
Testimony period for party in position of defendant to close: (opening thirty days prior thereto)	March 1, 2003
Rebuttal testimony period to close (opening fifteen days prior thereto)	April 15, 2003

¹ However, in the future, consented motions to extend discovery and/or testimony periods should comply with the requirement of Trademark Rule 2.121(d). That rule requires that stipulated or consented motions to extend those time periods be presented in the form used in a trial order.

In each instance, a copy of the transcript of testimony together with copies of documentary exhibits, must be served on the adverse party within thirty days after completion of the taking of testimony. Trademark Rule 2.125.

Briefs shall be filed in accordance with Trademark Rule 2.128(a) and (b).

An oral hearing will be set only upon request filed as provided by Trademark Rule 2.129.
