
MOTION TO EXTEND TESTIMONY TAKING PERIODS

Opposer Full Speed Ahead, Inc. (“FSA”) hereby moves the Board, pursuant to 37 CFR 2.121(a)(1), Fed. R. Civ. P. 6(b), and TTAB Rule 509.01, for a sixty-one day, extension of time for the parties’ respective periods for the taking of testimony in this matter, up to and including: (1) December 3, 2007 for FSA to take evidence in support of its case in chief; (2) February 1, 2007 for Applicant SRAM Corporation (“SRAM”) to take responsive testimony; and (3) March 17, 2008 for FSA to take any rebuttal testimony. SRAM does not oppose this extension. FSA and SRAM had informally stayed any further action on the Opposition from approximately May, 2007 to August, 2007 while attempting to settle the dispute. FSA requests this extension for good cause (1) due to the departure of trademark counsel from the Adolph Law Group, and the resulting need of The Adolph Law Group, PLLC to associate with additional counsel specializing in trademark issues and proceedings before the Trademark Trial and Appeal Board, and (2) to enable the parties to complete the entry of a stipulated protective order, which had been delayed due to extensive albeit ultimately unsuccessful settlement negotiations, so that the parties may then complete their document productions. FSA’s

grounds for this motion are more fully set forth in its accompanying Memorandum in Support of FSA's Motion to Extend Testimony Taking Periods.

WHEREFORE, Opposer FSA requests a sixty-one day extension of the testimony periods, up to and including the dates set forth above.
