A 4 How many times have you heard Mr. Taulbee 5 make that recommendation? 6 7 A Not that often. Do you have an estimate of how many times? 8 9 A I don't. No. 10 What was the basis for making that -- why has Mr. Taulbee made recommendations to change a sample? 11 12 A If the trademark registration was not correct on it, the logo that was on it. 13 And what was Mr. Taulbee's recommendation 14 15 when the logo was not correct? That they change the logo. 16 A How did he recommend that they change the 17 Q 18 logo? 19 A How is --What change did Mr. Taulbee recommend that 20 21 the licensee make to the logo? That they put the registered trademark on 22 A there. 23 And when you say that "they put the 24 registered trademark on there, " what do you mean? 25

- The Dale Earnhardt trademark is registered, 1 and it has to appear a certain way in order for it to be a registered item. 3 So Mr. Taulbee's recommendation was to change the trademark to make sure it matched the registered 5 mark. 6 7 A Yes. Is Pat Legare involved in licensing for DEI? A No. 9 What is Pat Legare's role with DEI? 10 Q 11 A She is -- she has no position at DEI. She is 12 a board member of the DEI Foundation. As a board member of the DEI Foundation, does 13 Ms. Legare have any role in licensing of Dale Earnhardt 14 15 licensed products? A No. 16 What about Cindy Sims? Is Cindy Sims 17 involved in licensing for DEI? 18 A No. 19 What is Cindy Sims' role with DEI? 20 0 She is property manager. 21 A What do her duties include as property 22 0 23 manager?
  - A She's responsible for the -- she is over the maintenance department of DEI, and she is responsible

- for the -- I guess, the maintenance of all the 1 2 properties. But she doesn't have any role in licensing. 3 A No. Okay. Let me ask you more about DEI's 5 licensing business. Who negotiates contracts for Dale 6 7 Earnhardt licensed merchandise? A Alston & Bird. 8 Mr. Taulbee? 9 10 Α Yes. Anyone else at Alston & Bird? 11 12 A No. Who identifies new or potential licensing 13 14 deals? 15 Normally they knock on DEI's door, and we refer them to Alston & Bird. So licensees come to you. 17 A Yes. 18 19 Do you know of a time when DEI ever sought out a licensee? A Yes. 21 When was that? 22 0 I don't know the years, but I know that DEI 23
- has reached out to a few vendors to see if they would be interested in producing items.

Do you remember what types of products were 1 involved? 2 A I remember one of the licensees as being 3 Remington. So some sort of guns. 4 Do you remember any other products? 5 Not off the top of my head, no. A 7 Who makes the decision whether or not to 0 enter into a licensing deal on behalf of DEI? 8 A Teresa Earnhardt. 9 10 0 Is anyone else involved in that decision? 11 A No. Is Mr. Taulbee involved in those decisions? 12 He brings the licensee to her, and she makes 13 A the final decision. 14 15 Does Ms. Earnhardt normally meet with the licensee before Mr. Taulbee brings them to her? 16 A No. 17 Does Mr. Taulbee have the initial meetings 18 19 with the potential licensee? He has the initial conversation. I'm not 20 21 sure about the meetings, but he has the initial conversation. 22 Is the -- are deals with potential licensees 23 already negotiated by the time they're brought to 24 Ms. Earnhardt? 25

- 1 A Not necessarily, no. So Ms. Earnhardt may learn of potential deals 3 with potential licensees before the negotiations have completed. 4 A Yes. 5 Would Ms. Earnhardt direct -- or has 6 Ms. Earnhardt directed negotiations with respect to 7 licensees? 9 A Would you repeat that, please. - A There would be some maybe home apparel, sheets, drapes.
  - Q You said there are sheets and drapes?
  - A Mm-hmm.
- Q Can you describe those sheets and drapes for me? What do they look like?
- A They would have probably the car, Dale's image, and his signature.
  - Q Are there any other products you can think of that are sold, Dale Earnhardt licensed products that

1 are sold, in the retail store that you can think of? Pens, pencils, posters, paper. And you said that -- well, let me ask you 3 this: How is the Dale Earnhardt marks or his likeness used on Dale Earnhardt licensed merchandise? 5 It is his photo and his signature. 6 And does his signature include both his first 7 name and his last name? It's a combination of both. We have items 9 that have "Dale Earnhardt" and "Earnhardt." 10 11 What items do you have that use just 12 "Earnhardt" as the signature? 13 Offhand, it is apparel. Generally when Dale Earnhardt's signature is 14 included on Dale Earnhardt licensed merchandise, is it 15 both names? 16 17 A Yes. So most of the time it's both names. 18 A Mm-hmm. 19 20 (Exhibit 1 Marked for Identification) BY MR. TILLEY: 21 22 I'll hand you what is to be Exhibit 1. Mrs. Queen, I'll represent to you that this is the -- a 23 printout from the page marked "Store" on the Dale 24

Earnhardt Incorporated Web site.

- Q And why would you say no?
- A Because it's very few of the items that we sell. The list is significant.
- Q Okay. Let me ask you about how the Dale

  Earnhardt trademarks and his likeness are used on these

  products. If you'll look at the hat on the brim, on

  the front of the hat there's a picture of a man

  standing over a checkered flag and then a signature,

  "Dale Earnhardt." Have you seen that image before?
  - A Yes.

- Q Is that one of the Dale Earnhardt trademarks?
- A To answer that honestly, you'd have to see if there's a registered sticker on the back of it or a tag on the back of it. I can't answer that without seeing that.
- Q Let me ask it this way: When -- I asked you when licensees license the Dale Earnhardt trademarks, how do they use those trademarks on those products?

  You said there are signatures, pictures -- or Dale Earnhardt's picture, and Dale Earnhardt's name; is that correct?
  - A Or "Earnhardt."
- O Or "Earnhardt."
- 24 A Yes.
  - Q Does Teresa Earnhardt have a registration for

the name "Earnhardt" alone? 1 I don't know that. Do you know if the name "Earnhardt" alone is 3 included in licensing agreements? 4 I don't know that. 5 A Does DEI have a registration for "Earnhardt" 0 6 7 alone? I don't know that either. A Have you ever reviewed or signed a licensing 9 agreement on behalf of DEI? Have you ever reviewed a 10 11 licensing agreement for DEI? 12 A Yes. When was that? 13 Several years ago. - 19 A Yes.

Do you know -- so as far as you know, the 5 only registration Ms. Earnhardt -- trademark registration Ms. Earnhardt owns is for the name "Dale 7 Earnhardt." 8 Α Yes. 9 And you don't know if Ms. Earnhardt has ever 10 registered the name "Earnhardt" by itself as a 11 trademark. 12 I don't know that. 13 (Exhibit 4 Marked for Identification) 14 BY MR. TILLEY: 15 I'm going to hand you what's going to be 16 marked as Exhibit 4. Ms. Queen, have you ever seen a 17 trademark registration? 18 Is this what this is? 19 Answer my question, first. Ms. Queen, have 20 you ever seen a trademark registration? 21 I've seen what it looks like. 22 Ms. Queen, I'll represent to you that this is 23 a record of a trademark registration for the name "Dale 24
