**NOTICE OF OPPOSITION**

Industria de Diseño Textil, S.A. aka Inditex, S.A. (“Opposer”), a Sociedad Anónima duly organized and existing under the laws of Spain, having a place of business at Edificio Inditex, Avenida de la Diputación, 15143 – Arteixo, A Coruña, Spain, believes that it will be damaged by the registration of the mark shown in Application Serial No. 86864162 and hereby opposes the same under the provisions of Section 13 of the Trademark Act of 1946, 15 U.S.C. § 1063.

As grounds for opposition, Opposer alleges the following:

1. Opposer is the owner of all right, title, and interest in and to famous marks containing or comprised of ZARA (collectively, the “ZARA Marks”), which Opposer uses in connection with clothing and related goods and services.

2. Opposer’s rights in the ZARA Marks have been recognized by the United States Patent and Trademark Office (“USPTO”), which has issued numerous federal registrations to Opposer for its ZARA Marks, including the following:

3. Opposer's registrations are valid and subsisting, and Registration No. 1922163 is incontestable. These registrations provide *prima facie* evidence, and the incontestable registration provides conclusive evidence, of Opposer's ownership of the ZARA Marks, of the validity of the marks, and of Opposer's exclusive right to use the marks in commerce.

4. Opposer also uses “ZARA MINI” on tags for certain of its children’s clothing offered under the ZARA Marks.

5. Opposer has extensively used, advertised, and marketed its ZARA Marks in interstate commerce in connection with clothing and related goods and services since at least as early as 1989.

6. As a result of such extensive use, advertising, and marketing, Opposer’s ZARA Marks have become famous as distinctive indicators of the origin of Opposer’s goods and services, and the marks have become extremely valuable symbols of Opposer’s goodwill.

7. Notwithstanding Opposer’s prior established rights in the ZARA Marks, Applicant filed an application with the USPTO on January 4, 2016 for the mark MINIZARU (Ser. No. 86864162) for “Brassieres; Caps; Coats; Footwear; Shawls; Shirts; Stockings; Sweaters; Underwear; Baby layettes for clothing” in Class 25.

8. Upon information and belief, Applicant knew or had reason to know of Opposer’s prior rights in the ZARA Marks when Applicant filed its application.

**Count I -- Likelihood of Confusion - §2(d)**

9. The mark that Applicant seeks to register so closely resembles the ZARA Marks that the use and registration thereof are likely to cause confusion, mistake, and deception as to the source or origin of Applicant’s goods and will injure and damage Opposer and the goodwill and reputation symbolized by the ZARA Marks.

10. Applicant’s alleged mark consists of the descriptive term “MINI,” which means “anything of a small, reduced, or miniature size,” *see* Exhibit A attached hereto, followed by the dominant remainder of the mark, “ZARU,” which is nearly identical visually, aurally, and in overall commercial impression to one or more of Opposer’s ZARA Marks.

11. Any minor differences between Applicant's alleged mark and Opposer's ZARA Marks are not likely to be perceived by the consuming public given the undeniable similarities between Opposer's ZARA Marks and the dominant "ZARU" portion of Applicant's alleged mark, and the descriptiveness of the term "MINI" in Applicant's alleged mark. The relevant consuming public is likely to view Applicant's alleged mark as a "miniature ZARA."

12. Applicant's goods are identical or so closely related to Opposer's goods and services such that the public is likely to be confused, to be deceived, and to assume erroneously that Applicant's goods are those of Opposer, or that Applicant is in some way connected or affiliated with, or approved or sponsored by, Opposer, all to Opposer's irreparable damage.

13. Likelihood of confusion is enhanced by the fame of Opposer's ZARA Marks, such that consumers will assume erroneously that Applicant's alleged mark and the goods offered thereunder are sold, approved, or endorsed by Opposer.

14. Likelihood of confusion is enhanced by the fact that purchasers of Applicant's goods are prospective purchasers of Opposer's goods and services, and vice versa.

15. Likelihood of confusion is enhanced by the fact that the parties' goods are relatively inexpensive and thus consumers are not likely to exercise a high degree of care in purchasing.

#### **Count II -- Dilution - §43(c)**

16. Opposer's inherently distinctive ZARA Marks have been widely used and advertised in the United States and internationally for many years.

17. A substantial volume of clothing, footwear, and other products have been sold under Opposer's ZARA Marks throughout the United States and internationally.

18. The extent of consumer recognition of Opposer's ZARA Marks is substantial.

19. Because of the extensive use and advertising of Opposer's ZARA Marks, the substantial sales of products under the ZARA Marks, and the recognition of the ZARA Marks by the consuming public, Opposer's ZARA Marks have become famous as distinctive symbols of Opposer's goodwill.

20. Applicant has filed for, and is making unauthorized use in commerce of, a mark that is confusingly similar to one or more of Opposer's famous ZARA Marks.

21. Applicant's alleged use began long after Opposer's ZARA Marks became famous.

22. Applicant's alleged mark is likely to cause, and will cause, dilution of the distinctive qualities of Opposer's ZARA Marks by blurring and tarnishment.

23. Use or registration of Applicant's alleged mark will lessen the capacity of Opposer's famous ZARA Marks to identify and distinguish Opposer's goods and services.

24. Likelihood of dilution is enhanced by the fact that the dominant portion of Applicant's alleged mark, "ZARU," is nearly identical in appearance, sound, and overall commercial impression to Opposer's ZARA Marks or the dominant portions thereof.

25. Applicant's use or registration of Applicant's alleged mark will deprive Opposer of the ability to protect its reputation, persona, and goodwill.

26. Applicant's use or registration of Applicant's alleged mark will blur and tarnish the goodwill symbolized by Opposer's ZARA Marks.

27. Likelihood of tarnishment and damage to Opposer's goodwill are enhanced by the fact that prospective customers who encounter defects in the quality of Applicant's goods will attribute those defects to Opposer, and this will tarnish Opposer's reputation and goodwill.

28. By reason of the foregoing, Opposer will be damaged by the registration of Applicant's alleged mark, and registration should be refused.

WHEREFORE, Opposer respectfully requests that the registration sought by Applicant be refused and that this Opposition be sustained.
