I. INTRODUCTION.

The purpose of Opposition proceedings based on allegations of likelihood of confusion is focused on issues surrounding the impact of registration of a contested mark on the Principal Register. Applicant, likely recognizing the weaknesses of its position, attempts to draw the Board's attention to a number of irrelevant factors—*i.e.*, the volume of sales of the parties' respective LIFEJACKET products, whether speakers were within Opposer's natural zone of expansion in 2014, and whether the parties' LIFEJACKET products presently appear side-by-side at brick-and-mortar retailers. But the fact remains that what matters, and what this case is about, is whether registration of Applicant's LIFEJACKET mark is likely to cause consumer confusion, mistake or deception and damage Opposer.

This case is not about counterfeiting—whether consumers will think Applicant's LIFEJACKET speaker cases are Opposer's LIFEJACKET mobile device cases. This case is about whether consumers will mistakenly believe Applicant's goods come from Opposer or the source of Opposer's goods. This case is not about whether the parties' goods are side-by-side on shelves today. This case is about whether the use of Applicant's applied-for mark on Applicant's recited goods creates the risk of a likelihood of consumer confusion or mistake (today or in the future) as to the source of Applicant's goods.

This case is not about the state of the market in 2014 (Applicant's date of first use). The date restrictions Applicant seeks to apply to Opposer's evidence is based on Applicant's erroneous reliance on “zone of expansion” law, instead of law addressing the *duPont* factors. This case is about the entirety of the record presented by Opposer, most of which Applicant failed to address. Applicant did not present the Board with any counter-evidence. The record proves registration of LIFEJACKET to Applicant would be counter to 15 U.S.C. § 1052(d). This opposition should be sustained and the Board should refuse registration of Applicant's mark.

II. OPPOSER HAS STANDING THROUGH ITS OWNERSHIP OF AN INCONTESTABLE REGISTRATION AND CONTINUOUS USE OF THE LIFEJACKET MARK IN COMMERCE SINCE AT LEAST AS EARLY AS 2012.

Applicant suggests the Board can dispose of this opposition because Opposer has essentially abandoned its mark. To establish standing in an opposition, a plaintiff must prove that it has a “real interest,” *i.e.*, a “reasonable” basis for its belief of damage. *Empresa Cubana Del Tabaco v. Gen. Cigar Co.*, 111 U.S.P.Q.2d 1058, 1062 (Fed. Cir. 2014); *Ritchie v. Simpson*, 50 U.S.P.Q.2d 1023, 1025 (Fed. Cir. 1999); *Lipton Indus., Inc. v. Ralston Purina Co.*, 213 U.S.P.Q. 185, 189 (CCPA 1982). Applicant, in its brief, does not contest Opposer’s standing.

Opposer has established its standing by properly introducing into evidence its pleaded incontestable registration. *See, e.g., Cunningham v. Laser Golf Corp.*, 55 U.S.P.Q.2d 1842, 1844 (Fed. Cir. 2000); *N.Y. Yankees P’ship v. IET Prods. & Servs., Inc.*, 114 U.S.P.Q.2d 1497, 1501 (TTAB 2015). Opposer is to be afforded all presumptions given to an incontestable registration.

Abandonment has not been pled by Applicant nor proven. Notwithstanding, Opposer has introduced evidence of common law use of its LIFEJACKET mark. (32 TTABVUE 2-4.) That same evidence shows Opposer has not abandoned its mark. Specifically, [REDACTED]







(Vater Decl. ¶¶ 5-9.)

Opposer's LIFEJACKET products have also been the subject of substantial media coverage. (32 TTABVUE 4.) Exhibit 26² to Opposer's summary judgment brief listing media mentions of Opposer's products includes more than 25 articles specifically mentioning Opposer's LIFEJACKET products in publications such as Men's Journal, Boating Magazine, CNET, and Wired. (Decl. of Eric R. Chad ("Chad Decl.") Exs. 1-26.) A search on the Internet reveals dozens more. (Chad Decl. Exs. 28-42.)

For juxtaposition, Applicant failed to place into evidence any advertising, promotion, or media recognition for Applicant's LIFEJACKET speaker cases. The conclusion to draw is that Applicant's alleged [REDACTED] sales were made trading on the renown and goodwill of Opposer and its LIFEJACKET and LIFEPROOF brands. Opposer owns the LIFEJACKET trademark, and it has every interest in stopping competitors from appropriating its trademarks and avoiding consumer confusion.

III. APPLICANT'S LIFEJACKET MARK, ON APPLICANT'S GOODS, IS LIKELY TO CAUSE CONFUSION, MISTAKE OR DECEPTION.

Applicant's brief focuses on proving that Applicant's speaker cases are not mobile device cases. Applicant also focuses on the absence of confusion evidence; the absence of photographs of the parties' products directly side by side, today, on store shelves; and the alleged absence of commercial success of Opposer's LIFEJACKET product and decline in sales. All of these arguments are irrelevant in a Board proceeding under Section 2(d), which states:

No trademark by which the goods of the applicant may be distinguished from the goods of others shall be refused registration on the principal register on account of its nature unless it—

* * *

(d) consists of or comprises a mark which so resembles a mark registered in the Patent and Trademark Office or a mark or trade name previously used in the

United States by another and not abandoned, as to be likely, when used on or in connection with the goods of the applicant, to cause confusion, or to cause mistake, or to deceive

15 U.S.C. § 1052(d).

The statute does not require a challenger to prove consumers believe one product is the other. It simply requires proof of likely confusion, mistake, or deception in general. Confusion, mistake, or deception as to the source of Applicant's goods is actionable under § 2(d). *In re Cook Med. Techms. LLC*, 105 U.S.P.Q.2d 1377, 1379 (TTAB 2012).

Although Opposer does not believe this is a close case, the senior user of a mark is entitled to the benefit of any doubt as to a likelihood of confusion under §2(d) before the Board. *In re H.D. Vest, Inc.*, Ser. No. 77599306, 2011 WL 481330, at *5 (TTAB Jan. 31, 2011) (“To the extent there are any doubts, we resolve them, as we must, in registrant’s favor.”); *Interstate Brands Corp. v. McKee Foods Corp.*, 53 U.S.P.Q.2d 1910, 1915 (TTAB 2000) (“[O]ne who adopts a mark similar to the mark of another for the same or closely related goods or services does so at his own peril and any doubt as to the similarity of the marks must be resolved against him.”). All *duPont* factors weigh in favor of sustaining this opposition.

A. Priority is Proven: Opposer Used the LIFEJACKET Mark Before Applicant.

Applicant claims it has priority because Applicant used LIFEJACKET on speaker cases first. (37 TTABVUE 12.) But the legal question is which party used the mark first, generally. 15 U.S.C. § 1052(d) (stating a party must prove that, vis-à-vis the other party, it owns “a mark or trade name previously used in the United States...and not abandoned”); *Warner Bros. Entm’t, Inc. v. Kaplan Tr.*, Cancellation No. 92043813, 2007 TTAB LEXIS 194, at *6 (TTAB Aug. 22, 2007) (non-precedential). Applicant admits “with respect to protective cases for cell phones, smart phones[,] and tablet computers, [Opposer] has priority with respect to” the LIFEJACKET mark. (37 TTABVUE 12.) Opposer established priority for this proceeding.

Applicant's cited cases address priority under the irrelevant "zone of expansion" doctrine, which is a priority doctrine in cases involving *unrelated* goods and intervening rights. 4 J. THOMAS MCCARTHY, MCCARTHY ON TRADEMARKS AND UNFAIR COMPETITION § 24.20 (5th ed.). This doctrine allows a senior user to tack on priority of use of a mark on *unrelated* goods if the senior user can prove consumers might "reasonably expect [the junior user's goods] to emanate from [the senior user] in the normal expansion of [the senior user's] business under the mark." *Mason Eng'g v. Mateson Chem. Corp.*, 225 U.S.P.Q. 956, 962 (TTAB 1985). The time period for assessing the zone of expansion question is "when the subsequent user first began to do business under its mark." *Id.* This doctrine does not apply in this case.

B. The Parties' Marks are Identical in Sight, Sound and Commercial Impression.

Applicant acknowledges in its responsive brief that the parties' LIFEJACKET marks are visually and phonetically "essentially the same." (37 TTABVUE 16.) Applicant's use of a house mark—ALTEC LANSING—does not alter the sight and sound similarities because the house mark is not included in the applied-for mark. *See In re Microsoft Corp.*, 68 U.S.P.Q.2d 1195, 1199 (TTAB 2003) (holding that plans to use house mark MICROSOFT in combination with the applied-for mark OFFICE.NET is irrelevant to whether that applied-for mark is confusingly similar to the previously registered mark OFFICENET for competitive software).

The parties' marks have the same meaning and commercial impression. Applicant argues its LIFEJACKET mark is a play on its "successful JACKET branded products" (37 TTABVUE 17), but presents no evidence to prove its JACKET products were successful or that consumers recognize the JACKET name. The evidence and 30(b)(6) testimony shows the marks convey the same commercial impression, namely, that the parties' LIFEJACKET products have waterproof and floatation features, among other benefits. (32 TTABVUE 12.) The parties' marks are identical in appearance, sound, connotation, and commercial impression.

C. A Viable Relationship Exists Between the Parties' Goods: They Are Related.

When the parties' marks are identical, the degree of similarity between the goods that is required to support a finding of likelihood of confusion declines. *In re Shell Oil Co.*, 26 U.S.P.Q.2d 1687, 1688-89 (Fed. Cir. 1993) (“[E]ven when the goods or services are not competitive or intrinsically related, the use of identical marks can lead to the assumption that there is a common source”); *Time Warner Entm't Co. v. Jones*, 65 U.S.P.Q.2d 1650, 1661 (TTAB 2002); *In re Opus One Inc.*, 60 U.S.P.Q.2d 1812, 1815 (TTAB 2001). The issue here is not whether purchasers would confuse the parties' goods (e.g., counterfeits), but rather whether there is a likelihood of confusion, mistake or deception **as to the source** of Applicant's goods. *Peter Piper, Inc. v. OTG Experience, LLC*, Opp. No. 91230289, Op. at *22 (TTAB Nov. 15, 2018) (non-precedential); *In re Cook Med. Techns. LLC*, 105 U.S.P.Q.2d 1377, 1380 (TTAB 2012). A “viable relationship between the goods” will support a finding of likelihood of confusion. *In re Thor Tech Inc.*, 90 U.S.P.Q.2d 1634, 1636 (TTAB 2009); *see also Peter Piper*, Op. at *22.

Opposer's evidence, summarized below, proves a viable relationship exists between Applicant and its cases for speakers, on the one hand, and Opposer and its cases for tablets/mobile phones, on the other hand:

- Many third parties have applied for and obtained use-based trademark registrations for both parties' goods.
- Many third parties use the same marks on both parties' goods.
- The goods are complementary because they are the type of goods that can be used together, as shown by Applicant's own social media pages.
- The goods are the type that are sold in the same sections of the same stores.
- Applicant attempted to register the LIFEJACKET mark (or very similar marks) for both phone and speaker cases.

(32 TTABVUE 18-23). Applicant provided no evidence to refute Opposer's evidence, only attorney argument and incorrect statements of law.

Specifically, Applicant did not provide any evidence that contradicts Opposer’s proof (and Applicant’s social media pictures) that cases for mobile devices and cases for speakers can be used at the same time, together³ (32 TTABVUE 14-16). Applicant did not provide any evidence that shows Applicant’s goods are sold far away from mobile device cases in stores. Applicant did not contest it uses the same marketing messages to sell its products as Opposer—snow proof, water proof, sand proof, etc. (32 TTABVUE 16-17). Applicant provided no evidence, other than argument, to contest Opposer’s evidence showing Opposer is widely diversified in the mobile device accessory space. (32 TTABVUE 35.) Aside from attorney argument, Opposer’s evidence is unrebutted. Applicant’s other arguments are legally wrong, as discussed below.

1. Relatedness Must Be Assessed Based on the Goods Claimed in Applicant’s Application Only.

Applicant asserts that “a protective covering for a cell phone or tablet computer, is a very different product from” “a speaker that includes a replaceable protective case.” (37 TTABVUE 19.) This argument is legally wrong for two reasons. First, product confusion is not the relevant legal issue—*source confusion/deception/mistake is the issue*. *Peter Piper*, Op. at *22.

Second, Applicant’s applied-for goods are cases for speakers, not the speakers themselves. In assessing the similarity or dissimilarity of the goods and services, the Board must consider the goods as they are described in the application and registration. *Stone Lion Capital Partners, LP v. Lion Capital LLP*, 110 U.S.P.Q.2d 1157, 1161 (Fed. Cir. 2014). As a result, the Board cannot give

³ Applicant attempts to rebut this fact with only attorney argument that the products are not “used together.” (37 TTABVUE 22.) Applicant’s own social media posts demonstrate the contrary. For instance, two photographs from Applicant’s Instagram page depict mobile phones, with protective cases, being used with Applicant’s LIFEJACKET speakers in a complete system. A potential consumer, evaluating such a system and learning that both the phone case and the speaker were both branded LIFEJACKET could only conclude that they came from the same source. 4 J. any probative value to Applicant's argument that its "LIFEJACKET product" is "a removable case that goes around the speaker" that is "not sold separately" from the speaker. (37 TTABVUE at 3.) There is nothing in Applicant's description of goods that prevents Applicant from offering speaker cases separately. *See, e.g., Peter Piper, Op.* at *22. ("[W]e cannot give any probative value to Applicant's argument that it does not intend to use its marks in connection with offering food related services or products sold directly to end consumers at airports, because there is nothing in Applicant's description of goods and services that prevents Applicant from offering those goods and services to the ultimate consumers at airports.")

2. Whether the Parties' Goods are Side-By-Side in Stores, Today, is Not Relevant to the Relatedness Inquiry.

Applicant contends the parties' goods are not related because Opposer failed to produce a photograph of the parties' respective products side-by-side in stores. This argument is legally wrong for two reasons. First, this *duPont* factor simply asks whether there is a viable relationship between the applied-for goods, and the registrant's goods. Applicant's test is too limiting and contrary to case law.

Second, side-by-side proof is not required where an application lacks restrictions, because "goods and services are presumed to travel in the same channels of trade to the same class of purchasers." *In re Hughes Furniture Industries, Inc.*, 114 U.S.P.Q.2d 1134, 1137 (TTAB 2015) ("Because the identifications of goods in the application and registration are legally identical and unrestricted as to trade channels, we must also presume that both Applicant's and Registrant's legally identical products travel in the same ordinary trade and distribution channels and will be marketed to the same potential consumers."); *see also* TMEP § 1207.01(a)(iii). Absent restrictions, similarity in the parties' marks and goods is presumed to create the present or future possibility of the products side-by-side on store shelves. Opposer has presented more than enough evidence to show that consumers would draw this conclusion.

3. Opposer’s Third Party Registrations and Third Party Usage Evidence are Relevant and From the Proper Time Frame.

Applicant tells the Board to ignore Opposer’s evidence of third party registrations and third party use⁴ because the evidence is not exclusively dated before 2014. Applicant again mixes up the zone of expansion doctrine and a straightforward likelihood of confusion analysis. The zone of expansion/doctrine of natural expansion is a priority doctrine. Separately, the relatedness of goods is a factor to be considered under *In re E.I. du Pont de Nemours & Co.*, 476 F.2d 1357, 1361 (C.C.P.A. 1973) (hereinafter “*duPont*”). These are two distinct principles.

The correct timeframe for factual evidence supporting a *duPont* analysis in a Board proceeding is up through trial, not a snapshot in time when Applicant adopted the LIFEJACKET mark. *See Hornby v. TJJ Cos., Inc.*, Cancellation No. 92044369, 2008 WL 1897568, at *4 (TTAB Apr. 22, 2008) (“[W]ith respect to the petitioner’s likelihood of confusion claim, our determination is based on the factual situation as of the time of trial”); *Virgin Enters. Ltd. v. Albion Motors Ford Mercury, Inc.*, Opp. Nos. 91153575, 91153612, 91154161, 2007 WL 2344691, at *16 (TTAB Aug. 10, 2007) (non-precedential) (“[T]he Board generally accepts and considers evidence related to likelihood of confusion and similar issues for the period up to the time of trial.”). Opposer’s evidence proving the viable relationship between the parties’ goods can be dated up through trial.

The single case cited and quoted by Applicant addresses the priority doctrine of natural expansion/zone of expansion. In that case, *Technology Advancement Group*, the excerpt from the Board’s decision cited by Applicant (37 TTABVUE 20-21) appears in the section of the decision addressing “Priority,” not “Likelihood of Confusion.” Cancellation Nos. 92028748, 92028775,

⁴ In its responsive brief, Applicant falsely asserts that the examples of third-party use and/or third-party registrations is limited to circumstance in which the third party used or registered the same mark for protective cases for mobile electronics and speakers but not speaker cases. (37 TTABVUE 21.) This is incorrect. In its opening brief, Opposer cited numerous examples of third parties that registered or used the same mark for both protective cases for mobile electronics *and* for speaker *cases*. (32 TTABVUE 19-23.)

and 92028781, 2005 TTAB LEXIS 290, at *11, 24-26. This case does not support Applicant's misconstruction of the law.

Applicant also challenges the relevance of Opposer's 50+ third party registrations and examples of third party use of trademarks on both speakers and cases for mobile devices. Applicant says this evidence is not relevant because Applicant's applied-for goods are cases for speakers. Yet, throughout its brief, Applicant refers to its own LIFEJACKET product as just a speaker, or a "speaker that includes a replaceable protective case."⁵ Applicant views its case and speaker as connected. Opposer's evidence expands on this theory, showing consumers, and the PTO, know that the same companies use the same marks on (1) speakers and cases for speakers; and (2) cases for mobile devices. A viable relationship between all three of these products exists.

Applicant was free to compile evidence that the USPTO has registered the same mark to different parties for the goods in question, but did not. *See, e.g., In re G.B.I. Tile and Stone Inc.*, 92 U.S.P.Q.2d 1366, 1369-70 (TTAB 2009) (Third party registrations supported argument that cited registration's roofing tiles and applicant's floor tiles were likely to originate from a common source; Board noted that applicant can also cite third party registrations to suggest opposite: that USPTO has registered same mark to different parties for goods in question). Opposer's evidence is unchallenged.

⁵ For instance, in its brief, Applicant makes each of the following statements: "Sakar developed a new speaker [and] . . . selected LIFEJACKET as the name of the new product." (37 TTABVUE 2-3.) "[T]he LIFEJACKET branded product is sold under the ALTEC LANSING name, and the speaker portion prominently displays that name." (*Id.* at 3.) "The LIFEJACKET branded products compete against higher-end audio brands such as Bose, JBL and Sony." (*Id.* at 4.) "The LIFEJACKET branded products have a retail price, depending on the model, from between \$69 and \$299." (*Id.* at 6.) "LIFEJACKET branded products are sold in the electronics section of retailers where audio speakers are sold." (*Id.*) "The LIFEJACKET name would certainly not be one that a consumer would expect to be used with a speaker." (*Id.* at 20.) Applicant also includes in its brief a table listing the unit and dollar sales of its LIFEJACKET product. To be clear, these are sales of speakers, not protective case speakers.

D. Applicant Lacks Support for the Contention that it Sells to Audiophiles.

Applicant contends it targets “audiophiles knowledgeable of the ALTEC LANSING brand.” (37 TTABVUE 16.) The three exhibits cited do not support its “audiophile” customer theory. Two exhibits were created in the context of these proceedings, namely (1) the deposition testimony of Applicant’s 30(b)(6) designee (37 TTABVUE at Remaklus Decl. Ex. 1 at 37-38) and (2) Applicant’s answers to interrogatories (37 TTABVUE at Remaklus Ex. 2 at Resp. to Interrog. No. 5). The Board should give little or no weight to such self-serving statements made in the context of these proceedings. *Rogers Corp. v. Fields Plastics & Chems., Inc.*, 176 U.S.P.Q. 280, 282 (TTAB 1972) (“The opinion of opposer’s vice-president on the issue before us is nothing more than a self-serving statement by an interested party and, as such, is devoid of probative value in a proceeding of this character.”); *Fuld Bros., Inc. v. Carpet Techn. Serv. Inst., Inc.*, 174 U.S.P.Q. 473, 476 (TTAB 1972) (finding self-serving statements inadmissible).

The third citation, an apparent PowerPoint presentation, highlights the “rugged” nature of Applicant’s speakers and not audio features. (37 TTABVUE at Remaklus Ex. 7). Applicant’s other examples in its brief, namely the images on page 4 and 5, again focus on the rugged nature and not the audio quality. Both parties target general consumers; this factor weighs in favor of Opposer.

E. The Level of Commercial Success of Opposer’s LIFEJACKET Products does not Weigh in Favor of Applicant.

Applicant tells the Board that because the LIFEJACKET mark is not famous, and its sales decreased year over year, it must be weak. But the absence of evidence that a mark is famous or a global best-seller does not support the conclusion that Opposer’s mark is conceptually or commercially weak. 15 U.S.C. § 1052(d) does not solely protect famous marks that have been wildly commercially successful. An applicant cannot register a similar mark simply because a prior registrant’s use is relatively small: “A newcomer does not gain the right to register a substantially identical mark simply because the number of persons exposed to the

registrant's mark may be small in relation to the newcomer's volume of use." *In re Shell Oil Co.*, 992 F.2d 1204, 26 U.S.P.Q.2d 1687 (Fed. Cir. 1993) (noting that reverse confusion may harm the prior registrant).


Setting fame aside, the evidence shows Registrant's LIFEJACKET mark is conceptually strong. Opposer owns an incontestable registration on the principal register. Applicant did not present any evidence of dilution. The mark is not descriptive, and is at the very least suggestive.

As to commercial strength, Opposer sold millions of dollars of LIFEJACKET products. Opposer marketed the products at large trade shows, with point-of-sale advertising at nationwide retailers, and the products have received nationwide unsolicited media attention. *Supra*, Section II. The products are sold online today, including on Amazon.com. (Vater Decl. ¶ 3.) Whether Opposer sells a large number of LIFEJACKET cases today in retail stores is not legally relevant, and Applicant provides no law for this proposition. The strength of the mark favors Opposer.

F. The Absence of a Large Number of Reports of Actual Confusion is not Dispositive.

1. Opposer Produced Evidence of Confusion and Mistake.

Legally, confusion evidence is not limited to purchasers confusing the parties' goods, it can also be confusion or mistake as to the source of these goods and services. *Cook Med. Techns. LLC*, 105 USPQ2d 1377, 1380 (TTAB 2012). Here, Opposer presented evidence of a user review of one of Applicant's LIFEJACKET speakers that attributed Opposer *as the source*:



(32 TTABVUE at 31.)

Applicant attempts to explain this instance of actual confusion as to source based on two faulty assumptions. First, Applicant assumes that, because the reviewer posted her or his review on the webpage for Applicant's LIFEJACKET 3 product, the reviewer knew the product came from Applicant, rather than Opposer. But it is entirely possible that the reviewer knew he or she had purchased a speaker branded LIFEJACKET without knowing Applicant.

Second, Applicant assumes that, because Opposer was not selling speakers at the time the review was posted, the reviewer could not have believed that the speaker came from Opposer. To the contrary, this post shows the relatedness of the goods. This customer saw LIFEJACKET, believed the speaker/speaker case came from Opposer and identified Lifeproof as the source.

More reasonable than accepting Applicant's unsupported assumptions is to take the review at face value: the reviewer purchased a speaker branded LIFEJACKET and associated the speaker and name with Opposer's LIFEPROOF products. This supports a conclusion that consumer confusion or mistake is likely.

Since Opposer's opening brief, Opposer has uncovered an additional instance of actual confusion. Specifically, a user operating under the handle R. Hammer reviewed a Life Jacket 2 speaker with model number iMW575. In the review, the reviewer identified the speaker as "The iMW577 'Lifeproof' speaker."

We live on the lake and our two kids love to spend most of the day in the water. We have tried multiple portable bluetooth speakers but the volume ability of some of those speakers in the can that we tried simply weren't impressive (and certainly not waterproof). The iMW577 "Lifeproof" speaker come with IP67 rating (same as iPhone 7) meaning that it can withstand up to 30 minutes in water down to 1m (about 3') and resists dust.

(Chad Decl. Ex. 27.) Again, this consumer believed *Opposer, d/b/a LIFEPROOF, was the source* of this LIFEJACKET product. This review further demonstrates that consumer confusion is likely between the parties' respective LIFEJACKET marks.

2. An Absence of Actual Confusion Does Not Prove No Confusion; the Absence of Evidence is Not Dispositive.

If the Board is not persuaded by Opposer's evidence, the only conclusion the Board may draw is that there is no evidence of any actual confusion known to the parties in the record. *Chevron Chem. Co. v. Voluntary Purchasing Grps., Inc.*, 212 U.S.P.Q. 904, 913 (5th Cir. 1981) (absence of evidence of actual confusion does not necessarily prove the converse because of difficulty of detection of instances of actual confusion); *see also CAE, Inc. v. Clean Air Eng'g, Inc.*, 60 U.S.P.Q.2d 1449, 1467 (7th Cir. 2001) (finding that a 25-year history without reported incidents of actual confusion does not prevent a finding that confusion is likely and "the most that the absence of evidence of factual confusion can be said to indicate is that the record does not contain any evidence of actual confusion known to the parties.").

The absence of evidence of actual confusion is of little weight and not dispositive in Board proceedings. *Nash-Finch Co. v. Ahold Licensing Sarl*, Cancellation No. 92058000, 2016 TTAB LEXIS 183, at *23 (TTAB May 6, 2016) ("[I]t is well-settled that . . . while the presence of confusion may be very useful to our analysis, the lack of evidence of actual confusion carries little weight.")⁶ Applicant's case law does not stand for the proposition that the absence of evidence of actual confusion is dispositive.

⁶ *See also Herbko Int'l Inc. v. Kappa Books, Inc.*, 308 F.3d 1156, 1165 (Fed. Cir. 2002); *J. C. Hall Co. v. Hallmark Cards, Inc.*, 144 U.S.P.Q. 435, 438 (C.C.P.A. 1965) ("Absence of proof of actual confusion is of minor relevancy in the resolution of the issue."); *Lebanon Seaboard Corp. v. R & R Turf Supply, Inc.*, 101 U.S.P.Q.2d 1826, 1834 (TTAB 2012) ("We recognize that evidence of actual confusion is difficult to obtain."). Instead, factors such as similarity of the marks and relatedness of the goods can be dispositive factors. *Herbko*, 308 F.3d at 1164.

Applicant first relies on *Citigroup Inc. v. Capital City Bank Group, Inc.*, 94 U.S.P.Q.2d 1645 (TTAB 2010). Though the Board did find the absence of actual confusion weighed in favor of the applicant in that proceeding, it was one of several factors the Board found in applicant's favor. *Id.* at 1664-65. The Board also found there were "significant" differences between the parties' marks and the consuming public would find the words "City" and "Bank" in the applicant's mark were generic descriptions identifying a community bank. *Id.* at 1664. Also distinguishable are *INTS It Is Not The Same GmbH v. Disidual Clothing, LLC*, Opp. No. 91212768, 2017 TTAB LEXIS 388 (Sept. 28, 2017), *CareFirst of Md., Inc. v. First Care, P.C.*, 434 F.3d 263 (4th Cir. 2006), *Oreck Corp. v. U.S. Floor Sys.*, 803 F.2d 166 (5th Cir. 1986), and *Pignons S.A. de Macanique de Precision v. Polaroid Corp.*, 657 F.2d 482 (1st Cir. 1981). As in *Citigroup*, the Board in *INTS* found that the marks at issue were dissimilar, and, in *CareFirst*, *Oreck*, and *Pignons*, the Fourth, Fifth, and First Circuits, respectively, held that *none* of the likelihood of confusion factors favored the plaintiff. *INTS*, 2017 TTAB LEXIS 338, at *24-25; *Carefirst*, 434 F.3d 274; *Oreck*, 803 F.2d at 174; *Pignons*, 657 F.3d at 492.

In both *Barbara's Bakery* and *Gillette Canada*, cited in the excerpt from *Citigroup* quoted by Applicant, the Board found that confusion was likely and sustained the opposer's oppositions, despite the fact that the record was devoid of evidence of actual confusion. *Barbara's Bakery Inc. v. Landesman*, 82 U.S.P.Q.2d 1283, 1287, 1289 (TTAB 2007); *Gillette Canada Inc. v. Ranir Corp.*, 23 U.S.P.Q.2d 1768, 1773 (TTAB 1992). In both *Red Carpet* and *Central Soya*, also cited in Applicant's excerpt from *Citigroup*, the Board found the design marks at issue were dissimilar from opposer's. *Red Carpet Corp. v. Johnstown Am. Enters. Inc.*, 7 U.S.P.Q.2d 1404, 1407 (TTAB 1988); *Central Soya Co., Inc. v. N. Am. Plant Breeders*, Opp. No. 62,591, 1981 TTAB LEXIS 5, at *32 (TTAB Sept. 4, 1981).

Finally, in *Lever Brothers Co. v. American Bakeries Co.*, while the court did find an absence of actual confusion to be relevant, it found that five of the remaining six factors under the Second Circuit’s likelihood-of-confusion test also warranted a finding that confusion was unlikely. *Lever Bros.*, 693 F.2d 251, 259 (2d Cir. 1982). These cases are in stark contrast to this case, where many, if not all, of the *duPont* factors favor Opposer.

IV. APPLICANT’S LIFEJACKET MARK IS ALSO CONFUSINGLY SIMILAR TO OPPOSER’S LIFEPROOF MARK.

Applicant does not challenge Opposer’s registrations or priority date for Opposer’ LIFEPROOF marks. (*See* 32 TTABVUE 40-41.) Applicant instead attacks Opposer’s rights in its LIFEACTIV mark because it is not registered. A party may prevail on a claim of likelihood of confusion based on its ownership of common law rights in a mark where the mark is distinctive, inherently or otherwise, and the party can show priority of use based on prior trademark use. *Wet Seal Inc. v. FD Mgmt. Inc.*, 82 U.S.P.Q.2d 1629, 1634 (TTAB 2007). Here, Opposer has provided a specimen of the LIFEACTIV mark (32 TTABVUE at Vater Decl. Ex. 2), testimony regarding continuous use (Vater Decl. ¶ 11), and sales information showing sales of LIFEACTIV products back to 2015. (11 TTABVUE at Chad Decl. Ex. 12.) The evidence shows Opposer owns a family of LIFE marks: LIFEPROOF, LIFEJACKET and LIFEACTIV.

Applicant attacks the similarity of the marks. The similarity between LIFEJACKET and the LIFEPROOF marks is proven with Opposer’s evidence of actual confusion. Consumers see Applicant’s LIFEJACKET mark and think of LIFEPROOF. *Supra* at Section III(F)(1). Further, the parties’ marks convey the same meaning—protection. The commercial impression is the same, given that both parties focus on the protective features of the products. Applicant touts its own LIFEJACKET product is “shock proof . . . and also waterproof” and “waterproof, sand proof, snow proof and shock proof – which equals everything proof.” (37 TTABVUE 2, 5.) Applicant admits Opposer markets using the same messaging. (*Id.* at 24.)

Applicant argues Opposer must prove the strength of its LIFEPROOF mark in 2014, not 2017.⁷ (37 TTABVUE at 25.) Applicant cites no case law for this proposition. There is none. Evidence supporting the *duPont* factors can be dated up through the time of trial. *See Hornby v. TJX Cos., Inc.*, Cancellation No. 92044369, 2008 WL 1897568, at *4 (TTAB Apr. 22, 2008) (“[W]ith respect to the petitioner’s likelihood of confusion claim, our determination is based on the factual situation as of the time of trial . . .”). Opposer’s evidence of the strength of its LIFEPROOF marks stands unrebutted. (*See* 32 TTABVUE 34.) Given the fame of the LIFEPROOF mark, as well as Opposer’s LIFE family of marks, consumers are likely to believe that Applicant’s LIFEJACKET product—a mobile device accessory—comes from Opposer. The opposition should be sustained.

V. APPLICANT DOES NOT ADDRESS ITS FAILURE TO USE THE LIFEJACKET MARK ON THE GOODS IDENTIFIED IN ITS APPLICATION.

As Opposer explained in its opening brief, Applicant does not actually use its LIFEJACKET mark in connection with the sale of speaker cases despite the fact that Applicant’s pending application is a use-based application for the LIFEJACKET mark used in connection with speaker cases. (32 TTABVUE 36.) Rather, Applicant sells speakers, and only speakers, under the LIFEJACKET mark. Speaker cases are not sold separately and are offered separately only as a replacement part. (*Id.*) In circumstances such as these, refusal of an application is proper. *J.E.M. Int’l Inc. v. Happy Rompers Creations Corp.*, 74 U.S.P.Q.2d 1526, 1530 (TTAB 2005) (non-precedential) (“[T]he USPTO will not issue a registration based on use covering goods upon which the mark has not been used, . . .”); *Herbaceuticals, Inc. v. Xel Herbaceuticals, Inc.*, 86 U.S.P.Q.2d 1572, 1576 (TTAB 2008) (gathering cases). Far from providing persuasive authority rebutting this

⁷ Applicant also argues the parties’ channels of trade are not similar, the parties target different consumers and that the parties’ goods are expensive. These issues are addressed in this Reply, *supra*, at III(c)(2), and Opposer’s main brief at 34.

fact, Applicant ignores it completely. This failure is significant and, by itself, warrants a refusal of Applicant's application.

VI. CONCLUSION.

As Opposer explained in its opening brief, an opposition should be sustained. Opposer proved that a likelihood of confusion, mistake or deception exists and Opposer will be damaged by registration of the mark at issue. For the reasons set forth above, as well as those articulated in Opposer's opening brief and in connection with its motion for partial summary judgment, Opposer requests that the Board sustain the opposition and refuse registration to Applicant's application.







With the incalculable number of boating apps, your mobile phone becomes increasingly valuable on board, which is a problem if it's still vulnerable to water damage.

Of course, you can shield your phone from spray or an incidental dunking in the livewell with a protector such as a LifeProof Fre waterproof case (\$79.99 for an iPhone 5; lifeproof.com).

These are great for boaters, yet even with a case, your phone won't float; if you drop it overboard in deep water, you're incommunicado.

To the rescue is the LifeProof LifeJacket (\$39.99 for an iPhone 5 case). Molded from closed-cell foam, it fits snugly around the company's waterproof case. The bright distress-orange color makes it easy to find if your phone goes in the drink.

Like many real life jackets, the case adds bulk, so it can be difficult to stuff in your pocket, but it comes with lanyards — one for your neck and one for your wrist. I like to wear mine around my neck, tucking it under the jacket to keep it from whipping about in rough water.

So when it was time to upgrade to a new smart phone—a necessary yet expensive investment—our intrepid editor took the smart step to protect this smart technology

against the mishaps that occasionally befall its operator. Enter the LifeProof (<http://www.lifeproof.com/>) FRĒ case for iPhone 6 (\$79.99). The company also makes similar cases for Samsung, LG, and Motorola smartphones. Made to meet the U.S. Military Standard for drop and shock protection, it's also waterproof up to 6.6 feet for one hour. The case is built using a combination of materials, principally polycarbonate, synthetic rubber, and silicone. LifeProof certifies that it water-tests all of its products and conducts an additional inspection, including a second water test, on random units. Cases that leak don't make the cut.

Knowing that a high-tech case may not provide enough protection, Dollar paired it with LifeProof's LifeJacket, a safety orange, foam flotation device that keeps his smartphone afloat while adding even more shock protection should he bounce it off the deck of a boat. It slips on and off easily, and since the FRĒ case allows all key features to remain in play, he's free to snap

photos, shoot videos, and deliver on-the-water fishing reports without fear of a costly fumble. *by Captain Chris D. Dollar*



What makes the LifeProof case, lifeproof, is the rubber gasket that follows the perimeter on the inside of the case. It is very important to keep this gasket clear of any debris, no matter how small, in order to keep the case functioning at 100%. The case comes in two pieces and snaps together, sealing the yellow gasket. The battery cable port also has a large gasket that seals the entrance, and hinges open when charging is needed. Unfortunately, aftermarket chargers that have a larger cable than the OEM iPhone cable will not be able to fit with the case on.

One thing that really sold me on the LifeProof case over my current Otterbox was the simple ease of getting the phone in and out of my pocket. I would get so angry when I would have to wrestle and rip out my phone from my pocket, and instead of pulling out a pile of lint every time and having the case look used with the Otterbox, I was happy to store the phone in my pocket until needed with the Lifeproof.

As far as durability, the case is made with a tough polycarbonate frame and has shock absorbing elastomer. Just before writing this review my iPhone took it's worst drop yet getting out of the truck, straight down on the concrete. Feeling confident I picked it up and yes, it was still functioning great, only leaving a nice battle scar.



For you runners and gym rats out there, LifeProof has made a great workout companion in a snug, comfortable workout band. This is perfect timing because I just started training to run my first marathon in December and have been able to give it a few good sweat tests already. But what happens when you need to make/take a phone call on the water and you're possibly in fifty feet of water? Be real careful? Yes. For additional security you can pick up a LifeJacket to go over the LifeProof case. It give the phone buoyancy and additional shock protection with high-vis, tear and stain resistant foam, and it's also easy to install and remove when needed.

I did a little test with the LifeJacket by filling up a bowl of water and dropping the iPhone in it. To my relief, the little phone happily floated around while water completely covered it at the first dunk. This will be EXTREMELY helpful when in rough water on the kayak and will certainly give me a little more piece of mind when getting out my phone to take a picture or get a call.



Review: LifeProof iPhone case!

A funny thing happened when I put my iPhone in a [Lifeproof case](#)... I didn't take it out again! Considering how much I prefer my iPhone to be case-less and stark naked, that's a big compliment.

Lifeproof cases are the ultimate in water, dirt, shock, and snow protection. It would take forever to describe all the ways this case protects, so instead I will send you over to Lifeproof's website to check out the [Four Proofs](#).

But first dig the Lifeproof video!



I love that Lifeproof protects your iPhone from spaghetti!

Does it protect against drops? Yes indeed. I bumped and dropped my iPhone several times over the last couple of weeks, and each time it emerged unscathed and unshattered. The great thing about Lifeproof's case is that you can use the phone exactly as you would normally do without the case; browse the web, answer and make calls, etc. You know what this means don't you... yes, you can listen to music and make phone calls underwater! :-D

Sure there's a difference in the tactile feel and size of the iPhone in the case, and the plastic covering the glass screen is weird at first, but it's a small difference, and you'll quickly get used to that, and grow to appreciate the extra grip this case gives you. You'll mainly notice some difficulty with small interface buttons on apps, but just press a little harder than normal and you're fine.

I also tried out the armband, which holds the Lifeproof case super securely to your upper arm. I'm not a huge fan of armbands, but this one does its job great. Using it, I took my phone out paddle boarding, something I would never, EVER consider doing before. It was cool to know I had my phone with me, just in case of emergency, or an insatiable desire to check my email. If you are around water a lot with your phone, check out the [Floating LifeJacket accessory](#).

One downside, if you take a lot of pictures with your iPhone, you'll probably want to take it out of the case first so they are the best quality possible. The Lifeproof's lens is pretty invisible, but I found, like any additional lens, it takes away a little bit of the clarity from pictures. And the tiniest of nitpicks, the case

reverses the direction your finger must push to mute the phone. No big deal, just takes a bit to get used to.

Final words: if you are like me, and find yourself out at the beach or on the water, or throwing your phone in a knapsack occasionally, or doing gardening, carpentry, construction, or other dirty work with your iPhone in your pocket, you will want, need, and must have a Lifeproof in your life.

Lifeproof case comes in black or white and retail for around **\$80**, and perhaps even cheaper (55 bucks!) over at [Amazon](#). Available in six different colors too!

Some smartphones are IP67 certified, meaning that you can use them in water – for a limited time, though – in order to take some quick pictures and videos. Still, you should be very careful while doing this, since dropping a smartphone in water is bad news. Unless you have a floating phone case, of course.

No, we're not talking about classic [waterproof cases](#), which allow your phone to stay underwater for a longer period. These are way cooler since they keep your phone above the surface of the water, even if you accidentally drop them. And there are a lot of them, so it can be relatively difficult for you to pick one.

Fortunately, we did all the research for you and chosen a few models which are definitely worth the money. Without much further ado, let's see which is the best floating phone case you can currently get! 

PS: Since we really don't know what phones you guys are using, we're going to make a list of cases for both iOS and Android smartphones.

LifeProof Waterproof Case with LifeJacket

That's a fancy title, isn't it? A lot of people are praising this company's ability to make a good floating phone case and we tend to believe that they're doing a great job. Unfortunately, it's available just for iPhones, but don't worry Android users, we have something for you as well.



So, to make things clear, this is actually a duo: the LifeProof case, which makes the phone waterproof up to 6 feet, as well as the LifeJacket, an additional accessory that wraps around the phone as a second layer and makes it float.

The combo includes a pair of waterproof headphones, so you can listen to music as you swim, as a side note.

If you ask us, this is by far the most interesting and efficient floating phone case for your iPhone. However, it doesn't come for cheap, being available at \$120.



3iArt Floating Waterproof Case

Next in our top comes a universal case, able to fit phone up to 7 inches and featuring an IPX8 rating, meaning that your phone can go 100 feet deep and still survive.



At a first look, there's nothing special about it, but after examining it for a few moments you will notice the special sleeve which allows your phone to float with this case on it.

It also includes a 3.5mm plug, which allows you to connect headphones while using this floating phone case, through an outside port. Waterproof headphones, that is. By the way, unlike the previous model, this is almost ten times cheaper.



Chums Float

What we have here is not actually a floating phone case, but an accessory that you can attach to your smartphone. Or to a camera, as a side note.



Made of high-density buoyant foam, it can keep any device you attach from it above the water. Simple as that. The only minus is that it attaches to your phone through a string, so you need a case that's compatible with it. Otherwise, it's a great alternative to any expensive case and it does the job!



The market is full of similar products, but, if you ask us if you are looking for a floating phone case, one of these three models are enough even for the most demanding users. Just make sure you don't keep your phone in water for longer periods since none of these cases can guarantee infinite waterproofing.

Life Jackets For Your Smartphone

Just because you take it boating doesn't mean your smartphone is up for a plunge. Be prepared for when the unexpected happens.

We're navigating with our mobile devices, communicating with them, checking the weather, and shooting videos. We're swiping and tapping and rocking our modern life. Everything is groovy, until a big wave slams into the boat and sends the tablet crashing to the deck. Or maybe one of the kids didn't realize you shouldn't put a smartphone down on a sandy beach. Perhaps you leaned over just a bit too far in the kayak to get that great picture and — oh, no! — your fancy new phone is now an underwater camera.

Until recently, many of us made do on the water with a Ziploc-style sandwich bag and a prayer. Better than nothing. But we knew deep down that what we really needed was a serious PFD — Protection For (our) Device.

Just in time, the aftermarket has stepped up with dozens of solutions that promise to protect your expensive mini-computer without compromising functionality. Styles and prices vary, but they typically fall into three broad categories.

Waterproof-Shockproof-Dustproof

These are the most common and tend to be the most expensive. Prices range from \$70 for a phone to \$130 for a tablet. They're typically made of polycarbonate plastic that seals your device in a watertight cocoon. They're specifically sized, chiefly for Apple and Samsung products. Check that what you want will exactly fit what you have.

You also might see claims that a phone or tablet can be dropped from a certain height, without damage. In the marketing literature, you may notice that the case meets Military Standard 810. That standard includes a series of tests, such as dropping a device 26 times on different edges from four feet high, and even surviving gunfire vibration (hopefully you won't need that).


Case makers also tout waterproof standards, and it's common to see claims that a device can stay dry for a certain period of time at a specific depth. This is a reference to IP-68, an international standard that translates to submerging a device one hour in two meters of water, or 6.6 feet. It also means a high level of protection from dust and debris.

Can you count on these standards to protect a sophisticated piece of electronics costing hundreds of dollars? Probably, but defects do happen. Prudent buyers should test their new cases first by placing a piece of cotton or tissue paper inside, and maybe a couple of batteries for weight. Then drop it into a bathtub, or maybe a swimming pool.

Floating

Cases that can survive a battle zone are fine for the military, but we're boat people. We're going to drop stuff overboard, and we want to get it back. So it has to float.

One solution is a buoyant foam accessory that fits over the protective case. It also adds another level of shock resistance. The most common group of floating products is the pouch style. Pouches aren't as form fitting as a hard case, but they tend to be less expensive, starting at \$10.

Polyurethane pouches feature some sort of zip seal and often have a lanyard for more secure toting. Make sure the one you want has a clear back or cutout for the camera lens on your phone or tablet. Otherwise, it's useless for taking pictures.

Pouch makers say you can operate function keys and touch screens through the thin plastic, but check it out yourself with your device. And don't buy the old-style "dry packs" made for VHF radios and handheld GPS units. The poly is too thick.

Four Cases Worth Checking Out

Snow Lizard SLXtreme

The SLXtreme hits a lot of bases. It meets the industry waterproof, shockproof, and dustproof standards, with a polycarbonate case and rubberized grips. It also integrates a 2,000-milliamp battery that claims to double the battery life of an iPhone, with up to seven hours of talk time. The battery can receive a trickle charge for a small solar panel in the back.

Cost: \$130

LifeProof LifeJacket

Designed to complement the LifeProof frē smartphone case (\$80), the LifeJacket is a high-visibility orange surround made of soft, buoyant foam. Allows access to side keys and controls. Corners have a mounting eyelet for lanyard and wrist strap. Has camera lens and flash opening on the back. Designed for iPhone 5/5S/5C. **Cost: \$40 | www.lifeproof.com**



OtterBox Preserver

The Preserver features a two-piece padded, polycarbonate shell that snaps together. Submersible to 6 feet, 6 inches depth and drop-tested from the same height. Dust and debris proof to industry standards. Camera lens and flash openings; hinged port for charger. Comes with wrist lanyard. For iPhone 5 and 5S, and Galaxy S4. **Cost: \$89 |** www.otterbox.com



Seattle Sports E-Merse

With an updated design this year, E-Merse is a floating polyurethane pouch that uses slide-lock closures to seal out water up to 10 feet deep. The new models have a lower-profile slide bar, and the Dry Audio version, which features a waterproof headphone jack, has been reoriented to accommodate larger smartphones, such as the Galaxy S4. Comes with a breakaway lanyard. **Cost: \$15-\$20 |** www.seattlesportsco.com

Chargers

Devices always seem to be running out of juice, just when we're far away from a power outlet. Some case makers have responded by integrating tiny batteries inside their products. At least one case uses the sun's rays to help charge the battery and costs roughly \$130.

This is a niche category but may evolve with improved battery technology and consumer demand. For now, it's about aligning expectation with reality. In-phone chargers prolong battery life and solar cells can revive a dead device. But don't expect the rapid recovery time you get from a wall outlet or 12-volt plug-in.

Speaking of expectations, it's fair to say that all these cases involve some degree of compromise. Some may muffle your speaker or ringtone. Others may impair your ability to press all the function keys or perform swipes, especially at the edges of the screen, where the case may intrude. It's possible that third-party cables won't fit through the charging port. Maybe these are things you can live with for your peace of mind on the water. At the same time, you'll want the ability to test a case and return it, if it's not suitable. 🏊





It's made of shock-, tear- and stain-resistant foam that not only adds buoyancy, but additional shock protection. A quick release lanyard and wrist strap are included so you can be hands-free until you actually need to use your phone.

This is bulky enough that you're not going to want to use it all the time, but since it just slips on and off your case in a matter of seconds, it's perfect for keeping on your boat or in your beach bag. Take it out when you need it and tuck it away when you don't. If you're just worried about keeping your iPhone safe from water and dirt, then the [LifeProof iPhone Case](#) (\$79.99) is all you need. If you spend a lot of time in deep water and want to protect your iPhone from sinking, too, then the [LifeProof LifeJacket](#) (\$39.99) will set your mind at ease.

Lifeproof Case: No Proof of Life

We're overdue for a good old fashioned product review. This one's a Part II after a few solid years of use, and a little abuse.

Lifeproof is a well known and very popular manufacturer of water and shock resistant cases for phones and tablets. They make sleek, form fitting products that are exactly customized to specific devices, and are generally well thought out to give full functionality so that the device can just stay in the case.

I've used their cases for iPhone 4 and 5 series phones. I was stoked about them at first, until they seemed to wear out prematurely. I'll go on record right now as saying that I'm rough on gear. So, when I had trouble with my iPhone 4 case wearing away and falling apart, I thought it was me, but I put in a warranty claim anyway, and, BAM. New case for free. Good customer service!

The only problem is that it kept happening. First, the 4, and then with the 5. On our last Instructional Sailing Vacation trip in the Virgin Islands, one of the new cases leaked while

snorkeling and almost ruined my phone. I saved it with fresh water and then electrical contact cleaner, but it malfunctioned for a week and caused me some trouble with calls. (Yes, I did a proper water integrity test before putting the phone in. And, yes – I got some really kewl video footage of marine life for you that's on our Instagram.)

As well as the wearing-away issue and the leak, the buttons that control the volume on/off switch, and the microphone port sealing screw, failed on two different replacement cases.

The case comes with a mic/headset adaptor that seals the phone when using either. That protects the phone if the connection gets wet, and only the mic/headset is at risk. However, they never worked properly with any kind of headset.

In my humble opinion, my issues boil down to two things:

1. Lifeproof made an accessory called the Life Jacket for the 4 and 5 series phones. It's a bulky foam-rubber case that floats the device and also provides way more shock resistance. It actually blocks wind noise for phones, too. Unfortunately, the Life Jacket is very hard to get on and off the case, and wears it down quickly. Must be done, as there's no way to charge the phone with the Life Jacket on. (Never got around to trying some Exacto-knife surgical modifications.)
2. Durability issue with original cases, compounded by poor quality control in manufacturing of replacements. New cases had halves that didn't line up well, were warped, broke easily without using the Life Jacket, and in one case arrived with a loose broken part that had nothing to do with packing and shipping.

Sure, the company gladly kept sending replacements, and they made an easy process easier. (I had to wonder if that reflected growing problems with quality and higher return rates.)

However, when I got fed up and asked more questions about where they were made, and whether I could expect better quality replacements for later models (6 and 7 series phones), I got a meaningless first response and no answer to a follow up.

So, I'm stuck with kewl Life Jacket accessories and broken cases.

There's growing competition for this style of drop & drink resistant case for mobile devices. One manufacturer, who has been around for decades making similar products, is **Pelican**. They now make an iPhone case for the iPhone 6 and 6plus series phones that looks very similar to the Lifeproof products. I might have to give them a try despite the lack of Life Jacket and figure out a workaround.

At least one if not several companies make dedicated snorkeling cases for the iPhone as well. One is the **TAT7 iPhone Scuba Case**. It's a simple, clear case that has three dedicated buttons: home screen, camera app, and shutter. It's rated for depths up to 100 feet. Once the phone is in, all one can do is shoot and stop (and toggle between pic and video, apparently). It has a built in wrist strap, which the Pelican doesn't appear to. Looks worthy of consideration. (Couldn't find a dedicated web site so that might be a slight red flag, but they are in product reviews and on Amazon.)

LifeProof (<http://www.lifeproof.com/>) showed off its cases at CES 2013 (<http://www.cesweb.org/>). Life Proof makes cases for iOS devices including iPhone 4, 4s and iPhone 5, the iPod Touch (4th generation) and the iPad (2nd, 3rd and 4th generation). What

makes the LifeProof cases special is although they are thin they are also extremely durable. They have been tested to meet military specs. LifeProof cases are shock proof, dirt proof and water proof. They are certified to be water proof up to 6.6 feet and has been tested up to ten feet. With these cases you can bring your iPhone or iPod into the shower, while swimming and boating without having to worry about it getting wet. The cases are intelligently designed so there is material only where it is need. Bumpers are placed only where they make sense and the rest of the case is sculptured, to make it thin and light as possible. The case has real glass over the location where the camera lens is so there is no distortion when taking a picture. There are removable covers for the speakers, and headphone jack so they are protected when not in use, but easily available when needed. The iPad cover offer similar protection, however because to use the iPad properly requires touch there is no coating or screen over the front as there is with the iPhone or iPod Touch.

To complement their cases, LifeProof also offers many ways to easily carry and secure your devices. There is the arm band so you can secure your iPhone or iPod to your arm while walking or running. They have the LifeProof bike and bar mount. There is a clip for your belt. For the photographer or podcaster LifeProof offer the iStabilizer (http://www.lifeproof.com/shop/us_en/photography/) line of accessories including the iStabilizer Flex (http://www.lifeproof.com/shop/us_en/photography/istabilizer-flex/), the iStabilizer Dolly (http://www.lifeproof.com/shop/us_en/photography/istabilizer-dolly-smartphone-dolly/) and the iStabilizer monopod (http://www.lifeproof.com/shop/us_en/photography/istabilizer-monopod-smartphone-monopod/). There is even an accessory called the Lifejacket (http://www.lifeproof.com/shop/us_en/fitness/lifeproof-lifejacket/) which the iPhone or iPod Touch with the LifeProof case on it fits inside and it floats.

I say this because a few months back, LifeProof sent me some samples to try. As a user, I certainly wanted to test their cases thoroughly before making a final verdict. And well today, I can absolutely say with confidence that the LifeProof cases are truly built for an active lifestyle and built with extreme protection in mind! Truth be told, they completely took away my worries for my tech gear as I did various activities: swimming, hiking, motorbiking, and more.

WHY I LOVE LIFEPROOF CASES

Four Proofs = Zero Worries



These LifeProof cases are primarily for Apple products, but they also offer items for Samsung and Motorola phones. Also, their two major types of cases are the Fre and NÜÜD series. The main difference between the two is the screen: Fre has a built-in screen protector whereas NÜÜD is screenless so that you can touch your device's actual screen (giving you perfect clarity and touch control).



Personally, I prefer to use the NÜÜD series. I didn't want the added protector screen of Fre since I already have a screen protector applied to my iPhone. Add the fact on how it felt more solid to me, and has less of a plastic-feel compared to that of the Fre. Yet despite the minor differences between the two main case types, they both have the same core property, "4 Proofs":

WaterProof: With LifeProof cases, not only can you use your phone near water, but you can also submerge it up to 6.6 feet or 2 meters for up to 1 hour! It's helpful to note that all the LifeProof items are factory water-tested for several times before shipment so you are sure to receive a leak-free phone case.

DirtProof: Because of its perfect seal, your gadget is fully protected from dirt and dust too.

SnowProof: Even more, it's well closed to the elements of snow and ice.

DropProof: Finally, LifeProof cases have a U.S. Military Standard for drop and shock protection, meaning that it can physically withstand the drops, fumbles, vibrations and bumps that you may ever encounter. In fact, your phone can survive a fall from 6.6 feet or 2 meters!

Great Fit



The first time that I used my NÜÜD case, I instantly put it to the test. Besides, every package comes with instructions for it and after the initial process of proving that the LifeProof case is completely waterproof, what's next is to test it for real with my iPhone 5s.

To cut the story short, it worked — my LifeProof was really water-proof despite how the NÜÜD case was screenless! (Apparently, it has a tight rubber ring around the screen to prevent water from coming in).

Though for sure, I have to say that it was a nerve-wracking experience to watch my iPhone sinking to the bottom of my sink... but as it was, my iPhone really remained functional and I was even able to use commands while it was underwater! Surely after that test, I did not hold back in using my iPhone with a LifeProof case as I went on several swimming trips last summer.

Needless to say, LifeProof cases are really engineered to fit perfectly with your device and it also works well with every feature and function of your gadget.

CONS: The only problem that I see with the fit is that given the firm material that it is made of, I sometimes need to push hard on some buttons. But it didn't reach the point where it became annoying since after some use, I started to get a feel of the right pressure to apply for pressing.

Lifeproof's iPhone 5 (<https://www.slashgear.com/tags/iphone-5/>) case has been on the market for around a month now, so by now, a number of people are keeping their shiny new iDevice safe behind the company's handy little barrier. Here at ShowStoppers 2013, however, the company is revealing a number of new accessories for its iPhone 5 case, with the offerings ranging from strange to practical. With the Life Jacket accessory, your iPhone 5 will actually float. That has to be a handy little feature for those who take their device out on the water, though we do feel like we should point out that such an accessory sort of undercuts the waterproofing Lifeproof's case brings to the table. In any case, with the big orange Life Jacket wrapped around your phone, you don't have to worry about it sinking to the bottom of the lake or sea should your device go overboard.

Other accessories announced today include more standard fare, like an arm band, bike/bar mount, car mount, and belt clip. These are all relatively self-explanatory, with the arm band giving you a way to run or jog with your encased iPhone 5. The bike mount naturally allows you attach your iPhone 5 to your bike, though Lifeproof's representatives also suggested that new mothers could use it to attach their phones to a baby's stroller. Finally, the car mount is about what you'd expect – a suction cup that you can attach to your windshield or dashboard.



It wasn't all about iPhone 5 owners though, as Lifeproof also took time at the show to announce a new case for the Galaxy S III (<https://www.slashgear.com/tags/samsung-galaxy-s-iii/>). Like the company's case for the iPhone 5, the Galaxy S III case will be waterproof up to depths of 6.6 feet, dirt proof, and shock proof from heights of up to 6.6 feet. 


iPhones don't float. If you've ever dropped one in water you don't need us to tell you that.

We suspect someone at Lifeproof experienced their iPhone sinking to the bottom of the pool and wondered how they could stop that from happening again. So they invented the Life Jacket iPhone 5 case, a floatable iPhone case that ensures, if you are on water, your iPhone 5 will always be safe.

There are actually two parts to the Life Jacket iPhone 5 case: an inner waterproof shell called Fre for iPhone 5, and the outer jacket to give it buoyancy.

Fre is a lightweight case that will allow you to submerge your iPhone in water down to a depth of 6.6 ft (2 meters), protect it from dust getting in, and let you drop it from 6.6ft without fear of damage.



The case completely seals in the iPhone, including a screw-in cap for the headphone socket.

Those who want to listen to music underwater even get a screw-in headphone adapter that keeps the unit waterproof, but you will need to bring your own

waterproof headphones to the party - tip, your white Apple earbuds won't work.

Available in a range of colours including black, white, blue, and red, the Fre iPhone 5 case costs £59.93 in the UK and \$79.99 in the US.



Once you've got the Fre case on your iPhone you can then add the Life Jacket. It's big, it's orange, and yes it floats.

The case is easy to add and take off and really designed for water sports types. There's very little to the Life Jacket apart from its floating capabilities, but the good news is that you can still use the phone as all the buttons and switches are easily accessible. Against your head it will make you look like an idiot though.



The Life Jacket costs £34.25 in the UK and \$39.99 in the US. That's fairly expensive considering what it is, but if you really are worried about losing your iPhone to the depths of the sea or at the bottom of the river when you next go white water rafting, then it's probably money well spent.



2. EcoPod by Grace Digital



The **EcoPod** (\$49.99) is a waterproof iPhone case what will float as long as it has a standard payload (smartphone) inside. Despite its waterproofing, the EcoPod isn't the type of case you'll to expose the iPhone to submersion in water for long periods (ie, you can't go swimming with this case)—it's only certified to keep water out at depths of 3 feet and for only 30 minutes. Still, it's good for most outdoor tasks where briefly dropping the iPhone in water is a risk. The EcoPod comes with waterproof earbuds.

3. Overboard Waterproof & Buoyant Case



The **Overboard** (\$29) is a clear waterproof pouch that is buoyant (it floats). The Overboard is waterproof up to an impressive depth of 19 feet. Another benefit of the Overboard is that, if you already use a case on your iPhone, you won't have to remove it to place it in the Overboard—you can use both at the same time (unless the case is extremely bulky). The Overboard has a [Pro Sport](#) version that comes with an armband and waterproof headphones. There is even a [version for the iPad](#).

4. Chums Camera/iPhone Float



The **Chums Camera/iPhone Float** ([\\$9.99](#)) isn't a case, but it a cheap accessory that you can attach to other waterproof cases to make them float. The Chums Float is made of high-density bouyant foam. Because there are way, war more waterproof iPhone cases and pouches that don't float than do, purchasing the Chums Float along with a cheaper waterproof iPhone case can save you some money over an expensive all-in-one solution, the tradeoff being this combo is more bulky.

5. DandyCase Waterproof Case (Requires a Float for Buoyancy)



The DandyCase (\$29.99) is an affordable waterproof solution that works with just about every smartphone under 5" in screen size (all current iPhones fit into the case). The DandyCase is a clear pouch that lets you operate the iPhone's touchscreen through its plastic. You can also take reasonably good photos with the case on. It doesn't float by itself but does allow you to attach a floating dongle, like the one mentioned above in this article.

6. BeachBuoy by Proporta (Requires a Float for Buoyancy)



The BeachBuoy by Proporta (\$19) is another affordable waterproofing solution that is a see-through pouch. It is waterproof up to 16-foot. The clear plastic allows you to operate the iPhone's screen through the plastic, so you can still use apps, send text messages, and take pictures with the iPhone's camera. The BeachBuoy requires you to attach a float dangle to become buoyant (sold separately). You can often find this case cheaper than the \$19 retail price on Amazon. And although it says "for iPhone 5," it works with most smartphones, or any thing you want to waterproof, for that matter.







Waterproof iPhone Case Lifeproof Review and Tips

Protecting your phone from water during outdoor activities is challenging, especially during the summer months when many of us are active around pools, the beach and more.

In my home state of Hawaii, many people choose to live here because they love the water. It's a water centric kind of place where water activities can be easily indulged all year long. We even have daily weather reports that feature surf conditions.

That is why you so frequently see waterproof LifeProof smartphone cases in Hawaii.



The LifeProof Nuud white case with a clear back lets you show off that you have a gold iPhone 5s (note some color choices have a smoke back).

I was slow to come to the party, keeping my phone tucked away someplace safely dry when I went out outrigger canoe paddling. But I can tell you that once you become accustomed to taking your phone with you into the water, you can't go back.

I tested both the LifeProof Fre and the LifeProof Nuud iPhone 5s cases in a variety of locations on Kauai, including on the ocean, at the beach, in the pool, and while biking.

I looked to see what customers were saying about these cases online. I noticed that there were queries as to which one they should choose. I also found questions about maintenance, return policies, opening cases and operation of devices with the cases installed. This article addresses these concerns with reviews of the products I tested as well as tips offered to new users.

Weight and Bulk

Both the Fre and Nuud are light weight and don't add much bulk to your phone.

In contrast, a friend showed me his Snow Lizard case and it was massive in comparison. I'm sure a more bulky case makes users feel very safe, but it seems unnecessary.

Inexpensive Waterproof Case Options

I read so many unhappy consumer reviews of a number of inexpensive iPhone cases that claim to provide waterproofing. Given how dependent I am on my iPhone, I would be terrified to put my phone in one of them.

The LifeProof Fre or the Nuud, Which is Right for You?

Overall, I liked both of the LifeProof cases.

It seems rather magical that your glass iPhone screen is exposed with the Nuud – but your iPhone is indeed protected, not only from water but from dirt and sand.

Keep in mind in making your choice that you may decide not to remove the case frequently. You are likely to be living with the case on a daily basis.



Nuud LifeProof iPhone case in the sand. If you use your browser to zoom in, you can see wet sand gathered at the edges where the case interfaces with my phone.

This was my first day of heavy sand exposure with my Nuud case and I had a moment of uneasiness looking at that sand on my phone. But it was easy to rinse it off, shake and wipe dry with a soft cloth.

Why get the Fre?

- Slightly less expensive than the Nuud. The Nuud is \$89.99. The Fre is currently on sale for \$71.99 in 5 colors on LifeProof.com.
- If you prefer to use a screen protector, even though the Nuud provides one as an option, it makes more sense to choose the Fre.
- If you are currently using a slip-on case that completely encloses your iPhone, you probably feel you need that level of protection for your screen.
- If you have big fingers there is a visible difference between the two models – the home button is completely exposed on the Fre while a small bit of it is obstructed on the Nuud.

Why get the Nuud?

- You are in direct contact with your iPhone screen.
- The back of the case is clear (on the white/clear case), revealing the cool color of your iPhone.
- You will dazzle your friends the first time you tap your fingernail on the glass of your phone and tell them the case is waterproof.

You are in direct contact with your iPhone screen with the Nuud. It doesn't matter that your hands are wet, nor that you might drop it in the pool. This is sports fitness model, Ashley Guarrasi with the iPhone 5s LifeProof Nuud clear/white case

Other than that, the cases are similar. Both now have the headphone jack cover tether. The fingerprint ID function works on both the Fre and the Nuud but you should program it before you put the case on.

Personally, having used both cases, I like them both but I prefer the Nuud. I have never put a screen protector on my phone. So it is quite dependent on your personal preferences for that level of protection and how roughly you handle and store your phone.

Water Damage Insurance for Your iPhone from LifeProof is only \$10

If you live in the USA, this seems like a real no-brainer. The Total Water Protection Program insurance is good for a year. The deductible, should you need to use the insurance is \$50 so the total cost is \$60.



\$10 for a year of protection for your iPhone or Samsung Galaxy

Your LifeProof case must have been purchased either from LifeProof.com or a Verizon corporate store at this time. Available only for purchases within the USA.

You must have validly registered the LP Case and Eligible Device, in accordance with the Registration Process... within 14 days following your purchase of the LP Case from Verizon or 21 days following your purchase of the LP Case from LifeProof.

When you purchase your case from LifeProof.com you will notice that there is a section under the color choice where you can "add optional accessories." Click for a check mark on the \$10 Total Water Protection Program for phones. (slightly higher for iPad).

You will need to use the device you are covering to sign up for the insurance (not your computer). This is done directly to the LifeProof website at twpp.lifeproof.com. If you are having trouble doing this, you can contact the TWPP customer service department at 877-394-6001.

The original packaging is not required for registration as long as you have kept the registration card from the packaging with your 9 digit Program Registration Number. If you purchased directly from the LifeProof website, make sure you keep your Total Water Protection Program Confirmation e-mail with your 9 digit registration code.

You will need:

- 1) Your original receipt for your LifeProof case purchase. You will need to enter in your purchase date as well as upload a photo of your receipt if you bought from a Verizon Corporate Store. (If purchased directly through LifeProof you will need your original order number instead of a receipt)
- 2) Your Program Registration Number. You will need the 9 digit code printed on the card found inside of your LifeProof packaging. (If purchased directly through LifeProof this code will be located in your Total Water Protection Program Confirmation e-mail)
- 3) Your LifeProof Case. They will need the front and back serial numbers printed inside of your case.
- 4) A screenshot of your device's about page containing the IMEI/ Serial Number/ MEID.

Talking on Your iPhone with the LifeProof Nuud Case

Both the Fre and Nuud come with a screw-in adapter for your headphones. The adapter has an integrated gasket that ensures a very solid waterproof connection to the case. If you plan on using headphones extensively in proximity to water, you should consider purchasing third-party water-resistant headphones.

People were complaining that they could not hear me when I used my headphones before I started using the adapter. I was using the standard iPhone white headphones. I was about to test different headphones when I realized I should just use the adapter. What I realized from using the adapter was that when I wasn't using the adapter, I just wasn't being careful to make sure that the headphone jack was fully seated. The adapter guarantees that so it is simply easier to seat firmly. The adapter also completes a waterproof connection to your phone.

I tested FaceTime video conferencing using the speakerphone. Even though I was out on the beach and did not have access to wifi, it worked fine.

The New Tether for the LifeProof Headphone Jack Cover

When the Nuud was introduced, it came with a tether for the headphone jack cover (as you see in the adapter photo just above). This was a notable improvement as people were losing the headphone jack cover on previous models.

Today both the Nuud and the Fre come with a headphone jack cover tether. The Nuud was introduced with the tether, the Fre was updated with the introduction of the 5s in September 2013 to include a tether.

Be Careful with LifeProof Amazon Purchases

Most Amazon sellers are not authorized by LifeProof and may be selling counterfeit or used cases, which could negate the LifeProof warranty and may cause damage to your phone.

Also beware eBay, Craigslist, flea market purchases, and that guy on the street who says "pssst, wanna buy a LifeProof case"? The fakes are hard to spot unless you know what you

are looking for.

Choosing Where to Buy Your LifeProof Case

You can buy a LifeProof case at LifeProof.com and select retailers including BestBuy, AT&T, Verizon and Target. If you choose to return your LifeProof case within the first 30 days satisfaction guaranteed period, or because of issues with your case during the one year warranty period, you will be returning it to the offline or online store you bought it from.

If you have had good experiences with the retailer of your choice, you can depend on them to take care of you as they usually do.

Note however, importantly, you can only get the LifeProof Total Water Protection Program if you buy directly from LifeProof.com or a Verizon Corporate store.

To prepare for a possible return of your case to LifeProof or your retailer: Be sure to keep your receipt. It should have the logo of the store on it. You will be asked for the serial numbers taped inside the front and back of the case. Check to make sure these are there when you receive your case. These two numbers are different. I also recommend that you keep the original package which has an SKU number on it. There will be steps to ensure your case is not a counterfeit. Given the number of these out there, this is necessary. Make sure to get an RMA number from the retailer you are returning it to and write it on the outside of your package.

You Will Want LifeProof Case Accessories

If you are taking your iPhone out onto the water, you will want to attach it to yourself somehow. The case with your phone inside is not buoyant enough to float on its own.

The LifeProof Lifejacket floatation device is not just for floating in the water – it also allows you to attach a lanyard to your phone as an alternative to an armband when you are out on the water and you need your hands free for paddling, etc. The Lifejacket comes with an attractive quick release LifeProof lanyard and wristband.

LifeProof made the Lifejacket day-glow orange so that it would be easily visible if it ever got away from you. Although light-weight for comfort, it appears to be durable and solidly built. All buttons and features of your iPhone are accessible while in the LifeJacket, including your speaker and microphone.

Many of us live in environments where rain can appear unexpectedly. Hawaii is definitely one of these places. The LifeProof armband is very comfortable. It is easy to reach with one hand to pull out your phone, use it and slip it back into the armband. It is adjustable to the size of your arm. The same armband works with the Fre and the Nuud for the 5s.

If you enjoy biking, you will probably want the LifeProof bike mount. Though you can also use the arm band, the bike mount allows you to easily monitor GPS and use other Bluetooth features – such as a health monitor – that you may want more continuously in front of you. As with the other accessories for the 5s, this accessory works with either the Fre or the Nuud.

Other accessories for the 5s iPhone LifeProof case include a car mount and a belt clip. LifeProof also has accessories for other LifeProof cases for the iPhone 4/4s, iPhone 5c, iPhone 5 and iPad.

One essential accessory I use that is not on the LifeProof site is the inexpensive waterproof bluetooth Boom Swimmer speaker.

Installing and Removing Your LifeProof iPhone 5/5s Nuud Case

Install Guide for the LifeProof nuud for iPhone 5/5s



Your user manual is [here](#). Just select your product.

The case snaps easily onto your phone. But do follow the directions to make sure that your phone and the case are clean before putting it on. LifeProof includes a microfiber cleaning cloth in your package to help you remember to do this.

Check Seals:

Case back:

Make sure that the O-ring and seal are in place and free of dust, dirt, hair and debris

Case front:

Make sure that the integrated gasket is free of dust, dirt, hair and debris

If either the front or back is dirty: rinse it in warm water and shake off moisture

Check to make sure that serial numbers are taped into the back of the front and the back of the case. These numbers will not match each other. If these are not there, you may have a counterfeit case.

Testing for Waterproof with the LifeProof Nuud

LifeProof includes an iPhone 5 shaped blue plastic insert marked with the assurance that your LifeProof case has been tested to make it easy for you test it once again. It is not without trepidation that many of us dunk our iPhones in water for the first time, so having a way to test the case without actually using your phone is a relief.

Installing and Removing Your iPhone 5/5s LifeProof Fre Case

Install Guide for the LifeProof fre for iPhone 5/5s



Please note that the Fre case in this video does not show a tether for the headphone jack cover, but the latest Fre LifeProof case does have a tether. This improvement was made at the time of the introduction of the 5s, in September 2013. Previously the headphone jack cover was a separate item that was not attached to the case itself.

Silence Switch on Both Fre and Nuud LifeProof Cases Toggles

It is not immediately obvious that the piece of rubber covering your silence switch easily toggles back and forth between silent mode and ringer on.

Note that it switches in the opposite direction what you are accustomed to on your iPhone, eg push UP for mute. But you will quickly adjust to this.

Use your finger or thumb pad, not your fingernail.

Using the LifeProof Cases Underwater

The submerged depth limit is two meters (or 6.6 feet), so these are definitely not deep-dive devices. This is sufficient depth protection for snorkeling and most water play.

Please note that any touch screen will not respond underwater because of the way the touchscreen electronics work – it's similar to the problem you face using a touchscreen with gloves on.

To take photos, press the volume up (+) button on the side of your case.

To take video, start the video before going under. Your microphone will work normally.

Do not depend on utilizing wireless signals when your phone is underwater.

When you come to the surface, some water may be trapped on the outside of the camera lens. A quick shake of the phone should remove it instantly.

It is usual to see a small stream or bubbles escaping from the microphone or speaker vents when you first submerge your phone and case. This is normal and should not indicate a problem with the water seal.

Several reviewers note that the case's glass covering for your camera lens is excellent. In fact, several underwater photography experts have reported that it's actually better than some deep water camera covers. Therefore, your underwater photos should not exhibit significant distortion.

After using the case underwater in chlorinated or salt water, be sure to wash it off.

You Will Probably Not Remove Your LifeProof Case Often

When I first began using the case, I thought I would just use it when I was going out onto the ocean. But I discovered that the case is quite comfortable to use in spite of it's advanced functionality. I am in wet conditions much more often than I expected. If you have children or grandchildren, your phone is now far more childproof than it was before.

The number of health and sports Apps for the iPhone will continue to expand – along with the opportunities to use your phone during outdoor activities. Whether you are out running with your phone, you are working hard and perspiring, or you find yourself training in the rain, there are many reasons a LifeProof case makes sense on a daily basis.

Then there are our “oops moments.” The spills, the dirt, the drops that we want to protect our iPhone from.

If you are taking the phone underwater, LifeProof does recommend that you test it every three months, so you need to take the cover off then.

When I come out of the ocean after paddling, I wash the salt water off of everything, please do the same with your LifeProof case.

Clean your case liberally with clean fresh water to rinse off all salt, dirt, sand, or chlorine. Shake off excess water and dry with a clean, soft cloth.

Do not use abrasives, solvents, bleach, petroleum, or oxidizing agents on your LifeProof case.

Recommended maintenance:

- Keep O-rings, covers, seals and/or gaskets clean
- Water test before planned water use and retest every three months
- Rinse with fresh water after exposure to soap, chlorine or seawater
- Backup your device's data regularly
- After major impacts: Inspect for damage and ensure case, ports and covers are sealed.

In the past, LifeProof has advised that you really don't want to be constantly taking your case on and off because the closure is very precise. However, [this advice](#) is two years old and applies to a prior generation of cases. LifeProof has not included this warning on the latest model cases introduced summer 2013. Do keep in mind that if you are taking the case on and off, you should make sure that the seals are clean when you reinstall the case, and if you are putting the case on to take it out into the water, then you should water test the case first.

Should I Worry About Negative LifeProof Reviews?

On the popular Wirecutter review site, they proclaimed the LifeProof Nuud "the best waterproof iPhone case." One of the comments accused the writer of writing a bogus review saying he had seen so many bad reviews on Amazon and Apple. The reviewer answered:

User reviews are notoriously poor at evaluating stuff like this. That's because every person whose case fails will write a negative review whereas many people whose cases work fine can't be bothered to. LifeProof is the most popular waterproof case brand. More cases=more failures=more complaints.

There is also the factor that there are a significant number of fake LifeProof cases out there. Be very careful where you buy your LifeProof case from. (LifeProof.com, BestBuy, AT&T, Verizon and Target are your best bet).

If you are a worrier, get the outstanding Total Water Protection Program insurance that LifeProof provides! It's only \$10 and if anything unexpected happens, your iPhone is covered for only \$50. You can only get this insurance if you buy directly from LifeProof or a Verizon Corporate Store. Please see the details above. I already had my iPhone insured through AT&T for \$10/month, so I am covered. Back up the notes, photos and videos on your iPhone regularly (you should do this regardless of water activities).

Read my review of the LifeProof protection case for iPhone 4/4s [here](#). My original position still stands and I would rather waterproof my phone (using Liquipel) so I can use a battery case.

If you own a LifeProof iPhone protective case, you should take a look at their LifeProof [Lifejacket](#).

The Lifejacket is a foam based case enhancer that increases the buoyancy of your phone so it doesn't sink. The bright orange color means it will be very visible even from a fair distance.

The foam they use seems to be very resistant and should provide years of use. I tried tearing it with my hands and it stood up very well. Because it is a thick foam, one of the side benefits is that it becomes much more shock resistant. The kit





We live on the lake and our two kids love to spend most of the day in the water. We have tried multiple portable bluetooth speakers but the volume ability of some of those speakers in the can that we tried simply weren't impressive (and certainly not waterproof). The iMW577 "Lifeproof" speaker come with IP67 rating (same as iPhone 7) meaning that it can withstand up to 30 minutes in water down to 1m (about 3') and resists dust.

I encourage you to look at some pretty creative Youtube videos out there are people shooting, blowing up w thermite, and otherwise mauling this speaker. It takes a kicking and keeps on ticking.

However, my gripe is that while the speaker is loud (a lot louder than the ones we had in the can), it still doesn't sound quite crisp like a stereo speaker in bigger units. I initially saw this speaker online (via the product picture) and thought it was a big sound bar. This thing is pretty small and small enough to mount to the front

of your bike using the included mounts.

Other nice features of this speaker that I think are useful is the USB charging outlet which allows you to charge your phone (or other USB device) off the speaker. This is handy for when you're using your phone as the audio source via Bluetooth all day.

All in all I feel this is one tough brick of a speaker, with some pretty cool features. However, don't think you're getting a high end audiophile experience in this thing as there are definitely tradeoffs in insulating this speaker to keep it safe.

Great sound, but what good is that when it stops working 37 days after purchase? Lights don't turn on, no sound comes out, it's a dead brick. It was plugged in most of the time throughout its 37 days.

It's a bad design when what's possibly a dead battery makes the whole unit unusable. And that battery was never discharged throughout the unit's short life.

What's even worse is Altec, or company name is Sakar, warranty which needs you to send your unit in, then wait 2-3 weeks for what's a replacement, a new unit, or so the person on the phone said. So at least 2 weeks without any sound, after 1 month of usable life?

A real company like WD (Western Digital) has sent me a replacement (hard drive) and it arrived 2 days after my call, without them waiting for my unit's arrival, and then taking 2-3 weeks?!?!?!

A company like Lifeproof only wants pictures of the unit (iPhone case) with your signature and serial number, and they send you a replacement within their 1 year warranty period, on the next business day after your call. Those are just some example of how bigger companies handle warranty and customer service, without doing a small-company-approach like Altec does.

So if your unit works, great, but when it stops working, be prepared for waiting.

I will not be purchasing any Altec or Sakar products in the future.

#2 (power button)

The other negative is having to press the Power button for 3 seconds to turn it on or turn it off. Who made that design decision, and how is that user friendly?

There are much better ways to prevent accidental turning on/off.

There are many choices for portable bluetooth speakers, and Altec/Sakar don't care about their customers, that's my experience.

Underwater Smartphone Photography



Today's Question: Given your recent underwater iPhone photos, could you provide a brief outline on the best attributes and brands of waterproof cases for the smartphone?

Tim's Quick Answer: I have had great fun using an underwater case for my iPhone in a variety of locations. Admittedly, this involves what might be considered a bit more risk than you would take if you purchased a waterproof point-and-shoot camera. But since I always travel with my iPhone it seemed the more efficient to make use of my iPhone, with a degree of caution. I've opted for the LifeProof FRE case (<http://amzn.to/1UbMLXo>) in conjunction with the LifeProof LifeJacket flotation device (<http://amzn.to/1S4BuZU>).

More Detail: Most recently I was using my iPhone to capture underwater photos and videos while snorkeling in Huatulco, Mexico. You can see one sample (and follow me!) on Instagram here:

To be sure, it is important to take a cautious approach when you are taking a smartphone underwater. If the case leaks your phone could be ruined, and you might lose the data that is on your device.

There are two very important precautions that I recommend in order to minimize the risks. First, be sure your device is completely backed up before every underwater photography adventure. That way, if your case leaks and your smartphone is ruined, at least you'll only lose your underwater photos (and the phone) without losing existing data.

Second, be sure to test the underwater case for leaks before every outing. I recommend submerging the case in a sink full of water, for example, using a weight to keep the case underwater. After an hour or so, check very carefully for any water inside the case. Then be sure to seal the case properly before use, and to limit any diving to the depth limit indicated by your specific case.

Since I use an iPhone, I was looking specifically for cases that fit the iPhone. Based on reviews and in-person evaluations, I decided on the LifeProof FRE case. There are other underwater cases available for different make and model smartphones, but I have not evaluated any of those in great detail.

I also highly recommend the LifeProof LifeJacket flotation device if you are an iPhone user. First you put the LifeProof FRE case onto your phone, then you slip that assembly into the LifeProof LifeJacket. The LifeJacket serves primarily as a flotation device, so your iPhone can float on the surface of the water. But I've also found the LifeJacket to be a real smartphone saver for activities on dry land. For example, if I want to take photos while riding a bike, the LifeJacket helps protect the phone in the event I should drop it. I can assure you from personal experience just a few days ago that the LifeJacket can indeed keep an iPhone safe when dropped from a moving bicycle.

Another option that works well for virtually any smartphone is the Phone Pouch from Ewa-Marine. I use an Ewa-Marine underwater bag for my digital SLR, and have found their products to work very well. You do need to be sure that the iPhone rests against the "back" surface of this underwater bag without any ripples, in order to ensure the best photos. But this bag does work very well, with the added flexibility of being usable with a variety of different devices. As long as your device fits in the underwater bag, you can use that device for underwater photos.

It is important to keep in mind, of course, that an iPhone or other smartphone won't perform as well as a digital SLR for underwater photography. The smaller sensors on smartphones work best with good lighting conditions, and you don't have to get very deep underwater before the light levels drop off significantly. That said, getting an underwater case for your smartphone is a great way to have fun while capturing some interesting photos!

above (running [Garmin BlueChart Mobile](#)). The design is stellar, I think. The LifeProof is so light and snug that the mini still feels mini, but it now has a protective rubbery edge and non-slip back; it survived 30 minutes submerged in my sink, yet all the buttons plus the charge port still work fine. I suspect I'll always use this case on the boat and maybe everywhere. That's not to say that I know everything about the ever-changing world of pad cases. Let's review the testing and discuss...



The photo above shows the LifeProof frē before closure (with iPad running [Nobeltec TZ](#)). It just snaps together starting at the top of the iPad (left here) and you use a large coin or similar and two slots at the bottom to begin the process of taking it apart. I've done this fairly quickly several times now, but, as noted, I don't see much reason to remove the mini. Note the clear poly that goes over the iPad screen. I've used many cases with similar plastic protection — [see this 2011 discussion](#) — and this one seems the least intrusive, I think because it's fairly stiff and fits tight to the iPad screen.

The screen cover is also what distinguishes LifeProof's various frē cases from their "nüü" design, which establishes a seal around the device screen so there is nothing between it and your finger. Frē started with iPhone and nüü came along with [LifeProof's iPad](#)



I was [enthused when Scanstrut introduced the Lifedge iPad case](#) early last year, but at least the iPad 1 version has issues. The main one is difficulty getting the rubbery outer shell to fit properly over the stiff back piece, which is also something you have to do at least partially whenever it needs charging. Scanstrut recommends using a water or oil-based lubricant — and now includes Lifedge Lube with the case — and that definitely makes the process easier. But it's still a pain in my experience, though I should note that my hands are a little screwy (from dupuytren's contracture) and the newer [Lifedge iPad 2/3/4 case](#) may be an easier fit.

Note the top of the photo above. I did leave this case right under one of *Gizmo's* large windows for quite a while, but I was still surprised to find that the anti-glare coating is apparently becoming detached from the main plastic screen protector. Don't do what I did! The screen, by the way, shows Navionics add-on nav module, which I like and is [nicely illustrated on The Hull Truth](#).



The Lifedge is the only iPad case I know of with a sturdy hand strap on the back (not shown), which may be particularly useful for racing sailors moving around a cockpit. There's also a [Surface Mount Kit](#) that can work with [adjustable ROKK deck](#) and [rail mounts](#) (also available [fixed](#) and with new [Scanstrut Rail Pods](#)). However, if you're settled on using RAM ball mounts around your boat, you'll be pleased to know that the hole pattern on the Lifedge case holder works fine, as shown above. Also shown are the two combination install tools and case legs that come with the case. [This video](#) shows how the legs can clip on in portrait or landscape modes and how the tool's "shoe horn" end is used to get the difficult case corners fitted. Is the YouTube commenter who claims they used an especially flexy cover correct, or are we seeing the difference between the iPad 1 and iPad 2/3/4 cases?



The [Life Jacket waterproof iPad case](#), which is also [sold as the "forward" by Fugawi](#) and others, is a newcomer and that's why I've illustrated the full

packaging. It's a big case that can hold *any* existing iPad model, and it floats; a drawback is that only the home button is accessible (though of course you can get to rotation and volume controls on the screen)...



I don't think that many folks would want to walk around with the Life Jacket anyway, as it doesn't have soft edge bumpers or a non-skid back, and the four snap tabs that make it very easy to insert or remove an iPad are not friendly for hand holding. Though hard to see in the photo, this non-glare screen cover also suffered a little delamination while sitting in *Gizmo's* window, and I should note that cases like this that extend right to the edge of the pad's touch screen can sometimes get in your finger's way, like when trying to tap that "star" button (lower right) in [Transas iSailor](#)...

What the Life Jacket seems best suited for is mounting securely in its accessory bracket, not unlike a chart plotter! I

picture boaters leaving the case and bracket in place and sticking their iPad in it when they get underway. The bracket has a nice ratcheting mechanism and is quite solid, though the early model I received for testing does not snap snugly around the case and one thumbscrew needed extra washers to tighten on the bracket. The company reports that these issues are rare and also that they'll soon be out with a charging port that will be waterproof even in use (take that, LifeProof) and an alternative mounting plate.

There are many ways an iPad can serve around a boat, but if you use one for underway navigation, I think you'll want it mounted in a sturdy way so that only one hand is needed. I liked Tallon's mount [when first spotted](#) and it's turned out to be a winner on the boat. I use the full [Tallon Ultimate iPad Mount](#) to put my (naked) iPad 1 just where I want it at *Gizmo's* lower helm. Since Tallon uses RAM mount ball connectors, I can move the iPad holder up to the flybridge (in fair weather), as seen in Panbo's current header photo, or I can mount the Lifedge case either up or down, [as seen here](#).

What's neat about the [Tallon Elite Socket USB](#) are the 12v outlet and USB port and the fact that you can remove the ball and cover all three holes for a flat, yachty look. The mount housing also seems very strong once you've drilled the big hole and screwed the parts

together. Note that the USB port wire has a male end you can attach it to a computer or the like, but I recently found a [12v USB adaptor](#) that I plan to try out soon.

It seems likely that LifeProof will come up with a "Lifejacket" (confusing!) flotation collar and universal cradle for the iPad mini frē case, like [it has for the iPad nüüd](#). Note that [RAM already has three iPad mini cradles](#) designed to work with sleeves and cases. It may seem strange to mix manufacturers so, but LifeProof, RAM, and Tallon may be a sweet way to go. What do you all think?

Hi Ben,

The search for good cases that protect, yet remain useable is endless. One caution on the LifeProof cases. They are well made, but if you look at the warranty, you are obligated to pressure test the case before loading it. It also says you must retest it anytime the unit has been handled roughly (my words, not the warranty). Which means, for some of us, in order to make the warranty valid, each day we may have to pressure test the case!

In addition, if there is a leak, the warranty only replaces the case...No the electronic!

How do I know this?? My iPhone flooded in 3 feet of water (a swimming pool). Lifeproof's response was swift and immediate...I MUST HAVE DONE SOMETHING WRONG AS THEIR CASES ARE EACH TESTED! They also quickly point out the testing requirements and that even if it did leak because of their fault, they would replace the case.

Too bad they have such bad customer service as the cases are trim and nice.

David, your timing is impeccable. It's wicked hot and sticky here in Maine (what climate change?) and I was just about to shower when I read your comment. So I took the iPad mini with LifeProof case with me (but let's keep that between us, please).

Interesting! When squarely catching full shower volume (from water conserving head, to be sure), the water sometimes initiated touch commands in Nobeltec TZ and Garmin BCM, though I could still sometimes touch tap my own commands. The iPad worked better when I turned the shower down to a gentle but heavy rain and/or if I tilted it more to the horizontal. Some other cases may be less sensitive to rain because the screen shields are further away and touch commands have to be more aggressive, but even with the LifeProof I wouldn't call it impossible. I could have done my nav commands in the lee of a foul weather jacket, I think (had I been wearing one).

I have used a RAM mount for three years. Two comments: The iPad is in our pilothouse, so waterproofing is not an issue for us. Sometimes on a warm day in bright sun, the iPad will overheat. A cool breeze, or a wet cloth draped over the back of the iPad cools thing off, but I wonder if these waterproof cases will exacerbate the situation. I have used the iPad in the dingy in moderate rain, and a zip-lock sandwich bag kept everything nice and dry. The touch screen, GPS, and all the buttons still worked OK.

I have the lifeproof nuud case for ipad2. I think it's great! It does not add much bulk to the ipad at all. I also purchased the lifeproof mount, to which I installed a RAM ball to the back side. It's very simple to move from the helm RAM to a RAM in my bunk.

I don't have any problems seeing the screen under my Bimini top, and with my polarized sunglasses as long as the ipad is kept horizontal. At vertical, my sunglasses make the screen completely black. At ipad horizontal, I think my polarized sunglasses actually make the screen brighter then with the naked eye. Not sure how that's possible, but that's what it feels like.

Lifeproof was a really great company, with a great warranty. After otter box acquired them, their customer service and warranty took

I have an iPad3 in the Lifeproof nuud case.

I cannot say enough good things about it. The texture is far superior to the iPads slick surface. When I place it down on a non-skid surface it stays there. It makes my iPad a bit larger, fitting in my hands better. I also purchased the LifeJacket float (for rough water use on deck) it fits over the nuud and will float the iPad if dropped overboard. (added drop protection as well). My original "float" was a bit loose. I contacted Lifeproof and they sent me a new one with return packing slip for the loose one. The new unit fit perfectly. They also offer a "Total Water Protection Program" (\$75 for one year) covers the iPad and a new case. Here's the info on that:

LifeProof Commitment

If, within one-year of purchasing your LifeProof case and registering with the Total Water Protection Program, your eligible device suffers water damage while in the case, LifeProof will repair or replace it.* The program is limited to a one-time use, and requires the case be used in accordance with all provided instructions. A simple request process and a nominal service fee (\$50 for iPhone, \$75 for iPad) is all it takes. And, we'll send you a new case, too.

Re : Ipad in cockpit.

Ben, I do have a bimini but it doesn't necessarily solve the problems. As a matter of fact I sent you some photos last year which showed my two pad locations using a SeaSucker mount. One location is on the pedestal guard and the other is on the bimini frame tucked up right under the cloth. In either location wind and driving rain or spray can wet the screen and of course in those conditions your hands are also wet.

The biggest problem I had in sunlight was reflections. I cured that with a matte screen protector. Also the brightness has to be set to high. That really drains the battery which means you need a waterproof power supply. I've tried putting the pad to sleep for short periods when on a long trip but then you lose other functions like AIS. I back up with Garmin plotter, computer, & charts.

I've used a Lifeproof frē on both my iPhone 4 and 5 and have been generally happy with them. Lifeproof proved its salt after protecting my phone from an overnight dip in a class III rapid in northern Idaho. Perhaps the even bigger miracle was that it was found the next day! I can tell from first hand experience that the plastic film over the screen on the frē decreases the sensativity of the touch screen measurably, as it doesn't lie perfectly flat on the glass. Recently I've had problems with the “end” button being completely unresponsive when I try to terminate a call. That can be a real annoyance. A quick search of the internet finds many other people having the same issue. Might be one of the reasons Lifeproof recently introduced the nüüd for the iPhone. Knowing what I know now, given the choice, I'd now go for the nüüd.

I have researched the Lifeproof case for a while and they seem to have a mix bag of results, some of the negative results are due to the regular opening and closing of the case and people not paying enough attention to the O-ring style seal..My intention is not to use the case under water so hope not to experience these issues and with all the camera work i do on the water I have a pretty thorough procedure when it comes to electronics and water proof cases.



I needed a case that will let my iPhone function as it is intended, protect from wet fingers, the occasional splash from wave, paddle or fish 😊 and the ability to float should I drop it...That's when the orange Lifeproof Lifejacket got my attention..the one I purchased is designed for the iPhone 5 however my iPhone 4 fits fine with the only function not ideal is the position of the camera (slightly covered by the lifejacket) ..but as I will always have a camera out with me I rarely use the iPhone for taken pics on the water...and as the friendly sales assistant pointed out, when I upgrade to the 5 I will already have the Lifejacket 😊

the lifejacket has openings to allow access to all the outer functions of the phone such as volume... it has a lanyard position on all 4 corners so you can easily attach one of the 2 lanyards supplied, neck strap and wrist strap. It is made of durable, high vis foam that even my kids will find hard to destroy (don't let the dog get it though!)..



◀ *Ideal phone protection for PWC users*

LifeProof has done a pretty good job of becoming the go-to case for the active **smartphone** user. In the personal watercraft/boating community, you literally seem to see them almost everywhere, protecting owner's phones from impact, water, shock...the list of potential calamities is endless. And in the process, they don't turn your phone into some big bulky brick. One of LifeProof's best features is that they offer all this protection while keeping things relatively slim.

If LifeProof cases have a flaw, however, it's that they don't float. Drop your phone and it still sinks like a rock. Even if the case is waterproof to 6.6 feet for an hour, that fact won't do you much good if you can't find the exact spot it went in the drink...or for that matter, drop it in water deeper than 7 feet.



LifeProof smart phone cases are waterproof, but they don't float. That could be a problem if you drop your phone into the water on a PWC ride.

Enter an accessory aimed right at personal watercraft users – the **LifeProof LifeJacket**. Correction: enter an accessory aimed right at PWC owners whose brand of smartphone is from Apple. Currently, the LifeJacket is only available for iPhones 5 and 6 (as well as iPad and iPad Mini).

If the name LifeJacket sounds like one of those bright orange, Mae West-style PFDs from yesteryear, you're not far off. The Lifejacket is indeed bright orange...and somewhat bulky. Made of durable, lightweight EVA foam, it wraps around your phone like a slip-on case on steroids, delivering up enough buoyancy to keep it afloat. There's nothing high-tech. The LifeJacket simply slips over a LifeProof case'd iPhone, holding it snugly in place. In addition to the added buoyancy, the phone also gets greatly expanded drop protection. Each corner is bulked up and the foam itself is quite dense. Drop it on the dock or launch ramp and you're chances of phone survival just increased dramatically.



Though it adds quite a bit of bulk to your iPhone, the LifeProof LifeJacket will make sure you can find it if it lands in the water.

You can still access all the phone's features. The screen area is left wide open, as are the speaker and headphone ports, along with the volume switch, on/off switch, and camera lens areas. There's also a recessed bar at each corner around which to wrap one of two included lanyards; choose a wrist or neck lanyard style depending upon how you plan to use the phone.

Trust me, it works. With more than a little hesitation, I tossed my LifeJacket/LifeProof-equipped **iPhone** into the Gulf of Mexico and watched it rather quickly bob to the surface. The bright orange LifeJacket made it exceptionally easy to spot, a bonus considering many people may drop their phone while underway and will be retracing their path. The bulky case also proved relatively easy to hold, offering a secure grip with wet hands. To my surprise, I discovered the case even had a certain coolness factor. Stopping at a marina, numerous people who worked around the water asked me where I got it, and seemed to genuinely lust after the bright orange bulk.

Drawbacks? Mainly they center around that very same 8" x 4.6" x 1.6" bulk. With the case on, you can't realistically put the phone in your pocket, although I did note it fits very nicely within a PWC glove compartment. In the latter scenario, it also simultaneously pads the phone from bouncing around in the compartment in rough water. The larger sides also proved to be a little more cumbersome when texting, but nothing you can't work around. Finally, LifeProof cases protect the headphone jack with a screw-in plug; should you really need to access the jack while in the LifeJacket, you do have to remove the phone from the LifeJacket first, unscrew the plug, then slide it back in. I wouldn't risk using headphones while underway, so I don't see it as a problem.

And the obvious that's probably already abundantly clear – you do need to own a **LifeProof** case already.

All in all, however, those are pretty minor disadvantages when you consider the alternative is your very pricey smartphone sinking off into the depths, smashing on the launch ramp, or simply dropping in dark water where you can't locate it. As the saying goes, an ounce of protection...



By lifeJacket, I don't mean a Personal Floatation Device or PFD that fits on a person to keep them afloat. No, I mean a LifeProof LifeJacket that has enough positive buoyancy to make sure it floats when dropped into the pool or lake.

The LifeProof LifeJacket was specially designed to enclose and protect your phone from shock and scratches. It comes with a quick release lanyard and wrist strap that can be connected in several ways including sideways, upside down or facing out or inward. By facing it inwards, the user can protect the iPhone screen from scratching their screen.

LifeProof LifeJackets are specially designed to let the user touch all of the control buttons of their iPhone including the camera and flash, headphone jack, microphone, speakers, and volume and on-off switch.
